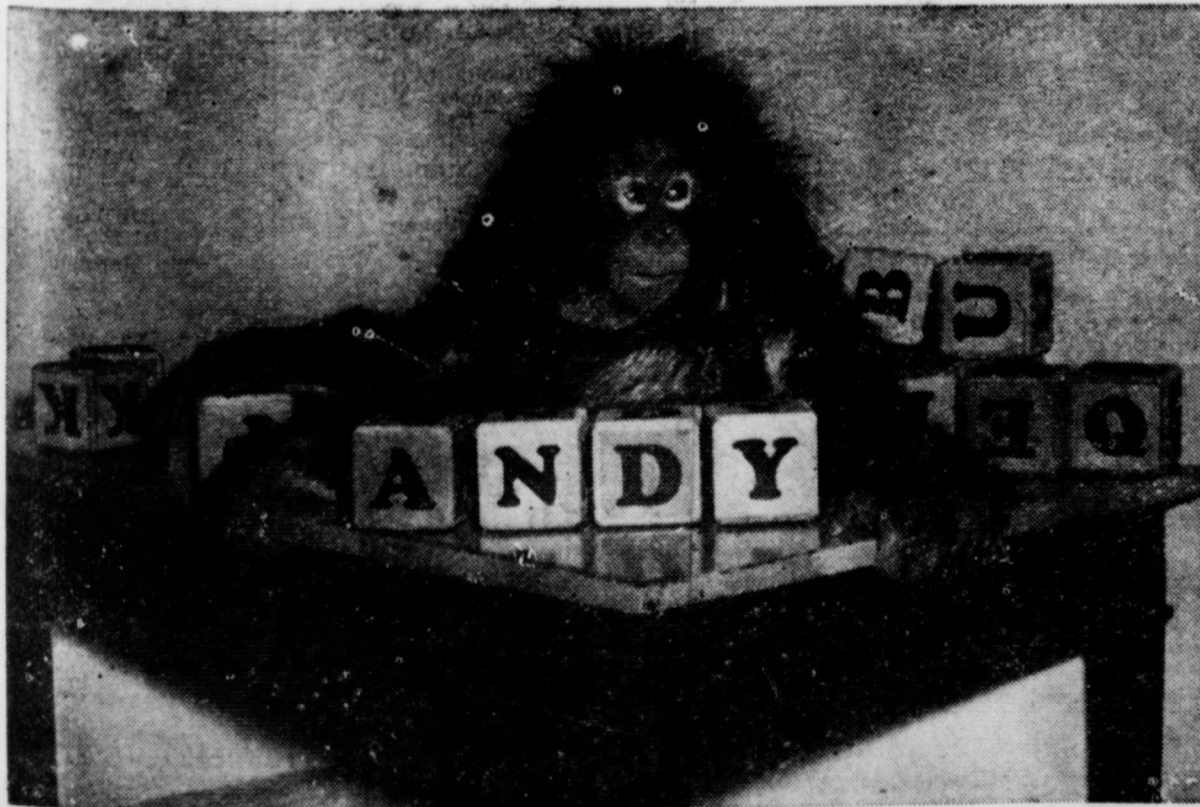

Frost Windows, Add Color To Give Bathroom Decoration

"MY HOUSE is nicely furnished, but I have no idea what I can do to the bathroom to make it a decorative asset," wails a homemaker who is seriously concerned with keeping an attractive home. Bathrooms are neglected decoratively in many homes for the same reason as this woman gave. People simply don't know the possibilities for making them as attractive to look at as a bedroom, kitchen or living room.

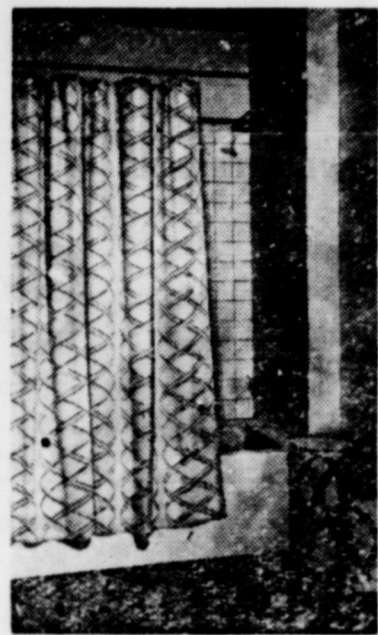
While time and thought has been spent on other rooms, the baths have been ignored except to see that they had towels, soap and running water. After a time, they become an eyesore because the rest of the house has been furnished tastefully. What can be done?

