

METHODS FOR OVERCOMING RADIOACTIVE IODINE HAZARD IS OUTLINED

College Station — Radioactive iodine 131 can be one of the most hazardous problems of food contamination during the first 60 days following a nuclear attack, but at the same time much can be done to overcome the hazard it presents, says A. M. Meekma, extension dairy specialist.

Iodine 131 fall out could contaminate almost all fresh foods, says Meekma, however because radioactivity in the material is so short lived, several courses would be open to remove or reduce the danger to humans. Dairymen, for example, could confine milk cows to the barn and feed them safely on forage and feed that had been stored for 60 days. Also ensilage that had been stored for this length of time could be safely fed to dairy cows.

Should iodine 131 get into fluid milk, there are also precautions

that will protect users of fresh milk, Meekma says. For example, milk containing relatively low amounts of radioactivity could simply be stored until the radioactivity decayed. This, the specialist points out, is possible because today's commercial pasteurized, homogenized milk will maintain good quality for long periods of time at usual refrigeration temperatures.

Should the iodine 131 level be high enough to require 30 to 40 days storage before the radioactivity is dissipated, acceptable means of holding milk for such periods would include freezing, holding for the required time, and then thawing and distributing to the consumers or processing it as dried milk, canned milk, cheese, or butter. In any case, there should be no disposal or destruction of milk contaminated with iodine 131, Meekma says.

**COLLEGE DEFERMENT IN
ARMED FORCES EXPLAINED**

San Angelo — "No changes in college and university student military service and deferment program, in occupational deferment program, or in the present order of call for induction are anticipated," according to information recently received by Dr. R. M. Cavness, president of San Angelo College.

Information was prepared by Dr. William Wilson, president of American Council on Education, Washington, D. C. and representatives of American Association of Junior Colleges and other educators, thru the services of the Office of Assistant Secretary of Defense.

It is being filed in Dr. Cavness' office and is available for anyone interested in or anticipating enrollment in college wishing to know his prospects of remaining in college.

The information sheet states that under the present prospective draft

the class standing and test scores on the Selective Service regulation for guidance purposes. Local boards are not required to defer solely on the basis of those criteria, however.

"Local boards may defer registrants occupationally if their activity in industry, research, medical, scientific or other endeavors is found necessary to the maintenance of the national health, safety or interest — university and college faculty members may be considered for occupational deferment. Occupational deferments are presently at or close to, a peace time high.

It is expected that calls for induction will continue to be filled by non-fathers between the ages of 19-26 with the oldest going first. With the very modest increase in draft calls, it is estimated that the average age of involuntary induction, which has been about 23, might fall by several months.

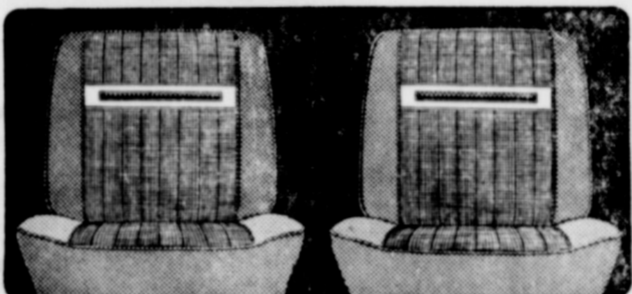

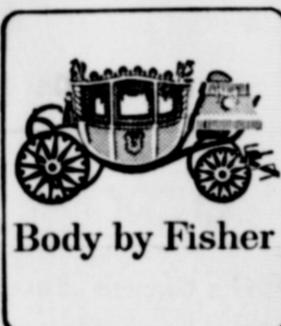

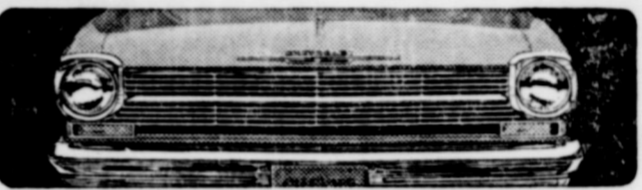

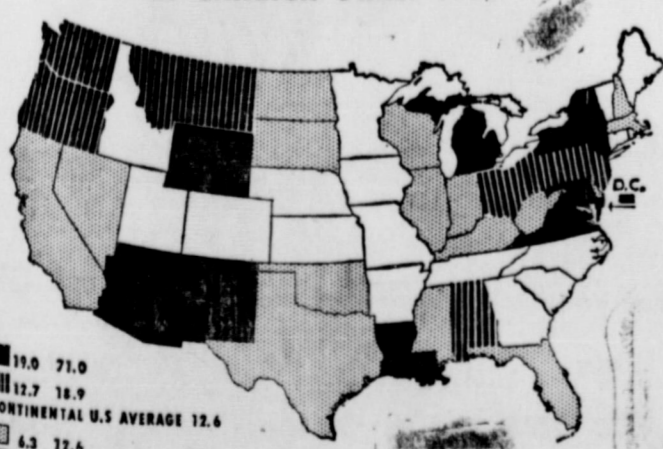
