

tion to be known as Section 11a, to read as follows:

"Section 11A. The Courts of the State of Texas having original juutidiction of criminal actions shall have the power, after conviction, to suspend the imposition or execution of sentence and to place the defendant upon probation and to reimpose such sentence, under such conditions, as the Legislature may prescribe."

Sec. 2. Such proposed Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electros of this State at a special election to be held throughout the State of Texas on the fourth Saturday in August, 1935, at which election all voters favoring said proposed Amendment, shall write, or have printed on their ballots the words:

"FOR the Amendment to the State Constitution authorizing the Courts to place defendants on probation,"
