

Another fast food business was burglarized over the weekend, and two Wichita Falls women were arrested while attempting to take a television set from a store without paying for it.



The price of living goes up New Year's Day, when sales tax is increased by one cent and an additional

five cents tax is added to each gallon of gasoline purchased. Both increases were put into

place when the Texas legislature met in special session.

Commenting on the sales tax increase, State Comptroller Bob Bullock said, "Only the rate has changed. In every case, what is and what is not taxable under current sales tax law remains the same when the new law goes into effect January 1."

Actually, the sales tax increase was one and one-eighth percent to deal with a shortfall of tax revenue

caused by the collapse of oil prices, Bullock added.

The state sales tax rate goes from 4.125 to 5.25 percent. Another cent is added in communities, like Iowa Park, for local revenue.

Bulllock said that in many areas of Texas the state rate and local sales taxes, including transit and city sales taxes will put the combined rate to as much as 7.25 percent. In making accounting changes to collect the new tax rate, businesses should adjust cash registers and alerted and trained their personnel to collect sales tax at the new local rates, the comptroller said.



## Christmas tree burning slated New Year's Eve

Residents will have an opportunity to get rid of their Christmas trees, the safe way, by taking them to the vacant block between Third and Fourth Streets by New Year's Eve.

The fire will be lit at 7 p.m. by members of the Iowa Park Volunteer Fire Department, who will oversee the project to be sure it remains safe.

Christmas trees, especially when they've been cut a long time and have dried out, are very dangerous because they ignite so easily, observed Fire Chief Danny Skinner.

Skinner said children have been known to collect discarded trees from the alleys and build forts in which to play. This, he pointed out, is extremely dangerous to the youngsters.

Those discarding their trees should place them in the marked area, where the two bonfires have been held this fall.

# Highlights of 1986 are reviewed

1986, as reflected in the pages of the Iowa Park Leader, was a busy year of accomplishments, improvements, changes, and in some cases, sorrow.

The Tom Burnett Memorial Library became a reality, thanks to the efforts of many people and organizations, and the cooperation of the city council. The stately structure has even been incorporated into the city's emblem. And dedicated individuals are promising continued support and improvements in the years to come.

Despite economy problems caused by lower oil and agriculture prices, people in business and city government demonstrated their faith in the future by making numerous improvements throughout the community.

Students at Iowa Park High School had a lengthy series of accomplishments during the calendar year, including those in band, choir, scholastics, and the sports teams of football, baseball and tennis earning titles.

But the year also brought sorrow, with the loss of several pioneer family members and civic leaders, including Mrs. W.F. George, Lottie Lochridge and Tom Corridon, as well as civic leader Bill Spruiell.

The following represents most of the highlights of 1986:

#### JANUARY

As the new year got underway, so was the moving of the city's library into its new and permanent home, the Tom L. Burnett Memorial Library. At the annual banquet for members of the Iowa Park Volunteer Fire Department, awards were presented to: Chris Klein, Fireman of the Year; Paul Shea, for his EMT service; Wayne Williams, 14 years service as secretary of the organization, and Terri Penaluna for work as radio dispatcher. Ownerships of three local businesses changed hands: Mr. and Mrs. Joe Hughes purchased Settle Drug; Mr. and Mrs. Keith Fisher bought Easy Shop Foods and renamed it K&K, and Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Hutchinson purchased H&R Block. First activity in the community as part of the Texas Sesquicentennial was the planting of 10 pecan trees at Bradford Elementary. Groundbreaking ceremony was held for the new Wichita County Farm Bureau building. Police acted swiftly to stop a train at 1:30 a.m. before it struck a stalled car on the Texowa crossing, left there while a Burkburnett man and woman fought. Shawn Price was notified he had been named to the Class AAA All State first team defensive platoon. At the annual football banquet, Price was also named Outstanding Player; Dennis Phillips "Ball Hawker"; Robert Adams "Hustler" award, and Chad Fielding received the first annual Jackie Denton Memorial Award.

