Nov. 18. The other test was planted on Oct. 18 on County Line Road by the Lalk Brothers from Electra. The Lalk plot had 24 varieties and the Daume plot had 25 varieties.
Twenty-three varieties were the same with the exception of triticale and elbon rye at the Daume plot and Durum wheat at the Lalk plot.
