## Postal rate going up; new stamp to be sold

| For persons wishing to purchase the new 22 -cent first class postage stamp that goes into effect Feb. 17, the new "D" series stamp will go on sale locatly Monday. <br> According to Postmaster Ken Turman, letters weighing up to one ounce will be mailed with a 22 -cent stamp beginning Feb. 17. An additional 17 -cents will be required per ounce up to 12 ounces, above which the letter will be "priority mail" and will cost whatever the distance to the address is. <br> Postcards will be 14 -cents and stamped envelopes will be 27 -cents each. <br> First class postage is only part of the Postal Service's rate increases. Others include: <br> Insured Fees - minimum insured | (up to $\$ 25$ ), goes from 45 -cents to 50 -cents; $\$ 50$ from 85 -cents to $\$ 1.10$; and the maximum insurance will be $\$ 500$. <br> Money Order Fees - Up to $\$ 25$, the fee is 75 -cents. From $\$ 25.01$ to $\$ 700$, the fee is $\$ 1$. The maximum money order is raised from $\$ 500$ to $\$ 700$.
