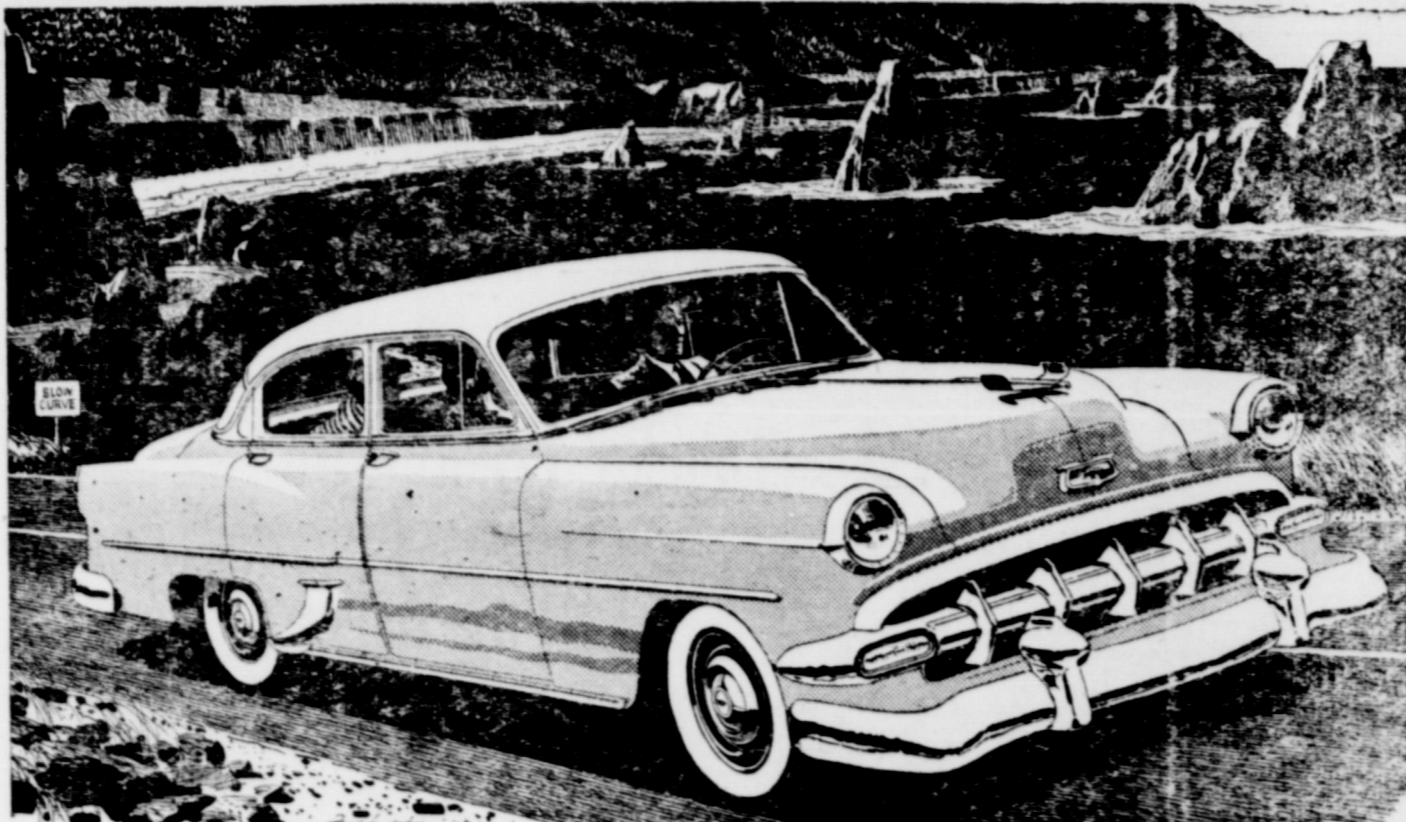

**Sun Tan Is Of**  
**Uncertain Value**  
 The therapeutic value of a sun  
 tan probably isn't worth the trouble  
 and risk it takes to get one.  
 That's the word from the State  
 Health Department. They say a tan  
 is nothing more than a manifesta-  
 tion of a skin injury.  
 But these same health officials  
 are first to admit that a sensible  
 bask in the sun makes a fine mental  
 pick-me-up. Overdoing it the first  
 week of sunshiny weather is the  
 thing that leads to trouble.  
 Sunshine in large doses can kill  
 you. More than one "sunshine  
 sucker" had succumbed to a hot sun  
 when he wasn't accustomed to it.  
 Even at best, over-exposure can  
 mean two or three miserable days  
 and sleepless nights when a mere  
 shirt is torture.  
 Some people are physically un-  
 able to tan. Known medically as  
 "heliophobes," they could spend  
 the entire summer in the sun and  
 all they'd get would be blisters on  
 the blisters. The reason is that their  
 skin lacks the pigment necessary to  
 produce the tan tint, and each new  
 exposure means a new burn.  
 But if you simply have to have  
 that golden sheen this summer, you  
 can avoid disastrous complications  
 by following these recommenda-  
 tions from Dr. Henry A. Holte, the  
 state health officer.  
 Assuming you're a type who can  
 tan - a "heliophile," that is - do  
 it by repeated exposure of, say, 5  
 minutes for the first two days.  
 Then increase exposure time to 15  
 minutes for a couple more days, and  
 then 30 or 45 minutes until you're  
 well done.  
 After that, you'll probably be  
 safe as far as burning is concerned.  
 But there is still the danger of sun  
 stroke or heat prostration.  
 Sunshine is a source of vitamin  
 D, as most people know. What they  
 apparently do not know is that ordi-  
 narily healthy people can get all  
 the vitamins required simply by  
 normal living.  
 Ever wondered about the source  
 of freckles which sometimes spread  
 so becomingly across an upturned  
 female nose? Here's the answer:

The color of everyone's skin is  
 determined by the amount of pig-  
 ment which is formed by the body  
 as a defense against sun rays. Dark-  
 complexioned people have consid-  
 erably more of it. Sometimes, espe-  
 cially in children, pigment is unevenly  
 manufactured and collects in spots.  
 These spots are freckles.

**Health Projects Needed**

What the average community needs is a well organized health department to protect the health of the people, says Dr. Henry A. Holle State Health Officer. Such a department will emphasize at least five types of activities to safeguard child health.

"These activities are: (1) the safeguarding of child health and motherhood; (2) the control of of births and deaths; (4) support of public health laboratories; and (5) sanitary control of diseases spread from human waste and by vermin and insects."

"The full time local health unit gives due emphasis to each of the above mentioned activities. To illustrate how these 5 essential functions are interrelated, the interest divisions in the new born baby, preschool and school child may be cited as an example. Child health is safeguarded by providing information and instruction to the mother. Through the use of vital statistics, complete and accurate birth registration is kept, as well as records indicating deaths which occur among children from preventable diseases.

"Contagion is prevented or controlled against further spread through the encouragement of immunization early in life, through the prompt of infectious disease. Public health laboratories and sanitary engineers provide additional bulwarks of protection for child life.
