My background is primarily agricultural, having engaged in farming and ranching most all my life. I was born in San Angelo, Texas, on July 23, 1906 and grew up on a ranch in Tom Green County, graduated from San Angelo High School and attended Abilene Christian College, Abilene, Texas. Later attended Draughon's Business College in Abilene and returned to engage in ranching in 1928. On May 3rd of that year married Jewel Bodenhamer of Brady, Texas, and have

two children, Sam Thomas, age 22, now studying medicine in Southwestern Medical College, Dallas, Texas, and Judith Ann, age 18, now in Harris School of Nursing and T. C. U., Fort Worth, Texas.

The depression of the 30s forced me to give up ranching temporarily and I was employed in the Public Works Program from 1933 to 1939 with the Civil Works Administration, Texas Relief Commission and Works Progress, ending in 1939 in the position of Assistant District Supervisor of San Angelo District comprising twenty one counties in 1937, together with my father, S. N. Allen of Abilene, Texas, we purchased a four section ranch and farm in Dawson County, four miles east of Key, where I have continued to operate until the present time

In 1948 I was elected President of the Dawson County Farm Bureau, and in this capacity have been active in many matters affecting agriculture in Dawson County and the South Plains. I have worked in the Texas Legislature at Austin and also in the Congress in Washington on proposed legislation affecting agriculture, typical of which are, (1) Rural Roads including tax on natural gas; (2) State Control of underground water; (3) Repeal of present law refunding 4 cents gas tax to farmers and other who use non-highway gasoline; (4) Support prices for Agricultural commodities, especially the cottonseed program in 1949; 5 Raising of

Export Quotas on cotton in 1950; (6) Child Labor Law as amended in the Fair Labor Standards Act; and others which space does not allow mentioning. Not as a candidate for office, it becomes my duty to resign any Farm Bureau activity for the By-Laws of Farm Bureau specifically state that no officer of Farm Bureau may continue in that capacity and at the same time be a candidate for public office. I regret leaving Farm Bureau but have complete confidence in the officers and Directors of this organization. I know they can and will carry on the work which we have begun and continue to grow and do collectively, what farmers want done, off the farm.

In February 1950, I was elected a member of the Board of the Peka-Lambro Rural Telephone Cooperation of Tahoka, Texas and later President of the Board. I served in this capacity, helping organize the Cooperation to provide good, rural telephone service to farm and ranch people in Yoacum, Cochran, Terry, Lynn, Garza, Borden, Dawson, Gains, Hockley and Martin Counties. On January 22, 1951, I resigned as president and assumed active, full time management of the Telephone Co-Op. On March 19, 1952, I went to Washington D. C. and cleared all contracts with R. E. A. placing the Cooperative in position to begin construction. Having fulfilled my promise to the Board to meage the Co-Op to

the point, I resigned effective May 11, 1952, and assumed management of the West Texas Weather Improvement District May 1, 1952.

Working with others in adjoining counties, I was active in helping organize the West Texas Weather Improvement District, addressing public meetings in Dawson, Lynn, Terry, Borden, Garza, Kent, Stone, Wall, Scurry, Fisher, Gaines, Cook, um, Mitchell and Nolan Counties. This organization has entered into contract with Dr. Irving P. Krich and his Water Resources Development Corporation of Denver, Colo to seed clouds and storms with silver iodide in an effort to increase rainfall in the District, rainfall sorely needed in all counties at this time. A large majority of the Board members of the W. T. W. I. District have encouraged me to make this race for Representative indicating they thought there would be no conflict in my duties as Manager and my candidacy for office.

From the foregoing it can be seen that I have been interested in many things which affect people in this area and have done what could be helpful in solving some of our mutual problems. With this background and experience not only at home but in Austin and in Washington, I feel that I am qualified to represent you, the voters and citizens of the 99th District.

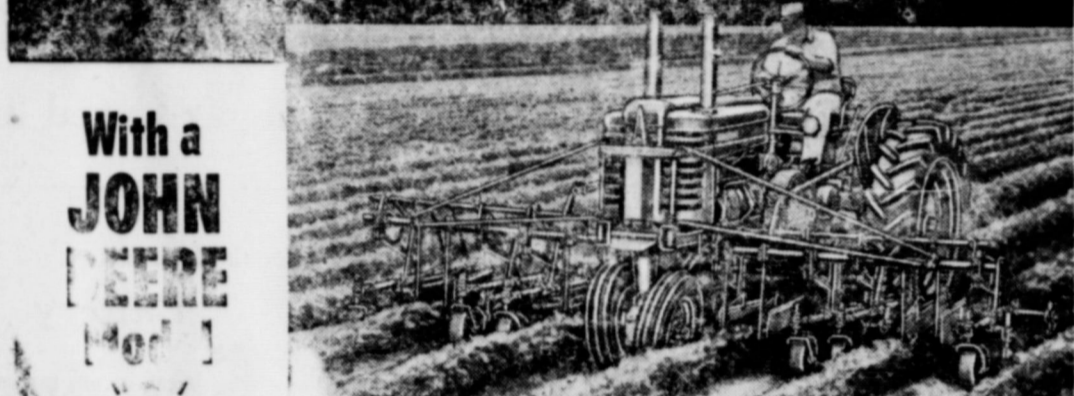

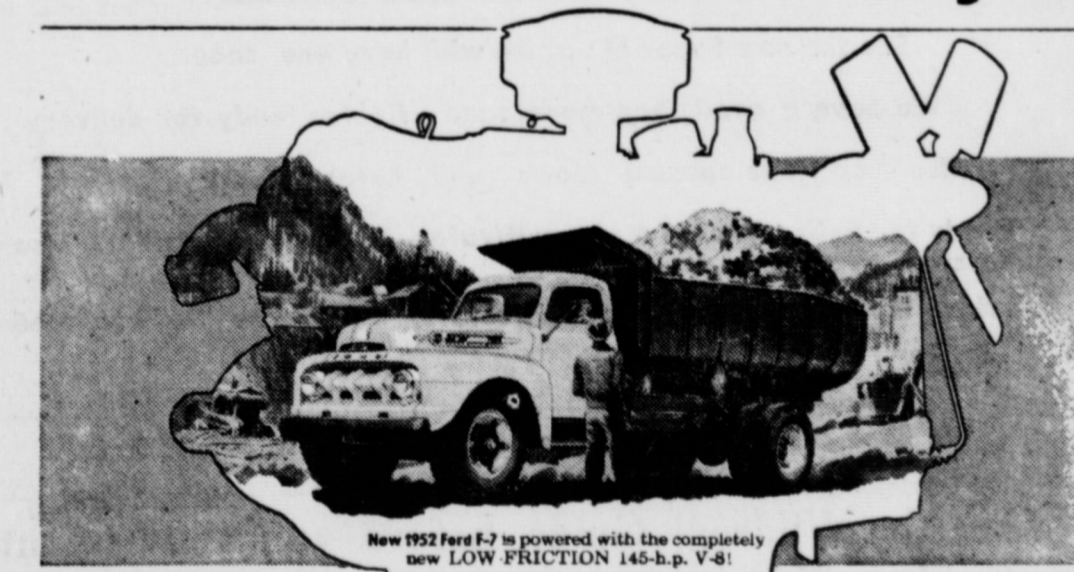