First of all, consider the bathroom as a possible decorative unit. If it adjoins a bedroom, possibly it can be carried out with a color scheme modified after the bedroom. If it's downstairs, you may want to use some of the colors in the other rooms so it's part and parcel of the home.

It's wise, also, to consider what you have in the way of towels and wash cloths. If your taste runs the gamut of colors, it's best to keep the bathroom white so that you may use any set of towels in it that you happen to have.

If your towel colors run to rose, green, yellow and blue as well as white, the best choice would be

The matching tote hamper and wastebasket are made to go with the curtain and drape set. They are sturdily constructed to withstand wear and are both alcohol-proof and flame-proof.

The advantage to having a dry clean cloth is that it leaves the tile in a nice glossy condition, much nicer than if you had gone over the walls with a scrub brush and soap.

To do the best cleaning on the bathroom, remove everything movable before cleaning. This will give you more room in which to do the best work. Wash the shower curtains as well as the regular curtains weekly as you do the cleaning. Select Furnishings Tastefully

Since the bath is usually a small room, it's wise to furnish it carefully so there is little clutter in it. All the colors should harmonize well to give a unity of impression.

Get everything that is not a part of the furniture, out of the way completely so there is an absence of clutter. You can put creams, jars and bottles in a cabinet or arrange them attractively on the new glass shelves that are becoming so popular.

Shower curtains and drapes look best when they are matched. In fact, now there are even hampers made to match the shower and curtain sets. Chip-resistant lacquer is used on the background of the hamper and the hand-painted designs are sealed with a coat of plastic paint. This makes it easy to wipe smudges with a damp cloth.

Hampers and wastebaskets will stand up under wear best if they have heavy steel bases. Since they are moved around a lot, they must be durable.

The more expensive shower and curtain sets are really economical in the long run. The best ones are made of natural rubber and have a dull finish that looks beautiful and wears well.

Other sets in plastic materials, such as opaque vinyl film, are very attractive and come in an attractive array of designs and colors.

Be sure to choose shower curtains long enough so there will be little water escaping when they're in use. The standard sizes of six by six feet are sufficient for most bathrooms.

Good Decorating Hints Given

For those of you who want to "frost" bathroom windows, there are two easy ways. One method is to mix some epsom salts with a little varnish and apply to the glass. Another way is to cover the glass with a sheet of tissue paper and apply spar varnish which has been thinned with 1/4 turpentine. This mixture will make the paper adhere to the window.

If fixtures have become dull and rusted-looking, rub them thoroughly with steel wool and then apply a metal polish to them and rub until they shine. Keep soft paper around to wipe the fixtures dry to prevent them from rusting.

Peacock blue with white is a good color combination to use for a bathroom if you're in a warm climate. It's cool looking, and you may use white, blue, yellow or rose or maroon towels and accessories with this combination.

A yellow bathroom is very cheerful and warm for cooler climates. With this you may use blue, green, black or black and white towels, etc.

If you want to use a combination of colors in the bathroom, have the background gray. Gray tile with touches of white at the borders is very effective. With this you may use a combination of flamingo, yellow, dark green and dark gray.

A large bathroom is best held together with a large, shaggy rug in the same color that predominates the bathroom.



Let windows sparkle . . . green as any of these colors can be combined with it.

Paint or Tile? You Decide.

A bathroom which uses enamel paint on its walls is easy to clean as well as to repaint. It can be washed often, in fact as often as necessary without harming a good quality paint. The wall color can be changed frequently.

If you have a tile bathroom, it will look more luxurious and modern, but you'll have to stick to the original color once it's there. If, of course, you have white tile, then you may use a wide range of colors in it.

If you are modernizing your home, you may want to have some simulated tile put on the lower half



White curtains add color. of the walls, or perhaps even the whole wall. This works out well and gives a nice effect.

