The week opened here with much speculation on Gov. Daniel's possible veto of HB 727, a retail sales tax that is designed to raise from \$128 to \$150 million a year.

After passage by the Senate, the bill would go to the governor's of-fice. If he did not return it to the Legislature within ten days it would become a law without his signature.

If the Governor returned the bill with a veto, it could be passed into law over his objection by a two thirds vote of each houst.

If, however, the sales tax should be passed within the last 10 days of the session, Gov. Daniel could kill it with a veto proclamation filed with the Secretary of State within 20 days after adjournment of the Legislature.

The 120th day of the session falls on May 9th. The Legislature can stretch the session into a 20 day overtime period, sufficient time to accomplish what many thought was impossible in one session.

It was predicted by many capitol pessimists that one or more special se sions would be necessary before Texas' financial problems were sol-

And, even though things look good now, there are still many doubts in the picture that do not assure the Legis ature that it can possigly within this single session -

1. Retire the general fund deficit

Balance the books on the two year appropriations with sufficient new revenue, 3. Vote school teachers an annual salary increase.

But the session thus far has progressed rapid y and effectively.


