Mrs. D. J. Bolch left Tuesday for Christoval, where she will spend two days or two weeks.

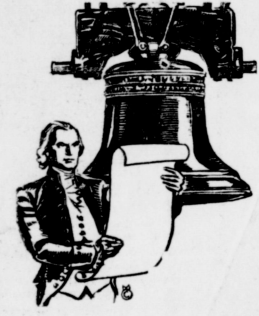