Tile is easy to keep clean. The best way to keep it sparkling is to run the shower or hot water until the room is full of steam. Then go over the walls with a dry cloth. As soon as the cloth becomes soiled, take a clean one or rinse out the one which you are using.

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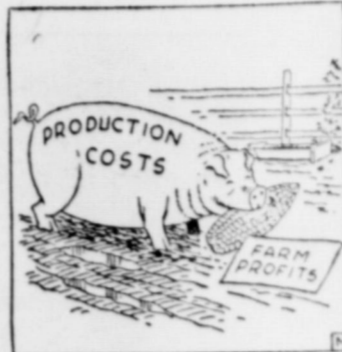
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Improvement of Land Cuts Production Cost Margin Between Return, Expenses Is Narrowing

Higher production costs now biting deeper into farm profits emphasize the need for farmers to get their land in shape to produce more bushels at lower unit costs per acre, the Middle West Soil Improvement Committee points out. The margin between what a farmer gets for his crops and what it costs him to produce them is narrowing steadily. Commodities



used in farm production have more than doubled in price since 1939. Prices of grain and field crops have declined steadily since early 1948.

The committee declared that "greater crop producing efficiency is the answer to lower farm prices and higher production costs."

Crop production can be increased by "put back" soil management methods and "holding" operations. "Put back" methods include rebuilding the soil's organic matter supply by growing deep-rooted legumes in rotation. They include replacing phosphate and potash drained off by constant row cropping. They also include putting all barnyard manure back on the soil and plowing under corn stalks, straw and other left-overs.

"Holding" operations can include contouring, grass waterways and terracing where necessary.

Wire Recorder Check

When a pure-bred white leghorn climbs into a nest on the Heisdorf and Nelson breeding farm at Kirkland, Wash., it is, in its own way, making poultry history.

Unknown to the approximately 10,000 fowls on the farm, the most modern wire recorders candidly keep track of their every deed. As far as the four partners in the business know, it is the first time so many chickens have become subjects of a wire recorder.

Use of the recorder has resulted in huge savings of time and money, and records have never been so

accurate, according to Art Heisdorf, who with his wife, Mary, and the Nelson brothers, Bert and Clifford, operate the farm.

It was Art's brainchild to use the recorder in "running traps"—checking up on the hens to find out which ones are laying and which ones are "lying."

It's done this way: Four days a week the trap is set. When the hen crawls in a nest a trap door closes behind her. She can't get out until one of the partners lets her out. Each hen then is given a number which is on a metal tab placed around her leg. When anyone "runs the traps," he wears a small microphone, presses the small mike button and states the number of the bird's tag, and then gives the number of eggs laid and any other pertinent information about the bird.