## FEBRUARY

Recipients of the annual awards presented by the Iowa Park Chamber of Commerce were: Mrs. W.A. George, Outstanding Citizen; Mrs. Pauline Singleton, Outstanding Senior Citizen; Joni Whitis, Outstanding Educator, and Stanley Williamson, Outstanding Agriculturist; keynote speaker at the banquet was Maj. Gen. Richard Phillips of Sheppard Air Force Base, and Rip Smith was installed as president. Grace Baptist Church called Rev. Aric John-

son. Continuing a program to improve the business district appearance, work was begun on the MuleSkinners' MuleBarn with a plaster covering. Jack Martin purchased Park Pharmacy, renaming it Jack's Park Pharmacy. Work continued and neared completion of a new pavillion at Highland Cemetery. After more than two months without precipitation, .61 of rainfall was measured, and launched one of the wettest years locally in history. Tanner's Kuntry Store in Holliday sustained an estimated \$250,000 loss by fire. Jack Monroe was named Holliday's Fireman of the Year. In the UIL's realignment, Iowa Park, Bowie, Decatur and Bridgeport were named to Dist. 6-AAA, losing Vernon and Springtown but picking up Jacksboro and Breckenridge. Iowa Parkan Charles Childs was injured by gunshot when he interruped a robbery in progress in Wichita Falls. The school board approved purchase of 130 new band uniforms at a cost of \$31,887. Rev. Michael Grubbs was called by the First Christian Church. The Lady Hawk basketball team lost their final game to Bowie and an opportunity to advance into the playoffs along with Vernon. More than 40 area farmers spent a day preparing farming equipment of the Ray Hicks estate for auction. The city council accepted a bid of \$279,443 to rebuild Johnson Road from Wagonwheel to the access road, and install a storm sewer to cut down flooding in Country Hills Estates. School trustees accepted a bid of \$236,538 to construct four additional classrooms at Kidwell Elementary, a move necessitated to meet teacher-pupil ratios set by House Bill 72.

## MARCH

Iowa Park's major Sesquicentennial event of the year was held on Texas Independence Day, with a time capsule burial, flag-raising ceremony, speeches and barbecue meal served on the lawn of Burnett Library. City workers began tearing down old buildings across Wall from city hall, to be developed into a parking area. Basketball players named All District were Cindy Clanton and Lisa Sebly of the Lady Hawks and Stephen Biddy of the Hawks. Dedication ceremonies for the Tom Burnett Memorial Library were held. More than 200 entries were judged in the annual FFA and 4-H Project Show. The youngsters then dominated the Wichita County Junior Livestock Show by placing 90 of the 179 animals in the auction. City aldermen voted to rebuild all the crossings of the railroad. All teachers in the Iowa Park school system received a one-year extension on their contracts. Fire totally destroyed a mobile home at 719 E. Park.

#### APRIL

In city and school elections, Tim Hunter won in his uncontested bid for mayor, as did the two candidates for aldermen, Bud Burch and Bud Mercer; John Sibley, Jerry Reed and Jimmy Howell were elected to the board of trustees. The 23 Study Club recognized Cathy Downes and twins Ronald and Donald Young as outstanding students of the year at Iowa Park High School. The city council voted to condemn one of the oldest business structures in the 100 block of West Park as unsafe to the public, and it was later razed by the owner. Elizabeth Gorman was elected mayor of Holliday, as were two aldermen, Linda

Willis and J.R. Franklin. Holliday High's one-act play won first place in district competition, and later advanced to state. Iowa Park High's band earned sweepstakes in UIL. competition for the third consecutive year The school's tennis team won the Dist. 5-AAA championship. A teacher in the Iowa Park school system, James Kenneth Watts, was arrested and charged with two charges of "indecency with a child." The Chamber of Commerce sponsored a consumer opinion survey, with the assistance of Dr. Jim Mallett of Texas A&M Univ. Extension Service. The city council revealed a plan to construct a civic center on a block of land purchased between Third and Fourth Streets. The annual city-wide Clean-Up Week co-sponsored by the city and Chamber was held. Three high jumpers on the IPHS track teams swept district competition when Cindy Clanton won the girls' division and Stephen Biddy and Scott Weaver earned first and second, respectively, in the boys' meet; Brett Hale won the 3200-meter race to also qualify for region. Holliday residents were shocked when Tanner's Kuntry Store was burned to the ground, Wanda's Kuntry Kitchen was another attempted arson victim and tires on police vehicles were slashed by vandals.

