## Michigan Counties Solve Wintertime Depression Worries

BELLAIRE, Mich.—When Labor Day comes, all the rich vacationists take off from this community of waters and woods like wild ducks, leaving the natives in a severe economic depression after a boom in guiding fishing parties, baby sitting, working in hotels and carpentering.

But the citizens are taking steps to alleviate the effects of this depression. Several years ago a committee, headed by Betty Parker, whose husband publishes the Antrim County News, began selling, by letters, Christmas greens in August.

Day and night, the men left jobless by the departure of the tourist trade hauled in big branches and the women made them into Christmas wreaths.

The venture has been repeated in other fields, and now there is a winter workshop in Bellaire. Five other Michigan counties hardest hit by the winter depressions are co-operating. Everything in the workshop is handmade.

A pine rocking horse was made by Durbon Death, Starvation Lake. Hardwood lawn furniture was fashioned by Mark Trail Osburn of Cedar. Mrs. Loren Lacey learned how to make aluminum and pewter trays with designs of maple leaves, pine cones and deer. Mrs. Harry Siebold crochets silky drawstring purses.

## Skilled Safecracker Skips Jail Again

ABERDEEN, Scotland — John Ramensky, 45, who became the first man to escape from Peterhead prison in 1934, made his second escape recently.

Guards found a dummy propped up by a pillow when they checked his bed. He was serving a life sentence for blowing open a post-office safe in Glasgow.

Considered one of the most skilled safecrackers in the country, Ramensky was recruited by the commandos in 1942 after he had finished a five year prison sentence. He became an instructor on the use of explosives and was dropped behind German lines several times in World War II to blow open safes containing secret documents. After the war he became a bookmaker, but went back to blowing safes.

## Television Forcing Politicians on Wagon

ST. LOUIS—If politicians all go on the water wagon, you can thank television for it, the president of the Women's Christian Temperance Union declares.

Mrs. D. Leigh Colvin of Evanston, Ill., says the Republican convention in Chicago in July appeared almost bone dry. "The Democratic convention," she adds, "was slightly wetter, but showed signs of drying up."

"Drinking," Mrs. Colvin says, "obviously was confined to hotel rooms. But even this was reported at a minimum, because as one Texas delegate remarked, 'I never knew when television would show me all over Dallas.'"

## Politeness Is Cash in Till For Vendor

ST. LOUIS—"Twenty-five dollars in cash if I fail to thank you."

That is the promise of Ted D. Gatlin, 47, news vendor here who believes it pays to be courteous. Whether it pays or not, it hasn't cost him anything. Despite practical jokes by his friends and customers to make him forget to say "thank you," Gatlin hasn't forgotten yet.

**Faked a Faint**  
One woman faked a faint to shock Gatlin out of his courtesy. Her head hit a fire hydrant. "Thank you kindly," said Ted, as an ambulance hauled her off to the hospital for five scalp stitches.

Gatlin learned courtesy was a business commodity when he was knee-high to streetcar conductors. His "thank you" once encouraged them to boost him aboard to sell his papers.

Gatlin began offering \$1.50 back in 1939 to any customer he didn't thank. Sales boomed and over the years he raised the offer.

Gatlin says people try almost anything to get the \$25. Some, under the impression the offer is sponsored by a firm or newspaper, propose don't say-thanks-to-me-and-we'll-split-it deals.

A coy young woman offered a telephone number, presumably hers. Gatlin said thanks but no thanks.

Once a young couple stopped their car and asked for a paper. They began a quarrel about who had the family bankroll. The husband shook his wife. Gatlin wasn't fooled.

Two passing policemen pulled the man away and started to the police station with him. It took a bit of explaining to convince them he was only trying to fool the newsboy.

## Cairo's Hello Is More Like Bona Fide

CAIRO, Near the heart of Cairo Egypt close to the Abdin Palace from which King Farouk has sent millions of words of blessing with a flourish through the nation's largest telephone exchange, newly installed Bab el-Luk.