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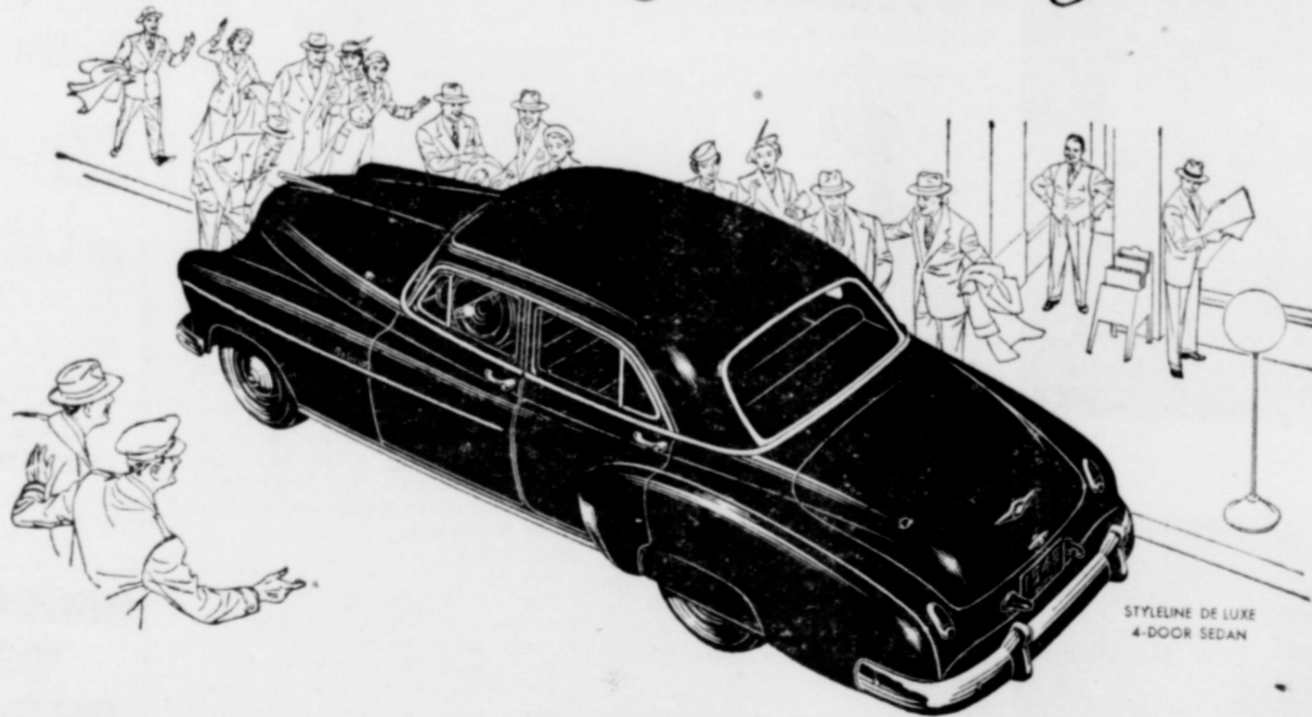

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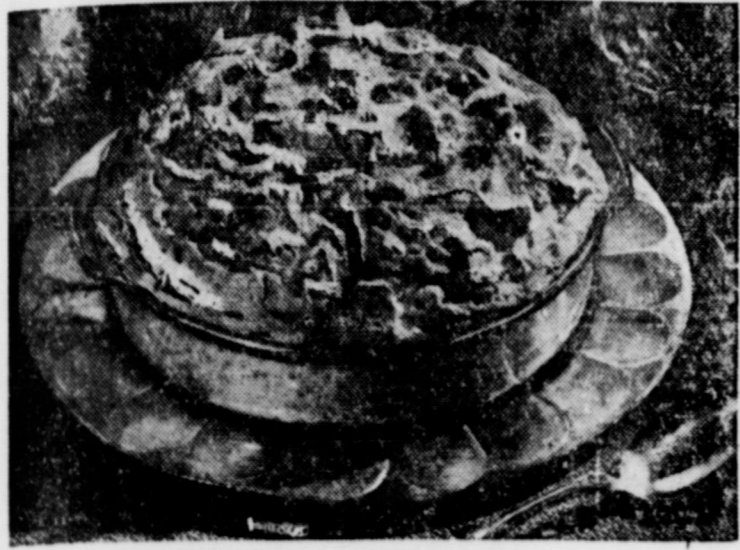

Oven Magic

THERE IS NOTHING more warming to cold spirits than to come from the chilly out-of-doors into a kitchen fragrant with the baking of fruit desserts. These, served warm with cream, make a very special finish to the ending of a meal.

Homemakers will appreciate being able to use the oven for more than just the main dish and vegetables. When you bake your dessert along with the meal, you save time and last-minute preparation.

THIS SPECIAL rice pudding has much to offer since it's combined with tasty apples and a delicate butterscotch meringue as topping.

Apple Rice Pudding (Serves 6-8)

- 1 cup uncooked white rice
- 6 medium apples, thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3 cups milk
- 2 egg yolks
- 2 egg whites, beaten
- 4 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Wash rice and cook in saucepan with 1 quart boiling water and 1 teaspoon salt for 10 minutes; drain. Place half the apple slices in a buttered 2-quart casserole. Blend together salt, sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle 1/2 of the mixture over apples; add 1/2 of the rice and the remainder of the apples and sprinkle with second 1/2 of sugar mixture. Top with remaining rice and sugar mixture. Pour in milk which has been blended with beaten egg yolks. Cover and bake in a slow oven (300°) for about 2 hours, stirring occasionally, adding extra milk as needed. Uncover and cook 30 minutes longer to brown. To make meringue pudding: beat egg whites until they peak; add brown sugar, a tablespoon at a time, beating between each addition and continue beating until very stiff. Fold in vanilla. Spread on pudding and return to oven for 20 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool. Serve with a jug of cream.