#### MAY

Construction work to rebuild Johnson Road was begun. The city sounded its tornado warning after spotters sighted a threatening cloud advancing from the southwest. During the heavy downpour which accompanied the cloud, an elementary student, Michael B. McCarty II, was accidently run over by a school bus he had just left in Garden Valley Addition, crossed the street and re-crossing it, sustaining leg fractures but surviving the incident. The Mule-Skinners went to a ranch between Midland and Lamesa to feed occupants of the Texas Sesquicentennial Wagon Train. A two-truck collision on US 287, just south of Gordon Lake, resulted in the death of a construction worker. Gregg Young was elected secretary of the Wichita Future Farmers of America District. Holliday FFAers Robert Parkey and David Carr tied for first high individual in farm business management in state competition held at Texas A&M Univ. Donald Young was named valedictorian and Cathy Downes salutatorian of Iowa Park High's senior class. In a dispute over payment of a water bill, the Iowa Park city council threatened to cut off service to Country Hills Mobile Home Park, but the issue was later resolved. Members of the Rotary Club and employees of Cryovac participated in the community's first "Christmas in Spring" program, doing volunteer work to improve two homes. Laura Bills was named valedictorian and Robert Parkey salutatorian of Holliday High School. Iowa Park's Optimist Club held its annual bicycle safety program for local youngsters. Stephen Biddy and Scott Weaver swept first and second, respectively, in the high jump at region and finished fourth and sixth at the state meet. Iowa Park High faculty selected Biddy and Kari Robnett "Best All Around." The Hawk baseball team won the Dist. 5-AAA championship, the first in that sport since 1975, but lost in bi-district to Merkel. Continuing the improvements to the business district appearance, Smith X-Ray had a new front and awning constructed. Top scholastic students of the Eighth Grade were Jennifer Welch and Chris Blalack.

Local residents participated in the nation-wide promotion of "Hands Across the Nation." Mrs. Howard McDowell was named Outstanding ESAer of the State. Holliday's baseball team won district and bi-district and advanced to the regional level.

### JUNE

The city council made an ordinance out of a longstanding policy, to not sell water to any new customers located outside the city limits. FFA students joined with members of the Iowa Park Garden Club to plant flowers at Burnett Library. Holliday school superintendent Dan Owen was elected to the Legislative Council of the University Interscholastic League. School trustees were informed local students scored well above the state average on the Texas Assessment of Basic Skills testing. A storm which dropped some four inches of rain also brought damage by knocking down several trees and lightening ignited a tank battery near Holliday. Police assisted a resident on South Wall to remove a three-foot snake from her bath tub. A water leak in the transmission line from Iowa Park's two lakes to the processing plant caused delay in construction of Johnson Road. Ayres Tire announced a major expansion of its facility here. Iowa Park Volunteer Fire Department held one of its more successful annual street dances. Iowa Park hosted the area Major Little League tournament. The city council approved major renovation bid for the city hall's exterior.

### JULY

Luther Shaw announced he had sold Shaw Motors, a business he had operated 31 years, to Leon Stevenson and Bill Wilson. Because of water production problems in Wichita Falls, Iowa Park residents were requested to adopt an odd-even outside watering program. A young Iowa Parkan, Ronald Joseph May Jr., was charged with hit and run after Jeff Lawson, another local man, was struck while crossing FM 369 following an event at the rodeo grounds. Cryovac manager Frank Gossett was elected to fulfull the unexpired term of Chamber president after Rip Smith resigned. Iowa Park and Holliday schools operated at less per-student costs, \$2,949 and \$2,896, than the state average of \$3,346, according to a report by the Texas Research League. The school increased its cost of collecting taxes for the city from a base of \$5,800 to \$8,500 annually. "Tom Sawyer" was the title of the first play produced by the Summer Youth Theatre of Burnett Library.

