## Rites Read For Mrs Ida Cook

Mrs. Ida Sarah Cook, age 68, died after a long illness Monday at 4:45 p. m. in the Seale Clinic at Tahoka. Funeral services were conducted at the First Baptist Church Wednesday at 2:30 p. m. by Rev. C. T. Aly, pastor. Burial followed in the Tahoka Cemetery.

Ida Sarah Roberson was born November 7, 1881 in Henderson county. She grew up in that county and on July 19, 1899, she was married to Edward Cook, who died at Tahoka, Sept. 12, 1941.

After living in Navarro county for some time, Mr and Mrs Cook and children came to Lynn County in 1924 and for many years lived in the Wells community, near O'Donnell.

Mrs. Cook was a kind and loving mother and highly respected by all who knew her. For several years she had been in bad health and for the past several weeks had been in a critical condition.

Her children had been at her bedside most of the time after her condition became critical and through a great shock to them her passing was not unexpected.

She is survived by five sons, R. F. of Idalou, Y. E. of Meadway, E. A. of Tahoka, H. L. of Melbourne, Ark., and W. H. of O'Donnell; two daughters, Mrs. H. A. Dial of Meadway and Mrs. T. ### Infection, Neurosis Cause Tiredness

By Dr. James W. Barton

**E**ARLY ONE MORNING a neighbor came to my summer cottage and asked me to go fishing. I asked him why he had come for me instead of his regular fishing companion. He complained that his former fishing companion wanted to sleep all day and didn't want to get up in the morning.

A few weeks later his fishing companion died of heart disease caused by several infected teeth. Tiredness and sleepiness is perhaps the commonest sign of infection somewhere in the body.

If a normal individual who has never complained of tiredness and sleepiness begins to feel tired and sleepy during the day, an immediate search for infection should be made by physician and dentists before damage to the heart and other organs occurs.

What about the individual who is tired all the time, in fact has always been tired? In "Clinical Medicine" the question is asked as to the reason for tiredness in one who has always been tired, yet in whom careful examination reveals no cause of tiredness.

The answer which follows states that the most important diagnostic method in the case of the tired patient is the asking of three questions: "Have you been more or less tired all your life? Does rest or a night's sleep help your tiredness? Are there any new complaints in the last few months?" This latter question is to rule out any new condition that may have developed, in addition to the chronic tiredness.

Patients believe that their weakness and tiredness is due either to a physical condition or to overwork. "In the great majority of cases it is neither the one nor the other. Tiredness is, next to pain, the most common symptom of neurosis. Work, instead of making fatigue (tiredness) worse, often relieves it."

It is easily understood how an individual who thinks he has an ailment, when one exists, worries just as much as if a disease were present and what makes him more worried and upset is that he can expect no sympathy from family or friends.

### HEALTH NOTES

For those who may wonder what to do for an epileptic during an attack, the attacks run their course so that nothing need be done for the patient except to prevent him from hurting himself.

Scabies (the itch) is caused by a tiny organism, the itch mite, which burrows into the skin, and lays its eggs.

Several years ago research workers at Toronto General Hospital were helping many cases of stomach ulcer by feeding the patient by means of a duodenal tube.

Cancer should be suspected if a sore in the mouth has been growing for several weeks. Two other common sores found in the mouth are due to tuberculosis and to syphilis.

### Where We Came In

Lesson for February 5, 1950

**A** CIRCULAR LETTER came in the other day from a stranger who is hot and bothered because he has discovered that Jews and Negroes can belong to Christian churches along with white Americans. The astonishing thing is not that that should be true, but that any man should get excited over it. What astonished the Apostle Paul was not that Jews were in the Christian church but that anybody else could be! We must recall that Jesus was a Jew; that all the apostles were Jews; that the first Christian church at Jerusalem was composed exclusively of Jews.



### New Type

**T**HE CHURCH AT ANTIOCH, one of the great commercial cities of the Roman world, was where we Gentiles came in. The writer is indebted to his former teacher, Dr. Charles Erdman, for noting four ways in which that church in Antioch was something new.

They had no Old Testament, they knew nothing of the Old Testament sacrifices, they had no interest in the Temple or in the history of Israel. Like most Gentiles, they had usually thought of the Jew as a quaint but unimportant minority group. Now that these Gentiles were in the same church with Jews, there would be plenty of room for trouble.

Could a church made up of such different races become a true Brotherhood? So the old mother-church at Jerusalem sent up Brother Barnabas to look around. Barnabas was not the church's most brilliant mind, but he had a heart full of faith.

### New Leaders

**G**OD DOES NOT ALWAYS give the greatest successes to the "big names." Nowadays every one who knows his Bible knows Paul and Barnabas; but in Antioch both men were unknown at first, and untried.

