-My husband, who was a veteran died recently, leaving me his GI insurance policy, and some bills, which I intend to settle as soon as pos-sible. Meanwhile, do his creditors have any right to seize the GI insurance policy in order to get their money right away?

A-No. Proceeds of a GI insurance policy are exempted by law from the claims of creditors. They may not be seized or attached to pay your husband's debts.

Q-1 now get retirement pay from the Armed Forces but I am also eligible for disability payments from the V A, although to get them I must make a choice to give up retirement pay. If I make the choice now will it be binding for the rest of my life, or may I change back at some future date

The choice you make now will not be binding for the rest of yiun life. You have the right to change at any time.

Q -- I am a Korea veteran with service-connected disability. I want to get a GI insurance policy avail-able to disabled Korea veterans. I Know that a one-year deadline is involved. Is that one year from the date of my discharge, or one year from the date VA rated my disability?

A-Your deadline is one year from the date VA determined your disability to be service-connected.

-I'm intending to go to college Qthis fall, under the Korean GI Bill. Will it be possible for me to get any part of my GI allowance pay in advance, before I start classes?

No. Under the law, allow-A --ances are paid some time after the end of each month of training com pleted, and not before. After the end of the month, you and your school will have to sign a certificate stating you were in class all month. VA is allowed up to 20 days, after receipt of certificate to send your check In starting out be sure to take along enough money to tile you over the first 2 months.



S. S. News Given

What documents do I need to furnish when I apply for my social security benefits? This question is frequently asked of the Social Se-curity Office, according to John G. Hutton, Manager.

When a person files an applica-tion for retirement or family insur-ance, some records must be furnished to establish his rights to the payments, Hutton said. The proofs most often needed are proof of age, proof of marriage, and evidence of the amount of earnings in the preceding year.

Most people have an old record on which their date of birth or age was recorded many years ago, such as a baptismal certificate, school record, government record. family Bible, insurance policy, poll tax receipt, ect. Census records are sometimes available. A recently estab-lished delayed birth certificate is not sufficient proof of age for this purpose. A widow of a deceased worker who applies for monthly benefits is required to furnish proof of marriage. The marriage certificate or certified copy of it may be obtained from the county clerk of the county where the marriage li-cense was obtained, Hutton said.

Evidence of the amount of earn-ings in the preceding year will speed the payment of a claim. In the case of an employee, this would be the statement of wages and taxes (Form W-2) which he received from his employer. A self-employed person should furnish a copy of his last income tax return and evidence of payment such as a cancelled check or money order receipt.

A representative of the Lubbock Social Security Office will be in O'Donnell on Aug. 20. 1958 at 2:00 P. m. at the Elementary School and will be glad to assist in all matters pertaining to Social Security.


