The second series of polio injections for 1st and 2nd grade students will be given Tuesday morning, July 26th at 8:45 a. m. at the O'Donnell Grade School, according to Dr. Joe Lehman, local physician, who will administer the medicine. ONLY those 1st and 2nd grade students receiving the first injections will be eligible. Please have the student report to his or her

home room ( of last year) at 8:30 a. m. if they are to receive their second injection. Dr. Lehman said that he sincerely urges that all should take their second injection since it will cause a high degree of immunity against poliomyelitis. There will be NO make-up injections for the 2nd injection, Dr. Lehman added.

### Feathered Hoe Hands

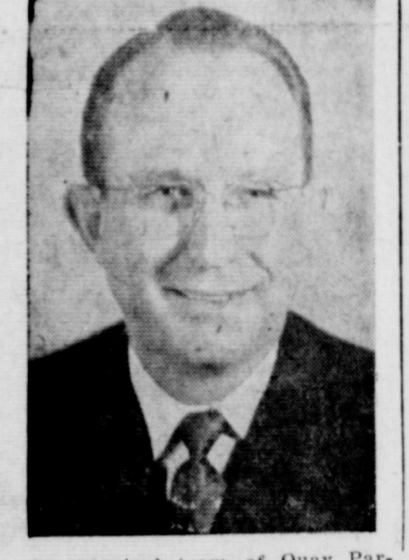
Something unusual in the way of "hoe hands" are the 100 geese of Ralph Beach at the Beach Irrigated farm less than 3 miles east of town. Mr Beach is using the crew on a patch of Johnson grass.

Ralph purchased the geese when a day old from a Jacksonville hatchery for 85c each. Much of his crew is of the White Chinese variety. He turns the flock loose in the morning and they work until midday when they go to the house for water. He feeds them corn at night. Ralph says his "hoe-hands" are almost human at times and they tend to pick leaders and oft times the older geese try to whip the younger geese. Ralph says he reserves opinion on geese for chopping until later. At any rate 100 fat geese will eat mighty good at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Early settlers from northern Europe used geese for crab grass in South and East Texas but the practice almost disappeared until recently.

### Parmer To Hold Methodist Revival



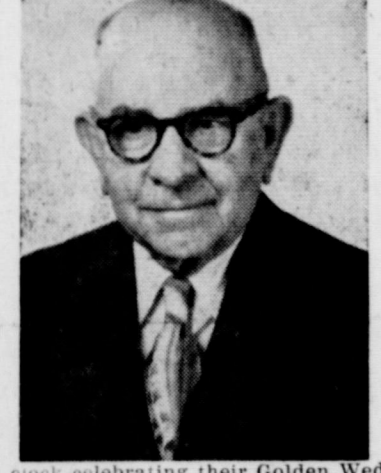

The school system has recently completed two new water wells on the school campus, according to Board President J. W. Gardenhire. A well at the southeast corner of the Grade School is expected to pump about 10 gallons per minute on a jet pump and a much better well was completed Saturday just behind the High School Library and was tested over the week end. Best guess as to normal production was 20 to 25 gal. per minute. The initial well test at northwest corner of football field was dry. With a new source of 35-40 gal. per minute, and two older wells doing 15 gal. combined, the school has about 50 to 60 gal. per minute available.

### Pre-Parade Program

At 5 p. m. sharp on the east side of the First National Bank the Pre-parade Program will begin. Mrs. Bill Davis is the capable lady in charge of this informal and entertaining program of music, comedy and group contests by the audience. A different program will be given each afternoon. The block will be cut off to car traffic from shortly before 5 until after the parade which begins promptly at 6:30. The O'Donnell H. D. Club will have a food and drink concession booth for all three afternoons and money will be used by the Club to improve the local park. W. D. Reese, formerly of here, and now of San Angelo, has been invited to be M. C. of the program, the parade and the rodeo. Joe Burkett and His Friends will furnish the music. Joe and his boys have been working very hard on the music. There will be an ample number of seats for those who need them.

### Parade At 6:30 p. m.

Promptly at 6:30 p. m. the Biggest Little Community Parade in the World will go into march formation at the marshalling area near Junior High Bldg. to the music of our excellent Eagle Band. ALL stores have agreed to CLOSE for the parade on Thursday, ONLY. Mayor Haash said.

\$200 in cash prizes will be awarded floats as follows: \$75 for 1st, \$50 for 2nd, \$35 for 3rd, \$25 for 4th and \$15 for 5th. \$7.50 each will go to the best cowgirl and to the best cowboy. Out-of-city judges will be used.

Mrs. F. M. Jones, the hard-working parade marshal said that about 20 floats are entered in the 3-day parade including:

1946 study Club, O'Donnell Fire Department, Rotary Club, F. H. A. Club, FFA Club, American Legion, O'Donnell H. D. Club, Wells H. D. Club, Brownie Scouts, The Good-neighbor Club of Harmony, the O'Donnell Sewing Club, The Lynn Co Sheriff Posse, The First Baptist Church and the First Methodist Church. The queen float and the two churches are not asking for prize in the award events. Mrs. Jones added, The commercial float entries are not all in but will include The Flower Shop, The Bank, Line Grocery, Mansell Bros. and a number of other businesses.

Now for this year will be a number of clowns supervised and trained by Bill Autry. Clowns were rented for this act. Prizes of \$10 and \$5 will be given.

Mrs. Jones said the theme of the parade this year would be song titles such as "It Ain't Gonna Rain No More". The floats are expected to be more beautiful than ever with some costing from \$50 to \$75.

Parade funds are raised by selling local merchants rodeo flag displays. The decorations went up Monday.

On Friday only the Wilson High School Band will play.

The first "get the tubs out" rain since June of '54 revived the hopes of all of this area. As we go to press Tuesday a. m., Ben Moore, the genial weatherman, reported an estimated 5 inches... with rain falling at noon at press time.

So far as can be determined all of this trade area received a like amount as the rain was gentle giving indications of being a Gulf rain in contrast to the fast moving thunder and wind storms of the west. Rain began at 3:30 a. m. A moderate size cotton crop is now assured - probably about last year. However deadline for safe planting of grains as milo, etc is nearly... or is over. Sudan grass planted in early August has been known to make. For this area, the feed crop is the smallest in 15 years. One of the great benefits of the rain will be adding subsoil moisture for fall and winter farming practices to prevent the savage wind erosion of spring.