When God wants a Reformation he calls forth a Luther, an obscure man who never fitted any of the existing priestly molds. When God wanted to open up Africa he called David Livingstone; when he wanted men for the far interior of Asia he called Hudson Taylor. When he wanted light to shine down into the slums he called William Booth.

These were all peculiar men by the standards of their times, but it takes peculiar men to break away from tradition's hearth-fire and break out new roads for the Gospel.

### New Center

**F**OR SOME TIME Jerusalem was the capital of the Christian world. All roads led out from there, so to speak. With the rise of the Antioch church, however, a new center took the place of the old. Jerusalem withered away. In later times Alexandria led, and then other cities.

For a thousand years Rome and Constantinople were the acknowledged centers of the Christian world. Now we have also London—New York—Geneva... Many such centers have small beginnings. In America's early days the churches of Scotland sent over missionary offerings for the help of the struggling little church of New York.

In future years, who knows? Some church in Yunnan may be sending missionaries to the feeble folk left in the war-devastated ex-white world.

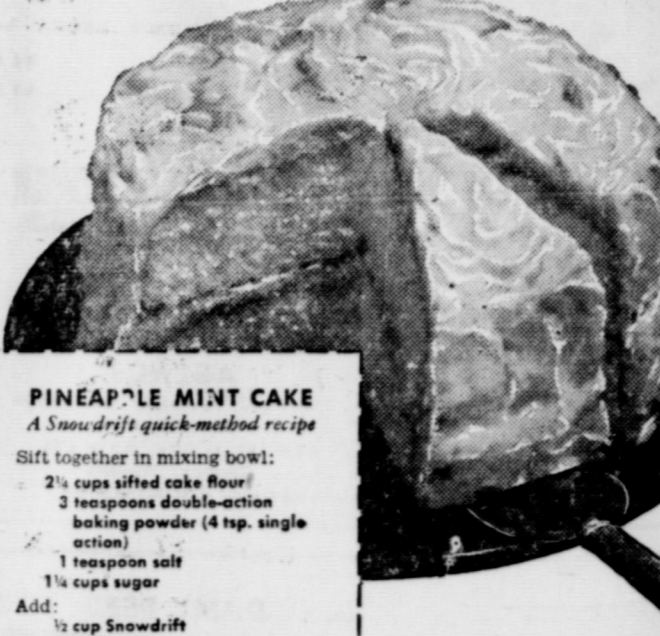
### New Name

**A**NTIOCH is no longer a city of any importance. Missionaries go to it, not from it. But old Antioch left us something still cherished, a new name for believers: Christian. That name itself proves something.

It proves that the church in Antioch was something more than an aggregation of "churchmen." It was a family of Christ-men and Christ-women. These believers must have talked and lived something better than mere vague "religion." They talked of Christ, they loved Christ and they lived Christ, till even their busy neighbors took notice.

If your church had no name, and if your neighbors were to name it, and all the neighbors knew about it were you, by what name would they call it?

**Lining Box With Heavy Felt**

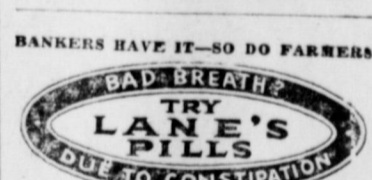
QUESTION: Can you tell me the best kind of glue to use in fastening heavy wool felt to the inside of a plywood box? I want a glue that will spread easily, set fairly fast, and not soak through the felt.

ANSWER: Shellac generally is used for pasting a lining in a silver chest, the lining usually consisting of either velvet or canton flannel. I believe it would serve your purpose also, and it would be easy to obtain. Allow the shellac to become "tacky" before placing the felt.

## KEEPING HEALTHY

# We Fight Nature's Healing Methods

By Dr. James W. Barton

I OFTEN WONDER how nature puts up with our blundering ways of what we consider wise or sensible methods of preserving health.

For instance, something irritates the small and large intestine and diarrhea occurs. This extra water manufactured by the lining of the intestine is to help wash or clean away the irritating substance, yet we do our best to try to stop this extra flow of water; the diarrhoea must be stopped.

A little head cold occurs and the lining of the nose manufactures an antiseptic juice, which, if left alone, will put up a great fight against the organisms that are causing the cold. Our first thought is to shrink or "dry up" the nose instead of letting nature's antiseptic nose juice do its fighting without interference on our part.

Similarly with a cough in its early stages, nature manufactures extra juice on the lining surface of the little tubes which are branches

of the large bronchial tubes. Nature then makes us cough up this mucous while it is in liquid form.

Of course, where the cough is not loosening up the sputum and is just a "nervous hacking" cough, drugs to quiet the nerves and the muscles of the chest are prescribed by the physician to "quiet" the cough and give the patient rest.

Similarly with a rise in temperature, our first thought may be to try to reduce the temperature whereas the rise in temperature is nature's weapon against harmful organisms which are causing the ailment.

