

HOSPITALS ARE INSPECTED

—O—
 Since the beginning of the licensing program 17 months ago, over 690 Texas hospitals have been inspected under the Texas Hospital Licensing Law, either by state or local health department officials.
 Local fire marshalls have also inspected the same hospitals, making certain that they complied with fire safety rules required under the law. The program is administered by the State Health Department Hospital Licensing Division, established Jan. 1, 1960. More than half of Texas hospitals have been surveyed more than once and all have been closely inspected at least once.
 Inspection subjects range from the kind of ice used to the all important operating equipment. Especially important in all items inspected is the quality of housekeeping—a critical item for the prevention of disease spread within a modern hospital.

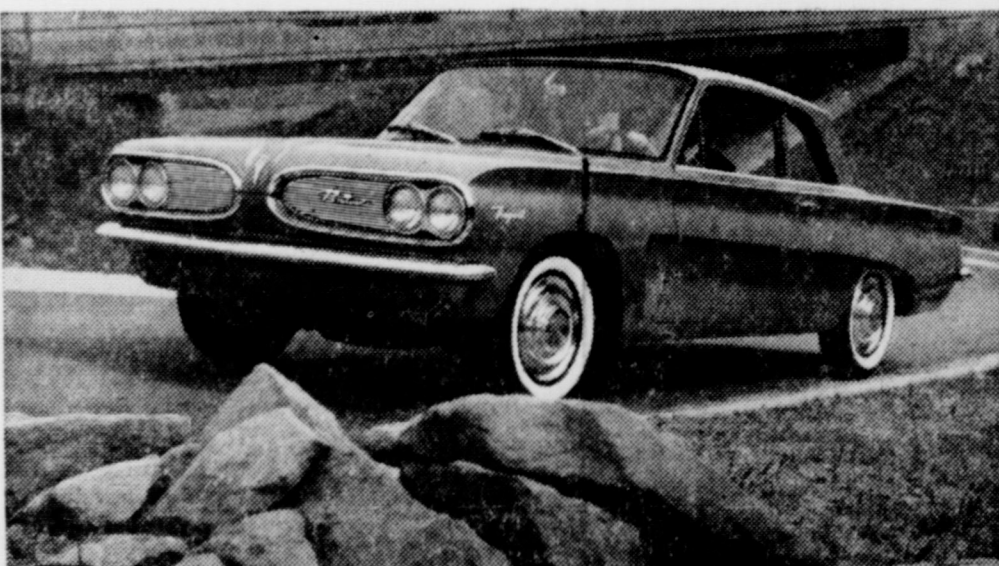

Man Memorialized 200 Years Ago

EDINBURGH — Stewart clanmen met recently at the site near Ballaehulish, Argyll, where James Stewart was hanged 200 years ago for taking part in the murder of Colin Campbell to protest the innocence of Stewart and to commemorate the bravery with which he met the hangman. An oration was made and the Very Rev. Duncan McInnes, dean of Argyll, held a memorial service.

The Stewarts say that James Stewart was a victim of the most outrageous frameup in history. The murder remains the most celebrated crime case in Scotland.

Stewart was tried by a jury consisting of eleven Campbells and four others and the presiding judge was the chief of the Campbell clan, the Duke of Argyll.

Robert Louis Stevenson immortalized the murder in "Kidnapped."

Noah's Ark Still Is Lost on Mt. Ararat

ISTANBUL — Not even a pair of animal tracks was found by a French expedition which battled its way to the top of Mt. Ararat looking for traces of Noah's Ark.

The expedition, led by Jean de Riener, polar explorer, hoisted the French flag atop the rugged peak after climbing through snow, rain and heavy winds.

An American expedition led by Dr. Aaron Smith, a retired missionary from Greensboro, N. C., tried fruitlessly to find Noah's fabulous boat in 1949.

Turkey's big Soviet neighbor charged that neither group really was looking for the Ark but just wanted to peer down at Russian defenses on the other side of the mountain.

Tennessee Bear Ruins Revenuers' Evidence

NASHVILLE — In the Tennessee hills there lives a bear which seems to know bad whisky when he tastes it. While Alcohol Tax Unit agents were waiting to trap the owner of a still they had just found, the bear lumbered out of the forest and decided to sample the product. He rolled it around his tongue and then smashed the still to pieces.

Most Drinking Starts Before College Days

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — Four out of every five college men who drink began their drinking before entering college, a researcher at Yale University's laboratory of applied physiology reported recently.

Robert Straus, research associate, disclosed for the first time preliminary results of a five-year study into the drinking habits of American college youth. This study was made by Mr. Straus and Selden D. Bacon, director of Yale's center of alcohol studies.

Of the American women students who drink, 65 per cent also started drinking before entering college, Mr. Straus said.

"The probability that a young person will drink at all," he continued, "is closely related to the practices of his or her parents."

"Of the men whose parents both drink, 90 per cent are themselves users. However, only half of the men (51 per cent) whose parents both abstain, drink."

"Where both parents are users, 83 per cent of the women drink on occasion. However, when both parents abstain, only 19 per cent of the women students drink."

He declared that parental advice on abstinence seems to be much stronger than advice from either church leaders or teachers.

Family income is a large factor "closely associated with the probability that one will use alcohol. Among those whose family income is under \$2,500, two thirds of the men and only 30 per cent of the women students drink."

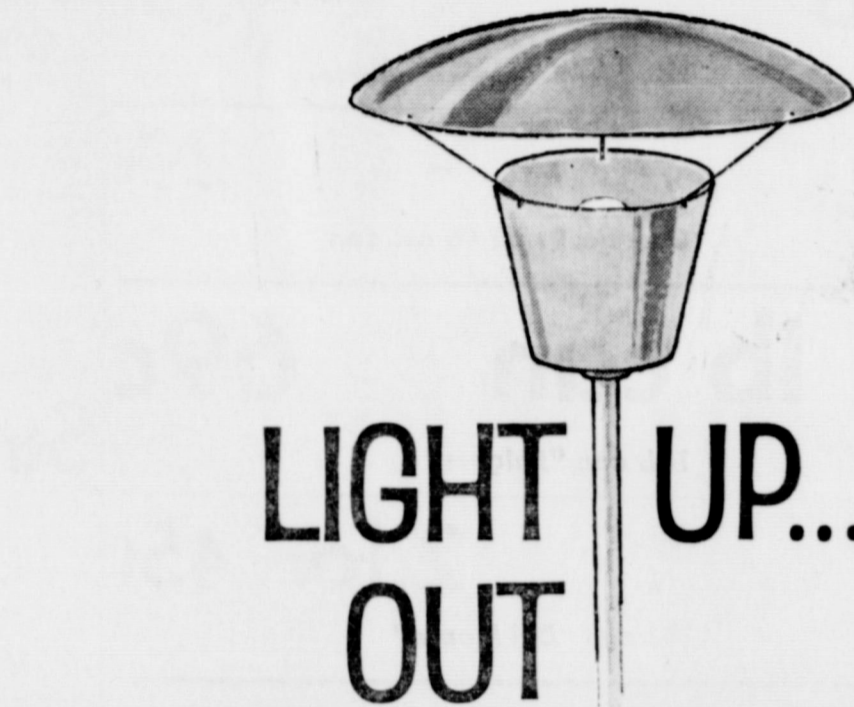
