City to stop selling water outside town

The city council decided Monday

The council adopted a policy some eight years ago to reject any request for water to property adjoining the city, unless it was annexed.

Council members were to adopt a resolution concerning sales of water outside the city during Monday's meeting, but decided rather to draft an ordinance instead.

The ordinance, which would prohibit sale of water to anyone outside the city, except to those promised water in return for easements when

the transmission line was built from Wichita Falls, is to be on the next meeting agenda.

Mayor Tim Hunter asknowledged the city receives one or more request for water to a residence outside the city weekly.

He said, "We have to serve the citizens of the city. That is our obligation, and we can get into a situation in the future where we can't, if we continue the way we're going."

Those residents now purchasing water outside the city would continue to be served, council members observed.

No action was taken as a result of the executive session, and the council made quick work of the rest of its agenda.

Members approved the purchase of a tractor/loader for the sewer plant, at a bid price of \$8,970.

Also approved was the sale of the old animal control pickup, for which Steve Lowe offered \$795.

The drainage of standing water on Colorado, next to B&R Thriftway, received attention. The subject was a carryover from the council's last meeting.

The city's engineer and public works director both suggested a gravel fill of the low, asphalt-covered area would be the least expensive solution.

Projected to cost \$2,500, aldermen approved a proposal that the city pay half the cost and the land owner, James Huff, pay the balance, and the city maintain the area in the future.

Also approved was the lowest of three bids to repair a city pickup that was involved in a recent accident in Wichita Falls.

Cost of the repair is \$1,316.

AREA OIL & GAS NEWS

Two new producers have been brought on line in the Wichita Regular Field, with J&I Oil as the operator.

The wells are designated as the 24-A and 25-A Mrs. Noble Gray, located 4.3 miles southeast and 4.3 miles southwest of Burkburnett, respectively. The wells are located in the DL&C Survey, A-616.

They indicated potential to pump oil at the combined rate of 24 barrels per day. Total drilling dpeths were 1,312 and 1,352 feed, respectively. Production will be from perforations in the Cisco Sand Formation, ranging from 1,028 to 1,038 feet into the wellbore.

The 24-A well is located 750 feet from the north line and 122 feet from the west line of the lease.

Drillsite for the 25-A well is 750 feet from the north line and 122 feet from the east line of the lease.

At a location 4.5 miles southeast of Burkburnett, Gene Robertson Oil has finaled a new oil producer in the Wichita Regular Field.

The well is designated as the No. 72 J.E. Roller, pumping 21 barrels of oil per day.

Location is in an 84-acre lease in the C. Larbaletrier Survey, A-370. Bottomed at 1,262 feet, the well will produce from perforations in the Thomas Formation, 1,206 to 1,222 feet into the wellbore.

The well is situated approximately 200 feet from the west line of the lease.

Daily potential of one barrel of oil, plus 50 barrels of water was posted with the Railroad Commission. The well went to a 1,307-ft. bottom, and production will be from perforations in the Thomas Sand Formation, 1,265 to 1,270 feet into the wellbore.

Drillsite is 850 feet from the north line and 150 feet from the east line of the lease.

Two new developmental wells are planned in Wichita County by Sage Energy of Midland.

The wells will be drilled in the K-M-A Field. They are designated as the No. 102 First National Waterflood Unit and the No. 360 KMA Southwest Waterflood Unit. Flusche Supply of Electra has revealed plans to drill two 950-ft. developmental wells in the Wichita Regular Field. The wells will be known as the Nos. 33 & 34 Flusche Supply Inc., with drillsites three miles east-southeast of Electra in the H&GN Survey, Blk. 23.

Tri Core Oil & Gas of Irving is planning to drill two new developmental wells in the Wichita Regular Field.

The Nos. 4 & 5 Butts will be lcoated 4.5 miles southwest of Burkburnett. Drillsites are in a 144acre lease in the DR&K Survey, A-714. The No. 4 well is projected to 2,000-ft. total depth, while the No. 5 well is projected to 1,999-ft. maximum depth.

The No. 4 well will be drilled 2,433 feet from the north line and 1,089 feet from the east line of the lease.

Drillsite for the No. 5 well is 2,253 feet from the north line and 150 feet form the east line of the lease.

Burk Royalty has hung the "dry hole" tag on the No. 1 Boger.

It was a wildcat try in Wilbarger County, five miles northwest of Oklaunion. Drillsite was in a 640acre lease in the H&TC Survey, A-152.

The well was spudded January 3, and bottomed at 8,121 feet with no commercial prospects.

Drillsite was 9,326 feet from the south line and 467 feet from the west line of the lease.

Drillsite has been staked for the No. 1 Cato "A", an 8,100-ft. wildcat well in Hardeman County.

The well will be located seven miles south of Medicine Mounds. Drillsite is in a 640-acre lease in the

H&TC Survey, A-1522. Paul DeCleva Inc. of Wichita

Falls is the operator. The well will be drilled 2,530

feet from the south line and 1,151 feet from the west line of the lease.

Eagles win region


