### Sending Food Overseas

Food from home is first preference of most servicemen for their Christmas boxes. Send him what he wants even though it may be harder than ever to decide what is best to send.

First, send what will get there in good condition and will be safe to eat. Experience of the previous year has taught mothers, wives and sweethearts to send food canned in tin cans, if at all possible, or at least, it is essential to pack the foods in tight metal containers. Foods not sealed in tin cans have been reported molded, infested with insects, soaked in water or oil, or dried out and old.

When sending food to the service men, it is best to send a variety of things unless he has asked for one specific food. A menu may be planned on this order: 1) 1 can turkey, 1 cranberry sauce, one nut, 1 plum pudding; 2) cheese, pickles and crackers; or 3) a meat, a vegetable, a fruit, a relish and a sweet which go together well might make a whole meal.

Fruit cakes that had been canned were among the most popular items sent last year. It is one of the most desirable products, also, honey is a good substitute in fruit cakes because it helps to keep them moist as well as adds sweetness. Other cakes may be sent successfully, but allow plenty of headspace, preferably 1-2 to 1-3 of the can for rising. These cakes may be canned as the directions for fruit cake, or the cans may be lined with wax paper, the cakes baked in the can, allowed to cool, and then sealed without further processing. Or there might be a blend between these two methods; bake the cake in the can, seal while hot and process it at 5 pounds, 17 lbs. in Lynn County; for ten minutes. This would prevent mold and allow the cake to have a nicer texture and crust.

**Cookies** — The popular cookies last year were Russian Rocks, fruit nut cookies, ice box cookies, peanut drop cookies, and butterscotch cookies. The cookies should be baked as usual. As soon as they are cooked, wrap each cookie in wax paper and pack in clean dry cans and seal. Do not allow them to stand several hours or overnight in damp air before being packed. Cookies not wrapped in wax paper have a tendency to crumble badly. A cookie that is too moist molds badly.

**Candies** — Candies may be made with sugar substitutes or with no sugar. Fruit and nut candies are the most desirable to send. Heat nuts thoroughly, either before adding them to the candy, or cook them in the candy long enough to destroy any insect eggs which might be present. If the candy is poured into a lined can, let it cool before sealing. If sealed hot, it will not get hard. Candy was reported to have traveled nicely if made as usual, cooled, each piece wrapped in wax paper and snugly packed in a can and sealed.

**Cheese** — Cheese has been sent by cutting it the size of the can, wrapped well in waxed paper, and sealed in cans. Others have rolled it in melted paraffin before sealing it in a can. The small packages of cheese that are already sealed in cellophane may be packed without opening, in cans and sealed.

**Meats** — Meats of different kinds have come thru successfully. Turkey and

### Mail G.I. Christmas Gifts Overseas Early

CHRISTMAS packages going to servicemen still overseas must be mailed early again this year, advises Marjorie Griffin, Rural Home editor of Capper's Farmer.

"Lists to Santa Claus from overseas servicemen are already on their way home," she writes in the nationally circulated magazine.

"Family photographs head many requests as always. Next come canned snack foods, such as nuts and olives. Books, writing portfolios, service watches, good pipes, pens, engraved identification tags and waterproof wallets rate high also.

"Mailing regulations are similar to last year. Packages must be mailed between September 15 and October 15. Boxes must be metal, wood, solid fiberboard or strong double-faced corrugated fiberboard. Newly available will be boxes 10 by 6 by 4 inches; these will be stronger than many previously used.

"Letters from your own overseas service folks will be the final guide to gift selection."

### Gifts of God

Draw on your imagination for a moment and consider with me an altogether improbable circumstance. Suppose a well-groomed gentleman with an easy flow of language should mount an improvised platform in the public square of an agricultural county-seat town next Saturday afternoon, play a phonograph record through a loud speaker to get an audience, and then should say:

"Ladies and Gentlemen—there is just so much water in the entire universe; so much and no more. Any time you drink more of it than you need to quench your thirst, you are greedy because some unfortunate person somewhere on earth wants water. He is thirsty. His throat is dry and his lips are parching. And it is all for want of the water which you so wantonly swallow."

### It Is Not True

Such a speaker would soon lose his audience. People would walk away and leave him. Some of them might think about having his head examined because they know his ideas are out of joint. There is no connection whatever between one man's abundance of water and some far-away stranger's thirst. The need of the sufferer, even if he were a victim of cruelty, is apart from the owner of a good well.

But the speaker might hold his audience if he said something like this: "Ladies and Gentlemen—there is just so much wealth in the world; so much and no more. Anybody with more than he needs for food, clothes and shelter is greedy because there are many people in China and India who never had a square meal in their lives. They are poor because a few people get very rich."

### Another Fallacy

This speech is no nearer true than the one about the water. Both have some facts in them but they are not related facts. I am not trying to say that wealth is free and cheap like water, but I am saying this: My neighbor's fine home and big car have cost me nothing. He has more than I have because he (or his father maybe) has more wealth-creating ability than I have.

There is such a thing as oppression of the poor. There is such a thing as exploiting labor. It is a crime which Jesus decried openly. It is also a short-sighted vice because it leads toward poverty and not toward wealth. "Good money in circulation" is a manifestation of prosperity and it occurs only in lands where workers are well paid and thus permitted to maintain good homes and live in comfort.

### America's Blessing

Workers are paid well in America, twice as well as in England and six times as well as in Russia, and America is a rich country. Families live on \$1 a month per person in China—China is a poor country. Is China poor because America is rich? No! Without the United States as a customer, and supplier, the Orient would be poorer still. The difference is that we have liberty, and they have oppression.

We Americans receive countless benefits from God's hand that people in other countries never heard about. Is God partial to America? Certainly not! Our benefits come through a channel that the rulers of other countries have blindly and selfishly closed by exploiting labor. Our God-fearing ancestors opened it for us long ago. The channel is personal freedom, protected by representative, constitutional government.

Some one has said that we're only sure of two things - death and taxes. Anyway the death rate does not increase every time Congress meets.