### AUGUST

City aldermen voted to have the concrete parking markers removed from the downtown business streets. Two graduated Hawk football players were named to play in post-season bowl games, Shawn Price in the Oil Bowl and Randy Boutwell in the Greenbelt Bowl. IPHS Class. of '61 held a reunion. School trustees approved a \$5.4million budget for the 1986-87 year. City workers began a 64-block pavement sealcoating project. Angela Hatfield received a 290-pound popsicle as winner of a Faith Baptist Church vacation bible school contest. Toni Lutz succeeded Stacia Brown as programs coordinator at Burnett Library,

## Scholarship receives grant


The Bertha McDonald Scholarship Fund, sponsored by the Iowa Park Athletic Alumni Association, recently was increased by \$25.





the efforts of business people and our city council!



We can see the true colors of Mark White in this move. The people that helped him become governor


time that a defeated governor has placed his staff in other jobs in the state house. All through the history of the state key staffers have been moved to head other departments in the state government.

### AN OPEN LETTER TO WICHITA VALLEY WATER SUPPLY METER HOLDERS

By now, each of you have received your ballots; please note all names of board members are listed. Since there are only 3 up for reelection, chances are you could be voting for someone who has time left. To better inform you, the 3 up for re-election are M.C. Kuykendall of Kamay, Roy Thompson of Iowa Park and D.E. Bratt of Archer City. If you're not voting for one of these 3 your vote will be wasted.

If you're interested in trying to make a change, take advantage of the line marked "other." Besides myself, I understand Mr. Ben Kirkland and Ralph Harvey are also interested in board seats. Most of our present board members are long-standing and in some ways this is bad for our corporation. If our President is restricted to 8 years in office, shouldn't our board members be?

Recently we received a card showing how much water is used for inhouse service: Commode, 5 gallons each flush; Shower, 5-10 gallons per minute; Bath, 4 1/2 gallons per inch; Top-loading washer, 30-55 gallons per load, and Cooking and drinking, 5%.

I sat down and put a pencil to it and here's what I come up with. Average family of 2 adults and 2 children: 3 flushes per person per day, 12 = 60 gallons, 2 flushes, 8 = 40 gallons; 2 showers per day, 3 minutes = 48 gallons, 2 showers, 2 minutes = 36 gallons; 2 baths per day, 3 inches = 27 gallons, 2 baths, 2 inches = 18 gallons; 6 loads laundry per week, 180:7 = 25 gallons, 3 loads per week, .7 = 13 gallons; 1 dishwasher per day = 12 gallons, everyother day = 6 gallons; cooking and drinking = 2 gallons, cooking and drinking = 1 gallon; that makes gallons per day 174 or 114.

Our minimum of \$20.00 is based on 3,000 gallons or 100 gallons per day. The average use at a realistic level is 174 gallons per day and a conservative level is 114 gallons per day. It would seem 4,500 gallons would be a more realistic and fair minimal billing amount and at the same time still encourage water conservation.

This is one of the changes I would like to work for. The only way my family could meet the 100 gallons a day (our's averages 200 gallons) is if we installed an outhouse, used disposable dishes, wore our clothes until they were stiff and bathed out of a pitcher and bowl.

January is the time for change, not June when your high bills start coming.

With so many of our people out of a job or on reduced hours, consider the following letter, then come to the January 27th meeting and ask why:

"Wichita Valley Water

Box 550

Holliday, Texas

One month ago I received my water bill, in that water bill I had a letter stating to me that you had contracted a company from San Antonio, to sandblast, and coat the Wichita Valley Water tanks. I was very upset when reading this, because there are several sandblasting and coating contractors in Wichita Falls, area. After calling your office, I ask you what the contract price was, and you told me you did not know; at that time you gave me the President of The Wichita Valley Water

Association's telephone number. On December 8, 1986, I reached Don Barton and talked with him. He told me the reason for hiring this company was because he felt they were qualified. My question to you is why you let \$116,000.00 dollar contract go with one bid. I do not understand it, and after talking to your President and your office, I still do not understand it and will never understand it. Also, after talking to your office, I find out that the \$116,000.00 dollars, was just the initial contract, they will also receive \$3,200.00 dollars per year for 15 years to come here and inspect the tanks each year and repair what might need repaired.


