Dr. B. R. King is dead. Only few days ago be was quick, rreeting his friends in his cus tomary cheerful manner at his place of business. He was taken ill with flu about a wept ago and at the time it was not though his illness was of a serious char cter, but later complications se up which resulted in his death When his condition became serious, a telegrain was sent Mrs. King who came before the end but he was unconscious and nev er realized she was with him Death relieved his suffering at noon Tuesday. The body was embalmed and prepared for buri al by Lamesa and Tahoka under takers and was sent to Fort Worth where it will be interred Deceased leaves a wife and five hildren to mourn his passing, only the wife being present when the end came.
While maintaining the family home in Fort Worth, Dr. King had been engaged in the practice of dentistry in O'Dunnell for the past year, although he had re sided in Tahoka for a number of years and was largely intereeted in farms in Lynn and Dawson counties, having altogether sbout 2,200 acres in cultivation.
Dr. King was highly regarded
or his sobriety, honesty and ntegrity and was always ready to lend a helping hand to his fel ow man. During his residence in O'Donnell he had shown a patriotic spirit in the upbuilding of the town and was always ready to do his share and more for its good.
The familiar face of Dr. King will be greatly missed in O'Donnell by all., May he rest in pence.

When the Santa Fe built its ine into O' Donnell about thirteen years ago it commenced opera tions by giving the pubiic a combination freight and passenger train each way a day, except on Sundays when the crew rested For news connections with the outside world, and to run the roau's business, a telephone line roan's business, a telephone line
was constructed along the branch.
At that time O'Donnell had a population of one family and no doubt it was highly gratified over such splendid connections with the outside world. The town struggled along in the quiet easy manner as was the custom of the average cow town of that day Once a week a puncher rode in got a fresh supply of the makings for a smoke, swapped yarns with Postmaster Doak, got the mail for the boys at the ranches out his way and went home
But one day some venturou ellow stuck a plow in the ground and planted some seed. While he was waiting for the seed to come up or dry up, he dug a hole in the around and, to his sur prise struck a vein of fine wa ter. The seed shot up some husky looking sprouts, but this fellow was doubtful as to the outcome of the sprouts and gave them very little attention. That fall when he returned from a visit to his wife's folks back east, he found a better crop maturing than any he had seen on his trip and from that the news spread that crops would grow in this country and that water could be fonnd anywhere by digging Others came and tested out the nue son-and the rush to secure homes here was on.
Today, C'Donnell is a thriving little city. Intead of the post
ottice serving an occasional puncher with mail, it now re quires the services of four postal employes to fandle it. Three rural routes dispense mail to the tarmers. Our bank does a business from $\$ 40,000$ to $\$ 50,000$ a day. The merchants serve thousands of people in this trade ter-
ritory. The town is rapidly building into a little city.
To keep pace with this great march of progress, what has the Santa Fe done? $\mathbf{O}$, it still blows its little whistle on its mixed freight and passenger train as it comes jollying in from
on time to hours late. The on time to hours late. The same telephone line serves in the
place of a telegraph. Try to place of a telegraph. tickst and it would take the accomodating agent so long to find one that you would miss your train, even if it was behind time. Mail a letter at 9 o'clock Saturday morning and at around $80^{\prime}$ clock Monday morning 47 hours later it would start on its journey.
Last year the Santa Fe un loaded hundreds of cars o out 7687 bales of cotton and cars and cars of feed. This year it will agsin bring in hundreds of cars of freight and take out near ly twice the amount of cotton and feed.
