Keep cotton dry, loose and clean during the harvesting process. The condition of seed cotton at the time it reaches the gin largely determines the final grade of the lint in the bale. And, says Fred C. Elliott, extension cotton specialist, that final grade is of major importance because it determines the selling price of the bale.

If best results are to be obtained from fall deferment of native pastures the practice should be started at once. Conditions are ideal for fall deferment and is recommended as a top range improvement practice.

NO WIDESPREAD ATTACK OF FLU IS EXPECTED

While there is no indication at this time of widespread attacks of influenza this winter, there undoubtedly will be some cases of the illness as colder weather approaches. Vaccination against it is a prudent measure for certain groups and individuals.

Principal targets for vaccination should be groups wishing to guard against absenteeism in their professions and occupations and those to whom the disease might be an ad health hazard.

There are now ample supplies of influenza vaccine of the type containing immunizing materials against the important strains of influenza including the Asian strain.

Last year this time Texas was braced for an expected epidemic of Asian flu, so called because it had first been diagnosed in Hong Kong. The first cases were reported in April in that Oriental city and a brief five months later Texas had been thoroughly seeded with the virus.

There is no expectation of a similar outbreak this fall.

V. A. Quiz

Q - Is there a deadline date for starting school under the War Orphans Educational program?

There is no deadline date. You may begin school at any time, so long as you are between 18 and 23 years of age. Under certain circumstances it is possible to begin before 18 and continue after 23.

Q - I have an idea for a mail order business which I could conduct from my place of residence. Can I get a GI home loan to buy a house in which I would plan also to conduct my own business?

A - Yes, provided the house will be used primarily for residential purposes and will not contain more than one business.

Q - I need to write the VA on a question about my GI insurance but can't find my insurance number. What kind of information will help VA in identifying me and my policy?

A - Give the VA your full name, your branch of service, date of separation from service, your serial number, and the date and place of your birth. This information should enable VA to identify your policy.

Q - I am a disabled Korea veteran who never held a GI insurance policy. Now that the VA has declared my disability service connected I understand I can apply for a GI insurance policy. How soon do I have to apply?

A - You must make application within one year from the date VA found your disability service connected.

POLIO CASES DOWN SHARPLY

Before the advent of the Salk vaccine, Texans prayed for a release from the ravages of paralytic polio for themselves and for their children. The picture has changed a great deal since then. With the announcement that Dr. Jonas Salk had developed an effective vaccine for the prevention of polio, parents swarmed to their doctors and clinics to have their children protected. Since then the incidence of paralytic polio has fallen many fold and an apathetic state of mind has fallen on many Texans concerning the need for protecting themselves. Many school children have received their shots, resulting in a favorable vaccination picture among school age children. As a result this year and last year has seen the preschool age children with the highest attack rate of paralytic polio.

Who should be vaccinated. Every one can benefit from polio vaccine inoculations since the disease strikes all ages. However the present goal is to vaccinate the most susceptible groups - from infants to age 49. You are not adequately protected unless you have all three shots properly spaced. The second shot is given two to six weeks after the first and the third 7 to 12 months after the second. It is important to have that third shot.

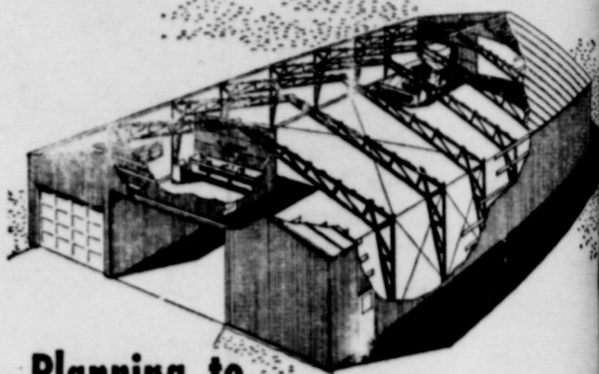

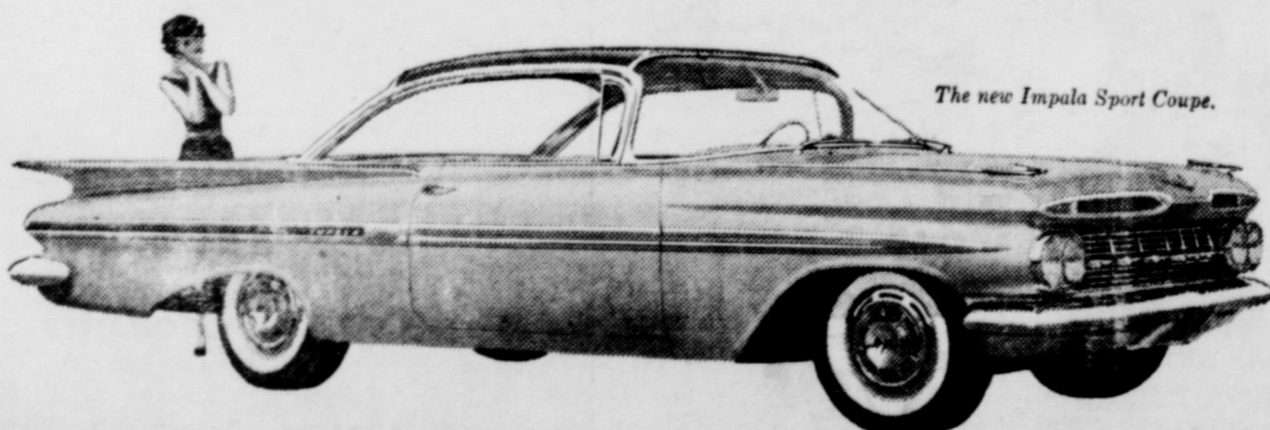

V. A. Quiz

Q — There has just been a new addition to our family, a baby boy. I am at school under the Korean GI Bill, and I know this entitles me to an increase in my allowance money, but what do I have to send VA as proof of my new dependent?

A — To support your claim of additional allowance money, send VA either a certified copy of the public record of birth or a certified copy of the church record of the child's baptism.

Q — One of our neighbors down the street is a Spanish-American War veteran who needs hospitalization. There is no VA hospital in this city but I am wondering if he may not be eligible for treatment in a non-VA hospital here with VA paying the bills.

A — Probably not. Your neighbor would have to need emergency hospital care for a service connected disability for which delay in treatment or travel to the nearest VA hospital would be extremely hazardous.

Q — I know of a case of a woman veteran, a Yeomanette of World War I who is 70 years old and whose husband is unable to support her or himself. Isn't there some new law that says payments can be made to a woman veteran with a helpless husband, and if so what are its provisions?

A — Yes, there is such a law. It states that dependency payments may be made to an eligible living veteran whose husband is not capable of self maintenance and cannot support himself because of a permanent physical or mental disability.

Q — I am 21 years old, the son of a World War I veteran who has just died of a service connected condition. I understand that War Orphans education is generally limited to children between 18 and 23. Will my War Orphans benefit end when I become 23?

A — Since your veteran parent died after you had passed age 18 you will have five years from the date of his death in which to complete your War Orphans schooling.

The upcoming big game hunting season in Texas should be a good one, reports Ed Cooper, extension wildlife specialist. But, he warns, if hunters do not observe the rules of safe hunting, the season can be disastrous. Safe hunting depends on the common sense, courtesy, and vigilance of all those who hunt, he says.
