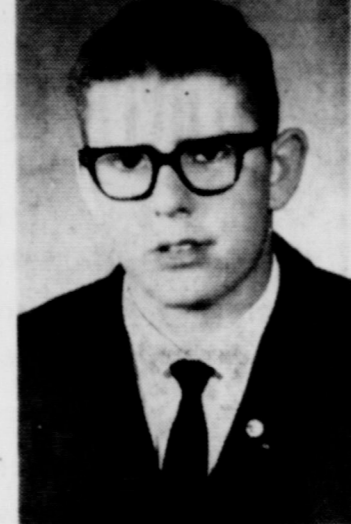

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees officially finds that said Petition conforms to law in all respects and that it was presented to the Board of Trustees on the 14 day of May, A. D. 1962;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE O'DONNELL CONSOLIDATED INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That an election be held in the O'Donnell Consolidated Independent School District on the 1st day of June, A. D. 1962 at which election, in accordance with said Petition, and in accordance with the requirements of Article 2900a, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas the following Proposition shall be submitted to the qualified electors residing in the O'Donnell Consolidated Independent School District, for their action thereupon:

Proposition
"Shall the Board of Trustees of the O'Donnell Consolidated Independent School District have the right, and be authorized to abolish the dual public school system of the O'Donnell Consolidated Independent School District and to abolish arrangements for transfer out of the O'Donnell Consolidated Independent School District for students of any minority race?"

2. That said election shall be held at the O'Donnell High School Building, O'Donnell, Lynn County, Texas and within said District.

O'DONNELL JUNIORS MAKE HIGH TEST ON SCHOLARSHIP

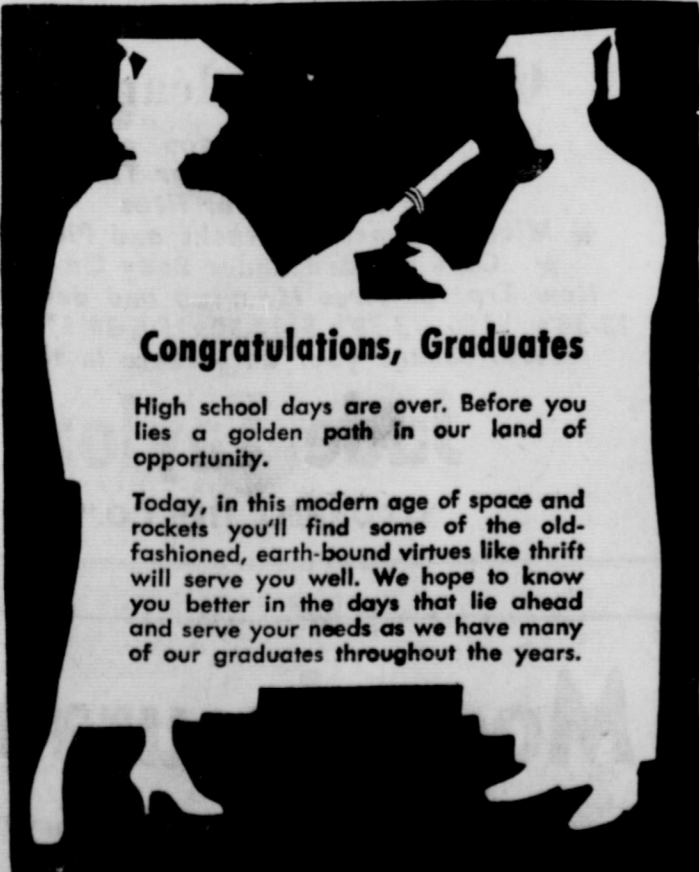
The report of scores just received by the local school reveals that the nine juniors taking the National Merit Scholarship Test in March scored above the average on all subjects except national Science Reading and that they were exactly on the national average in it. They were above the national average of scholars taking the tests as follows: English Usage, 2 points above; Math: usage, 17 points above; Social Study Reading, 17 points above.

Word Usage, 14 points above. On the total average the local students were 14 points above the middle of the National Average of scholars tested.

While it is not likely that any of the students would qualify for a scholarship, they received valuable training in taking the test according to John Nelson, County Supervisor of Guidance. Students scoring in the upper 25 percent of the National average in score standing order were: Jan Lott, Wendell White and Kathy Pirtle. The results were received from N. M. S. P. of McHenry, Ill. where the tests were scored by the Science Research Associates.

STEEL TOWER POWER LINE BUILT BY TEXAS ELECTRIC

Ft. Worth — The longest steel tower electric power transmission line ever built in the Southwest has been put in operation by Texas Electric Service Co. between Ft. Worth and Odessa. The line, which is 336 miles long, more firmly links Texas Electric's eight power plants and various major load centers served by the company. Announcement of completion was made by Beeman Fisher, president and general manager of the company.