LIKE THE ABOVE pudding, this next one uses apples, too, and has a buttery brown sugar topping with a hint of spice:

Raisin Apple Pudding (Serves 10)

Batter:

- 3/4 cup seeded raisins
- 2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 5 tablespoons shortening
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups thinly sliced cooking apples

Topping:

- 1/2 cup melted butter or substitute
- 3/4 cup brown sugar (packed)
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg

To make batter part, rinse raisins and chop. Sift together, flour, salt, baking powder and sugar. Work in shortening. Add milk and eggs, beaten together, and mix well. Stir in raisins and apples. Pour into a

well-greased baking pan (about 10 1/2 x 7 1/2 inches). To make topping, blend all ingredients together and spread mixture evenly on batter. Bake in a moderately hot (375°) oven 35 to 40 minutes. Serve warm with plain or whipped cream.

PLAN TO SERVE your family prunes frequently as they are economical, delicious and nutritious. A good source of iron which builds red blood, as well as an excellent supply for thiamin, vitamin A and riboflavin which help safeguard health, prunes should find a welcome place in menus.

Prune Bread Pudding (Serves 6)

- 4 slices bread, buttered if desired
 - 1 cup sliced, stewed prunes
 - 2 eggs
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 1/2 cup (1 can) evaporated milk
 - 1 cup boiling water
 - 3/4 teaspoon salt
 - Dash of nutmeg or allspice
- Lay bread in a shallow baking dish. Cover with prunes. Beat eggs until foamy. Add 1/4 cup of the sugar, milk, water and spice. Pour custard over prunes. It should be rather foamy to brown nicely. Bake in a slow (325°) oven until set, about 1 hour. Remove from oven. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup sugar and set in a hot oven or under broiler just long enough to brown. Serve warm or cold.

Peach Pie Crust (Serves 6-8)

- Crumb Shell:**
- 1 cup finely-rolled corn flake crumbs
 - 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
 - 1/4 cup melted butter or substitute.
- Filling:**
- 1 tablespoon plain gelatin
 - 1/4 cup cold water
 - 1 1/4 cups sliced canned cling peaches.
 - 1/2 cup syrup from peaches
 - 1/2 cup granulated sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1/4 cup lemon juice
 - 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
 - 1 cup cottage cheese
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt

Crumb Shell: Blend corn flake crumbs and sugar. Add melted butter and mix well. Pack firmly into bottom and sides of 8-inch pie pan. Chill thoroughly.

Filling: Soften gelatin in cold water. Heat peaches, syrup and 1/4 cup sugar. Beat egg yolks slightly and add gradually to heated mixture without stirring. Continue to cook and stir until slightly thickened. Dissolve softened gelatin in hot peach mixture. Blend in lemon juice and rind. Cool. Force cottage cheese through sieve and add to peach-gelatin mixture. Beat egg whites until foamy, add salt and beat stiff. Gradually add remaining 1/4 cup sugar, beating after each addition. Fold into crumb shell and chill 3 to 4 hours before serving.

Chicken salad looks elegant when garnished with apricots rolled in toasted coconut, topped with whipped cream and a cherry.

Raw cauliflowerets tossed with shredded raw carrots, blanched almonds and lettuce hearts in mayonnaise are crisp and delicious.

Garnish individual salmon salads with notched cucumber slices, marinated green beans, tomato wedges.

Luncheon meat rolled with a filling of finely shredded carrot mixed with mayonnaise may be used with any vegetable salad.

