Club has Christmas party

The magic of Christmas was beautifully demonstrated in decorations at the home of Mrs. Howard Marlar Thursday afternoon where the 25 Study Club met for the annual Christmas party and program. Mrs. Earle Denny was the co-hostess.

Everything from the doorniece at the front entrance on through the house—the breathtaking flocked tree in the den, manger scene, spicy fragrance of evergreen boughs, holly, red velvet bows, candy canes, illumination of candles, and recorded Christmas music, these and many more symbols, gave expression to the joy of the season and true spirit of Christmas.

Miss Ethyle Kidwell was the leader for the program entitled "Christmas in Texas." It was noted that the early settlers of Texas took little, if any, notice of Christmas, but by 1850 it had become an event for family celebration with feasting and fellowship.

Mrs. B.G. House expressed the true meaning of Christmas in an original song, "The Birthday of the King," to introduce the program.

Five members of the club, Miss Betty Meadows, Mrs. Riley Thompson, Mrs. China B. Smith, Mrs. Sam Hill and Mrs. Denny formed a symposium to describe "Christmas Past and Modern Symbols."

Miss Meadows discussed "Jewish Festival Lights—the Hanukkah, a Jewish holiday commemorating the rededication of the Temple of Jerusalem after its defilement by Syria.

Mrs. Thompson's topic was "Tree Ornaments, Old and New." In the first category, she mentioned popcorn, cranberries, apples, candles, which were replaced by electric lights in 1907. She stood by Mrs. Marlar's tree which reflected some of the prettiest modern ornaments that can be purchased at stores or created by those who have ingenuity and imagination.

Mrs. Smith gave an impressive talk on "Christmas Art," both old and modern. She enhanced interest with works of artists from the 14th to 17th centuries that are now in famous art galleries in the U.S. and foreign cities. Some of the subjects that gave expression to Christmas were The Annunciation, Magi, Mother and Child, and Madonna of the Rock. She showed children's ideas of

Christmas through paintings of young boys in India and Nigeria, a six-year-old Dutch girl, and Christmas cards designed by children at M.D. Anderson Hospital. She closed with "The Legend of the Wind."

Mrs. Hill discussed the "Evergreen Tree," mentioning the Douglas fir, pine and spruce that stand for symbols of the American family. She told when the community tree became a custom in the nation and described the spectacular beauty of the trees in Rockefeller Plaza and on the White House lawn.

Mrs. Denny read "The Christmas Tree" by C. Day Lewis, a contemporary English poet, critic and novelist, to conclude the program.

During the social hour, Mrs. Keith Auld, president, distributed gifts from under the tree that had been placed there by members for exchange, and she and Mrs. C.L. Metz assisted the hostesses with duties of serving.

In keeping with one of the club's projects, each member brought a monetary gift for Girlstown, USA.

The door to the bedroom kept opening about every 30 minutes, and I'd set up in my pallet to see if it was Santa Claus coming. But it wasn't. Each time it was Mom, explaining she thought she heard me call.

The next morning, Mom looked up from her pillow as I passed through the middle room of the three-room house, which served as my parents' bedroom, and told me Santa had left my gift on the dining table because he didn't want to awaken me.

I had slept by the little table on which we had our Christmas tree, and had my mind made up to greet Saint Nick as he made his Christmas Eve visit.

Sure enough, right there on the table where she said it would be. My

very first Christmas present: a BB gun.

Oh, we had exchanged gifts Christmas Eve. All three of us had gone to Close Drug Store, where they had brown paper sacks in a big box with surprise items. For a quarter, we could select any one we wanted.

I really don't remember what I was given, but my grab bag draw was for Mom. It was a six-inch silver tray, and she beamed as I handed it to her.

That was Christmas, 1937.

Sure, I had a stocking lying on the table under the tree, and it was full. I got some pecans, some Brazil nuts, an orange, apple and a couple of bananas.

It was the best Christmas I'd ever had. In fact, it was the first Christmas I could remember, even if I was in the

second grade.

The roasted chicken meal, complete with sweet potatoes, dressing and a couple of other things was a meal fit for a king.

Christmas in those days was far different from what we celebrate these days. It had to be. There was no money and 1937 was the peak of the Great Depression.

But I suppose it was the best I ever knew as a child. Christmas, in those days and now, was special. It was a time the family was together, for gift-giving, and remembering it as Jesus' birth date.

I hope, for each of you, this Christmas means as much as my first Christmas. . . one of joy and one you'll never forget.

Holiday driving safety advised Library moving Thursday; Jan. 2 opening scheduled

"Christmas is a joyous time of the year, many families only get together once a year, so Christmas is a very special time for them," stated Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

"For some, their joy will be shattered by a traffic accident," he stated. Last year over 40 people lost their lives in traffic accidents during the Christmas holidays, and 25 of these were under 26 years of age.

Almost 98 percent of those killed last year were not wearing a seat belt. "Parents and other responsible persons need to set a better example and teach their children that safety restraints will help them to survive a crash," he said. "It only takes two or three seconds to buckle a seat belt, but those seconds could be the difference between joy and sadness at Christmas," Major Cawthon stated.

"Our troopers will be away from their families, working the highways trying to make them safe for all people to travel, and the public sure could help by observing all traffic laws and buckling up for safety during the holidays," Major Cawthon suggested.

"If all goes well, we hope to have it open Jan. 2," City Administrator James Barrington said Monday morning when asked the progress of moving into the Tom Burnett Memorial Library.

Burnett landmark. The moving of books and large fixtures is to take place Thursday, Barrington said.

The library, which has been housed some 14 years in the old school home economics building, has been closed since Nov. 1 to prepare for the move.

A formal dedication ceremony is planned in the spring.

Wichita County has a new county judge, but it's not Iowa Park Mayor Tim Hunter.

Wichita Falls attorney Nick Gipson was chosen by commissioner's court Friday from a field of eight applicants. His appointment extends until November, but he will have to

run in the May party primaries in order to make the general election.

Hunter submitted his application last Tuesday, the same day Judge Tom Baucus resigned so he could be considered for appointment to the county's second court-at-law judgeship.


