Ernest Thompson seeks your vote for governor on July 23 on his record of service and the following progressive platform based on common sense:



1. Lower Utility Rates

He is now running for Governor on a platform of reduced gas, light, and telephone rates. He is for State regulation of utilities, because the local communities do not have the faci-lities to control the giant utility companies, and because he is opposed to Federal regulation. He opposes red tape in administration of the pension law.

3. Economy in Spending

He advocates the elimination of needless and careleas ex mditure of Government funds by budgetary control of all atte finances, and to do so without crippling any department indering service to the people.

4. Against Tax Increases

He is against any taxes, including a sales tax, until a sound ings program is put into effect, and until it is determined ether the Social Security program, as outlined above, can financed out of savings.

5. War on Unemployment

The real problem of labor is that of unemployment, and real problem of the State Government is that of unem ment. Thompson pledges an active and continous program uncess in Texas to a state of the development of nature uncess in Texas to the end that more jobs can be provided Texas cliftens. the end that more jobs can be provided

He says highway revenue from the State gasoline tax should be used SOLELY for highways and there should be no diversion of highway money for any other purpose. The Highway Department must be kept out of politics.

He advocates immediate provision to get the insane out of jails and into modern State hospitals where they will re-ceive proper care. Jails are for crimmals, not for sick people.

12. Other Platform Planks He favors continuing State regulation of oil and gas pro-duction. He opposes the open saloon, gambling in all forms, socialized medicine, centralization of government, and all "isms" contrary to the Democratic form of government.