Eleven Immortals

Lesson for February 20, 1949

JESUS BELIEVED in prayer, but he did not usually spend all night at it. When he did, we may be sure he had something of the greatest importance on his mind. One of these occasions was the night before he selected the twelve men he called Apostles. He had thousands of disciples, crowds followed him wherever he went. But it was important to have a few with whom he could live as an intimate friend. So from the immense number of followers, Jesus selected twelve closest friends. Before that fateful morning no one outside their villages had ever heard of them. But now their names are known—and eleven of them are honored—around the world.

Jesus Multiplies Himself

A GOOD executive, Jesus multiplied his own personality. A recent book has shown how Harry Hopkins during World War II lived in the White House as Roosevelt's personal companion, having given up his own ambitions and living only to carry out the ideas of his chief. Without Roosevelt, Hopkins would have been little more than an inferior politician; and without Hopkins, many of Roosevelt's plans could not have been carried out. He enabled the president to be in two places at once. So it was with Jesus, as Mark tells us. Jesus wanted those twelve to be with him, and then to send them out.

He wanted these friends to know him as the crowds, and his enemies, never could know him. He wanted these men to absorb his ideas and ideals.

By continual contact, day by day and month by month, they would inevitably become more like him. Because of that, he could (and later did) send them out to do his work in places he could not reach. The word Jesus used for them was not his own invention; "apostle" was the word used all over the civilized world in those days for an ambassador, a personal representative of royalty. All Christians are in the "apostolic succession." If a Christian can truly say, "I live, yet not I, but Christ liveth in me," then he is, as these men were, Christ's personal representative.

Raw Material
THE Astonishing thing about Jesus' choice of these twelve is his faith in them. Of course they had faith in him—who would not? But who would have faith in them? There was not a single "outstanding" man in the lot. Not one had what we would call a college education, not a man of them had held public office or was rich or famous for anything at all. The officers of any modern church might shake their heads over them.

There was Peter, an ordinary fisherman, much given to profanity; there was Matthew, a crooked business man if ever there was one, for no publican could be honest and keep from starving; there was Philip, as stupid a man as ever asked a foolish question; there were James and John, loud-mouthed (Jesus nicknamed them the Thunder Boys—"Sons of Thunder"), greedy fellows who could not be satisfied till they had elbowed their way ahead of everybody else; there was Thomas the born pessimist, the defeatist... What could have got into Jesus' mind to select such men?

—And Judas Iscariot
THE SECRET of Jesus' choice was this: He selected his men not for what they were or had been, but for what they could become, filled with his spirit, transformed by his friendship. It is so today, as always. The Kingdom of God needs men and women, but the raw human material found in or out of the churches is too shabby and weak to build anything like the kingdom of God. "Twelve Immortals"—? Nay, but one is the immortal betrayer and suicide. Why? The reason was in Judas, not in Jesus.

The truth is that Christ will not force himself on any one, not even on an Apostle. Christ needs men, now, as he needed men then, to carry on his work in this world.

But he wants volunteers, never forced labor. The Christ of Glory can be served by the humble; but the free Christ can be served only by free men with open hearts. Judas may keep his heart shut if he will; Christ never forces his way in.

FIRST AID to the AILING HOUSE

by Roger C. Whitman

QUESTION: "When we moved into our apartment, we purchased from the previous tenant the inlaid linoleum on the kitchen floor. The quality is excellent, but the color is a dirty gray-green in a marbled pattern. Is there any product which will stain or dye the linoleum (not paint) so that we can get a deep blue tone and still retain the marbled effect?"

ANSWER: I do not know of any stain or dye for that purpose. But you may be able to get the effect that you want by stippling in two colors, or else by applying a "spatter-dash" finish. For the stippling, first cut a large sponge in half. Apply an oil floor paint of the background color that you wish on the floor. When this has dried, paint a section of clean board with a second color that you will use for stippling, press the flat, cut side of the sponge on this fresh paint, and then press this on the linoleum. The pattern of the cut sponge thus will be transferred to the floor.

For a spatter-dash effect, use a stick and a brush with a rather long bristle. Dip the brush into the paint and wipe off the excess. Strike the brush ferrule against the stick so that the paint will come off in drops on the floor. (The floor should already be painted with the background color.) Try these methods first on pieces of boards to get the knack. See that the linoleum is absolutely clean and dry before you start to paint, no grease or wax.