"Construction of this new line is further evidence of Texas Electric's confidence in the continued growth and progress of the North Central and West Texas area we serve," Fisher said.

Construction of the big, new line required nearly 500 carloads of steel and conductor, Fisher said, pointing out that the line was built in the shortest time of any line of its type and size anywhere in the U. S. The western terminus of the new power line, which now operates at 138,000 volts but is designed for conversion to 345,000 volts as the use of electric power increases in near Odessa.

TELLS OF WITHHOLDING TAX

Employers liable for income tax withheld and social security taxes in excess of \$100 for the month of April must deposit such taxes with a depository, according to John Sloan, administrative officer of the IRS at Lubbock. Emphasizing the importance of compliance with deposit deadline of May 15th the IRS representative added that a Form 450 should be used for this purpose. Deposits may be made in local authorized banks or Federal Reserve Banks.

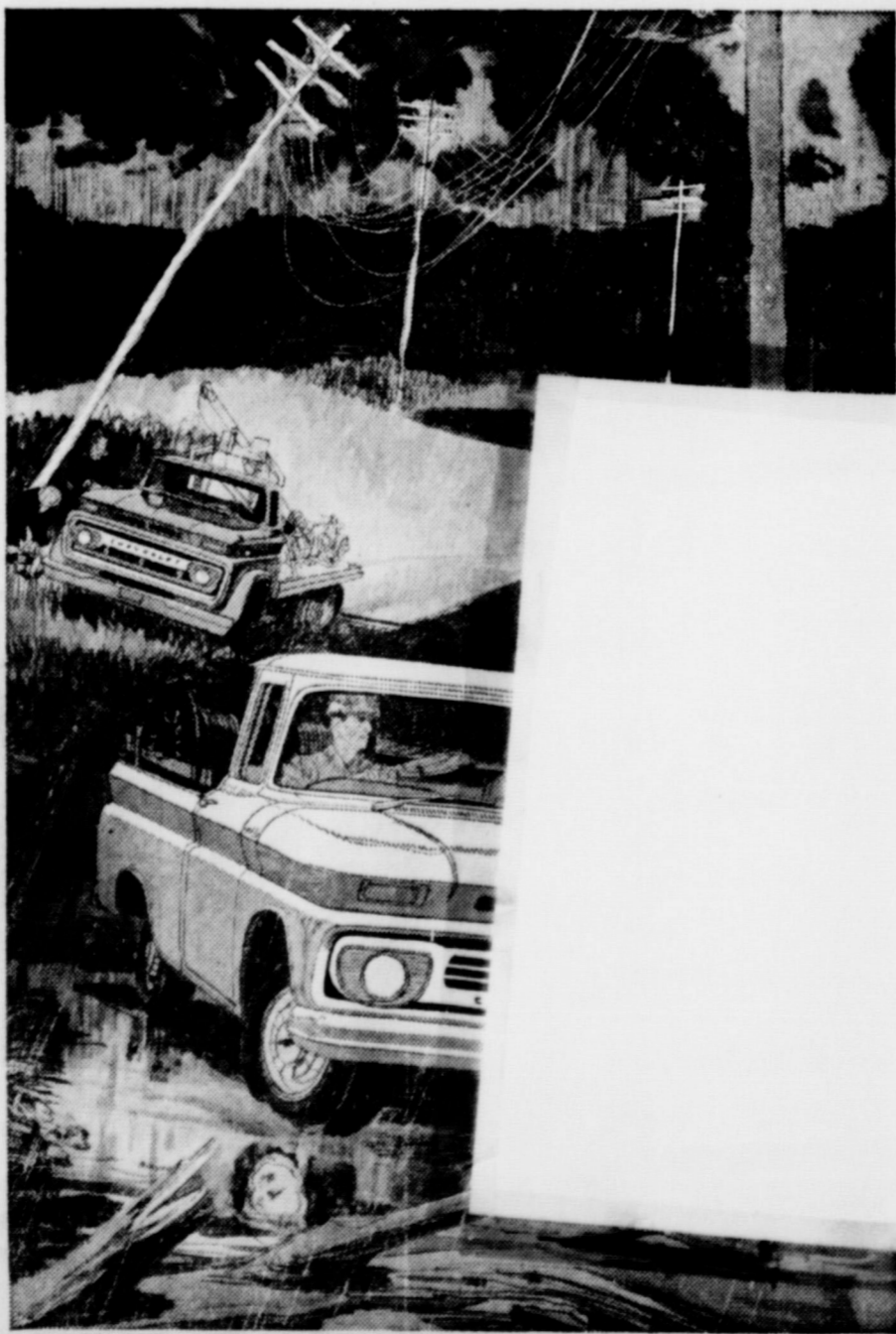