Your President told me, that the reason these people were hired to start with, was because of their excellent guarantee. In my opinion there is no 15 year guarantee, when the people are receiving \$3,200.00 dollars a year for 15 years, which total \$48,000.00 dollars, so that puts the total of this contract to a \$164,000.00 dollars. In my wildest dreams, I can not imagine you taking only one bid on a job of this size. I also, ask Don Barton, who was going to inspect these tanks, since I drink the water, his answer to me was our people are watching them closely. My next question to him was, are your people qualified to be coating inspectors, he had no answer for that. My next question was, were they going to run Holiday detector test and Mill gauge test on these tanks, his answer was no. This is very very unusual, these kinds of test should be made on these tanks. The price on the job seems to be to high, I believe the job could have been done locally much cheaper. I also believe there should have been someone in this area do the job, because if you have a problem, they could be there within an hour. How long would it take to come from San Antonio? I think every member on Wichita Valley Water should receive a letter from your office stating the contract price and maintenance agreement price and most important that you only took one bid. I think it would be very interesting for them to find this out, and if you do this, I believe they will be asking you the same questions I am. I live in Wichita Falls and have lived in Wichita Falls for 28 years. Our economy is not good, this is no surprise to anyone, but if we keep the money in Wichita Falls, our economy will be great in Wichita Falls, and Wichita Falls will be the good place to live that it has always been. We will be sending a copy of this letter to Harry Patterson and The Wichita Falls Times and Record News.

I appreciate your time in reading this letter, I would like to hear a response by letter or phone, but I would like to have a response from someone that can clearly explain why anyone would only take one bid on a job for \$164,000.00 dollars, that is the question here.



# Few changes noted in computing taxes

The first phase of the new tax reform law goes into effect this year. The way taxable income is computed is the biggest change most people will notice, according to a Texas Christian Univ. economist, Dr. Dick Waits.

"About 90 percent of all taxpayers don't have to worry about investment tax credits or business interests, so there should be little change in the amount of work required to finish your tax return," Waits noted. "People with money will just have to find new ways to invest. The more you try to manipulate your taxes, the more complicated they will be.'

The majority of taxpayers fill out a short form. "If a long form with itemized deductions is used,


most find their deductions are rather straightforward so there really aren't many complicated decisions to be made no matter what the changes are," Waits added.

The new tax law has been criticized because it does not address the growing national deficit. Waits said the decifit and tax reform are two different issues and need to be addressed separately.

"Taxreformwasdesperatelyneeded, but, if we tried to take care of the decifit at the same time, we'd run a serious risk of not doing a good job on either," said Waits.

All the same, the decifit will have to be addressed, and the TCU economist anticipates that higher taxes are probably in the future.

# Highlights of 1986 are reviewed

#### **Continued from page 1**

School trustees approved a 75-cent tax rate for Iowa Park. Congressman Beau Boulter met with area agriculture leaders at the Farm Bureau office to discuss farming problems. Iowa Park city budget was set at 77-cents. Jet OJ, owned by Mr. and Mrs. James "Bud" Wells became the first locally-owned horse to qualify for the All American Quarterhorse Futurity.

## SEPTEMBER

Iowa Park schools opened with only 11 more pupils than they had the first day of school in 1985, but Kidwell had an increase of 40. City employees asked that a change in insurance coverage be made. A men's slow pitch softball team, composed mostly of Cryovac employees, placed 25th among 79 teams at the Class "A" Industrial Softball Tournament held in Montgomery, Ala. A resident of Woodbriar Apartments, Bobby T. McBride, 57, was struck and killed on the westbound access road while walking at night. A telephoned bomb threat shortened the annual Whoop-T-Do by two hours. Lana Swaff was crowned homecoming queen, and the Classes of 1936 and 1946 held reunions. Specially-minted medallions were presented