"Good health be with you, my brother," and "To you good health and the blessings of Allah"—thus Muslims preface their telephone conversations.

The Bab el-Luk area might be called the Square of the Gate That Isn't There, for a small park has replaced the old gate, or "Bab." The park occupies a key position in the booming Egyptian capital.

**Near King Tut's Mask**  
The area also is well known for its railway station serving a short line to the fashionable suburb of Maadi. To the west there is considerable building activity where the old Kasr el-Nil barracks are giving way to modern buildings. Within sight is the Egyptian Museum which houses among other things the heavy gold funerary mask of King Tu-Ankh-Amen.

To the north are the hotels, movie palaces, banks, and office buildings of a modern city of more than two million people. Perhaps the sharpest contrast, ancient to modern, is observed when pretty Egyptian girls in shorts play basketball at the coeducational American University. They play on a court near the ancient Bab el-Luk, and within a stone's throw of the modern telephone exchange.

Cairo is filled with such contrasts. When it was a walled city, each "bar" or gate took its name from or lent its name to an area. One of these gates, the Bab ez-Zaweloh still stands and is a prime attraction for tourist photographers.

Many of the Faithful call it the Gate of the Mutawalli, holiest of those who "stand near God," and to its iron bars shreds of clothing are tied as votive offerings.

Sheppey was the island where British aviation pioneers designed their heavier-than-air machines and where the Short Brothers Aircraft company was founded in a wooden shed. Moore (Lord Brabazon) flew the animal in the first British plane to fly a circular mile, to prove that pigs could "fly."

"He bought it for 70 cents from my grandfather," said a local farmer, Harold Love, who is sponsoring the idea of the memorial. Many persons in the aeronautical world have promised to contribute toward the cost.

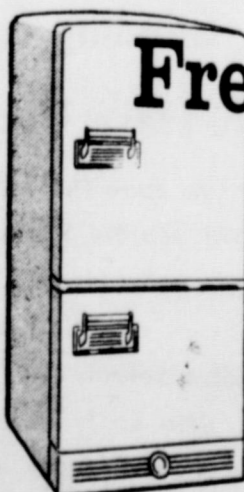

**Natural Resistance  
Needed Against Germs**

Bacteria are the most numerous forms of plant life and it is little wonder — under favorable conditions a single bacterium can become 536,000 in 15 short hours. Why is it then, constantly surrounded and assaulted by them as we are, that we do not fall victim of their attacks more often? Because six conditions must be present in any infection.

First, there must be a reservoir of germs, second, there must be a mode of transmission, third, there must be a susceptible host, fourth, there must be a mode of entry into the host, fifth, there must be favorable conditions for growth and sixth there must be a mode of exit. If any of these conditions is lacking, there is no disease.

Consider the human body as a fort surrounded by bacterial enemies. Always there is skirmishing with some of the commoner varieties, and sometimes they overwhelm by their numbers and strength, cut as long as the outer-wall remains intact, battlements manned with defenders, the fort is safe.

The sum total of human defensive forces is called resistance. "Immunity" to this or that specific disease is part of the defensive pattern. It varies in different persons and at different times in the same person. Some people are born with a natural immunity to certain diseases. Others get an acquired immunity thru shots or by recovering from an actual infection.

Natural resistance can be lost or weakened by a variety of bad habits. Malnutrition will weaken it, but so will overeating which taxes the liver and kidneys and clogs the blood with wastes. Worry is another friend of disease germs, and impure air, dissipation, lack of bodily cleanliness, want of proper exercise, continuous work unrelieved by open air recreation all will lessen natural resistance to disease.

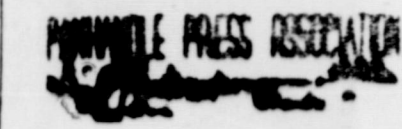

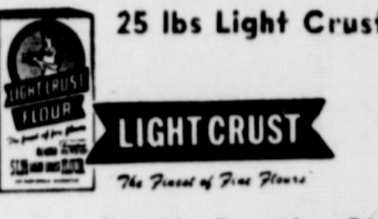