Of course where the temperature becomes very high the physician prescribes drugs to reduce it, control it and save life. Another thing we forget is that when eyes are irritated nature causes an extra flow of tears. It is known that for most disease-producing organisms, normal tears are much more effective in protecting the eye than solutions of drugs, which are apt to be too strong.

Lesson for February 12, 1950

**SO YOU DON'T BELIEVE** in foreign missions? Then you can't read the New Testament with any comfort. Every book in it was written either by a missionary, or about missionaries, or to missionaries, or to be used in mission work. Chapters 13 and 14 of Acts tell us about the first organized foreign mission project in the history of the Christian church. It is the story of how the Gospel was taken out of the narrow strip of coastland along the eastern shore of the Mediterranean, where it was born, out into the western world.

## The Best They Had

THE FIRST missionary party were not raw untried men. They were Barnabas and Saul, the top leaders of Antioch. These men had done a great work in Antioch; their usefulness there was not at an end by any means. But the church sent them away to win souls elsewhere. It is a mistake to suppose that just anybody will do as a missionary.

**Ignorant people who suppose that missionaries are only the "culls" of the church don't know the facts.** A few years ago a scientist, Ellsworth Huntington, made a study of the graduates of Yale and Harvard who were successful enough to be written up in "Who's Who in America." He found that missionaries' sons furnished the largest proportion of those successful men.

The reason for this, he believed, is that only in missionary families do you find that both parents, and not just one, have to go through a rigid sifting process. Only the best—mentally, morally, physically—are accepted by the church today as missionaries.

## Strategic Centers

**SAUL**, or Paul, who came rapidly to the front in the missionary team, was all for efficiency. He never did a thing the hard way if an easier way would save his energy. So we find him heading for the great centers of population.

In the synagogues he would find the most religious people in the city, people who already believed in the One God and who took seriously the Law and the Prophets.

Barnabas and Saul stuck to cities for another reason also. Not that they despised small-town folk, but they knew that cities are where the crowds are. For every dozen people they could reach in a village, there were hundreds to be reached in the cities. So today, mission work has generally concentrated first in the most heavily settled regions.

## The Follow-Up

**SAUL AND BARNABAS** also set the example for later generations in their use of the "follow-up." They did not suppose that simply converting people was enough. There had to be second visits. Some churches Paul visited as many as five times. They would appoint officers in every church. They knew that organized religion is more likely to last than disorganized religion.

They were not fly-by-night evangelists, leaving behind them only an ebbing wave of emotional excitement. Every rose grower knows that it is better to put a 10-cent rose in a 50-cent hole than to put a 50-cent rose into a 10-cent hole. So Paul did not stick little seedlings of new Christians into barren ground at random; he took pains to see that they were solidly planted in good rose-beds.

## The Holy Spirit

THERE IS ANOTHER, and most important, way in which this first missionary effort has set the pace for all since: From beginning to end, they depended on the Holy Spirit. It was the Spirit who first suggested the idea; it was the Spirit who gave the power, and furnished the guidance. Not that the Spirit was or is a substitute for human effort.

But to this very day, if you want to find persons who know about the Holy Spirit at first hand, who know what it means to depend on the Spirit and to be used by Him, then get acquainted with your church's missionaries.

What to so many of us churchgoers is only a name, to them is the deepest reality by which they live.

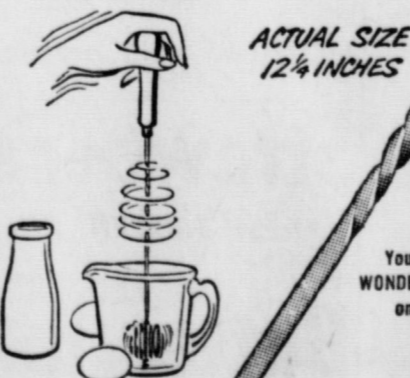

## Farmers Ask Data On Crop Varieties

Proper Choice of Seed - Held First Requisite

Farmers, with this year's harvest out of the way, are looking toward 1950 and seeding time, county extension agents report.

Many farmers are asking county extension agents about new varieties of crops. As a rule, the county agent's answer to farmers is this: "Before buying seed of any new variety it is good business to be sure it is recommended and suited to the locality in which you live. The new variety should be at least as good, or better, than varieties you have been growing."

Reliable seed dealers and their agents can usually be depended upon to offer you only proved new varieties of grain, he says. But

each fall, reports are received of less responsible salesmen and mail order advertisements selling new varieties, often at high prices, that may not be as good as our common varieties.

Most experiment stations test in their plots most all the new grain varieties developed by plant breeders in the north central states and Canada that offer promise of being adapted. By consulting county extension agents about a new variety of seed, farmers can find out if it has been tested and is recommended for your area.
