New FHA Program Given

A new loan program, recently announced by the Farmers Home Administration, is designed to help rural families finance enterprises that will improve their incomes. The loans are a part of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964. They can provide up to \$2500 for up to 15 years at a 4-8 percent interest rate. Rural residents can get the loans on the basis of their ability and character.

The loans are for people who know a good way to increase their income but who cannot readily get financing thru regular credit channels

Sgt. Mel Baker, local Army recruiter informed the Index that the Army is offering the graduate specialist program again this year to all high school seniors who wish to take advantage of this program.

Students who wish to have a guaranteed technical school waiting for them upon their graduation from high school should indicate their desire to pre-qualify on the senior survey cards they will receive thru the mail in the near future. This does not obligate the student to join any branch of service however it would give them the opportunity to obtain information as to the exact school or assignment they are mentally and physically capable of attending in the military service

Pre-qualifications will be accomplished on Saturdays and will not interfere with any school schedule. Male students 17 years of age and all female students must have their parents written consent to make the examinations.

DROPOUT PROBLEM IS OF NATIONAL CONCERN

Three million of the nation's young people between the ages of 16 and 19 have become dropouts.

Although this alarming number is cause for concern, nevertheless the rate of dropout has dropped from 41 percent to 30 percent since 1950.

The term dropout doesn't bring pleasant pictures to mind. Many people often associate the colloquial term with juvenile delinquents. Yet the boy or girl who becomes a dropout may be a nice young person — just bewildered, unsure of himself, and his goal in life.

Many youngsters face the decision of whether to leave school or continue before they are old enough or experience enough to decide wisely. The process which leads to a student leaving school is a long one — and it is affected by the student, his family and his school.

Youngsters need guidance and encouragement from their families and school officials. Many people must share the blame for a school dropout.

The Internal Revenue Service has prepared a free booklet of tax advice for farmers. Called "Farmer's Tax Guide," it is available from county agriculture agents or the nearest Internal Revenue Office.

Mr. John J. Sloan, Administrative Officer of the Lubbock office of Internal Revenue said the booklet is written in non-technical language and contains numerous examples showing how tax rules apply in actual situations. A sample filled-in return form is included.