Funeral services were held for Tom Corridon, first white baby born (July 11, 1889) in Iowa Park. Kevin Coffman was elected Area Four Young Farmers president. The city council suspended Police Chief Bob Dean, who later tendered his resignation. The city council learned the insurance it had taken out on its employees was not in force, eventhough the first premium had been paid. Iowa Park High's band earned a Division One rating in the UIL marching contest. New full-color brochures were acquired by the Chamber of Commerce, replacing a publication which had been in use almost 20 years. The Buffalo Chip Kickers Volksmarch Club of Wichita Falls held a 10-kilometer walk through the city, attracting more than 200 participants. High school choral department students spent an entire day cleaning up roadsides as a fund-raising project. Interested persons organized a local Future Farmers of America Booster Club, and elected Mrs. Paul Chandler as their first president. The city council changed its format for electing aldermen, from at-large to by place, as did the school board the previous year. School trustees accepted a bid of \$43,747 to repair and resurface the track at Hawk Stadium. An Iowa Park man, Kent Edward Fairchild, survived a stabbing in the stomach and his assaliant, Oscar Bethel, was jailed.

#### NOVEMBER

Iowa Park High's Mean Green Marching Machine qualified for the state UIL marching contest, and placed second. Former governor Bill Clements carried four of the five area boxes, as well as the rest of the state, in the general election. The Hawks finished in second place in the final Dist. 6-AAA standings behind Breckenridge. IPHS graduate Stan Blair, a professional opera singer, presented a program with the assistance of the A Cappella Choir. At the annual Chamber election, Frank Gossett was voted president, Robert Palmer first vice president and Kenneth Via second vice president. The Hawk Junior Varsity finished the season undefeated in district play. Sixteen members of the A Cappella Choir qualified for the Region Two choir and seven for state auditions. Roy Boutwell tendered his resignation from the school board, effective April 1, after 11 years as a trustee.

#### DECEMBER

Santa Claus made an early appearance in the community when he attended a ceremony to turn on the new decorative lights on Park Ave. Holliday's Eagles lost 35-21 to Mart in their bid for a regional championship. The Hawks lost 16-7 to Lampasas in the state quarterfinals after beating Ballinger 27-12 in bi-district, Robinson 24-0 in area and Kermit 36-14 in region. Dairy Queen was burglarized for the second time in four weeks, Workers removed the old metal tower which had stood for decades over the well on the east side of city hall. Iowa Park schools overspent revenues by \$17,000, but underspent the budget by \$384,000, according to the audit. Alan Sheffield was selected from a field of 20 applicants for the new police chief. Burt Williamson was named president of State National Bank by the board of directors. An arsonist made an unsuccessful attempt to burn out Family Hairstyles, which is housed in the old school homemaking building which more recently housed the city library.

## Doctor going to Mexico to help repair facial deformities of residents

(Editor's Note: this article is a reprint from the Dec. 23 Dallas Morning News, written by Ana Puga, about Iowa Park native Steve Watson, son of Mrs. Hoyt Watson and the late Hoyt Watson. His wife, Karen, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W.A. George.)

Dr. Stephen W. Watson has known Mexico only through his vacations. Next month the Duncanville oral surgeon will visit a Mexican city famous for its crafts -- not to shop, but to help repair the facial deformities of about 50 rural residents.

"It should be something totally different," he said. "I've never done anything like this before."

Watson will join a sevenmember U.S. medical team that will spend Jan. 17-24 in Puebla, Mexico's third-largest city. The patients will be taken to Puebla, which is about 50 miles south of Mexico City, from rural areas by Carita, an international Catholic group, said Dr. Thomas S.

Jeter, the trip's organizer.

Jeter, a San Angelo oral surgeon, said he led his first team of phsicians to Mexico in 1980 because he wanted to "help people who are underprivileged and perform a type of surgery that I think is very exciting."

"One of our oldest patients last year was 65 and had an unrepaired cleft -- a hole in his face," Jeter said. "That is almost unheard of in this country."

Though Mexican surgeons know the techniques necessary to repair facial deformities, there are too few doctors in rural areas, Jeter said.

The majority of the patients Jeter's team will treat suffer from cleft lips or cleft palates, which Watson said required "an artistic feel" to repair.

A cleft lip results when one side of a person's lip grows but the other

#### nose, he said.

Patients with cleft lips or cleft palates suffer from an unsightly deformity and often have trouble speaking, eating or breathing.

Corrective surgery requires "cutting very precisely, rearranging the lip, face and nose tissue, then stitching it up," Watson said.
