Local man arrested on hit-run charge

A 19-year-old Iowa Park resident has been arrested and jailed on a charge of hit and run after an incident shortly after midnight on FM 369 near the rodeo arena.

Ronald Joseph May Jr. was charged by the Department of Public Safety with "failure to stop and render aid," a third degree felony.

May is alleged to have confessed to being the driver of a small brown automobile that struck Jeff Lawson as he and Becky Hankins were attempting to walk across 369 about 12:40 a.m. Sunday.

Lawson and Hankins, also local residents, had been to the Young Farmers' tractor pull and dance which followed.

They were attempting to return to Lawson's car, which was parked

near the river bridge, and at the same time May was driving south on 369, with two Iowa Park juveniles as passengers.

According to a DPS spokesman, May saw the couple and attempted to avoid them. At the same time, Lawson took hold of Miss Hankins' and pushed her out of the car's path.

However, the right side of the vehicle struck Lawson. He suffered a compound leg fracture and numerous bruises.

Lawson is credited with possibly saving his companion's life.

The car, observed by witnesses, stopped on the side of the road, and then drove off at a high rate of speed.

Investigators found a large amount of glass on the pavement, and determined it had come from a side window of the car.

Sunday evening both Wichita Falls television stations asked for help from the public and described the vehicle, pointing out the side window was missing.

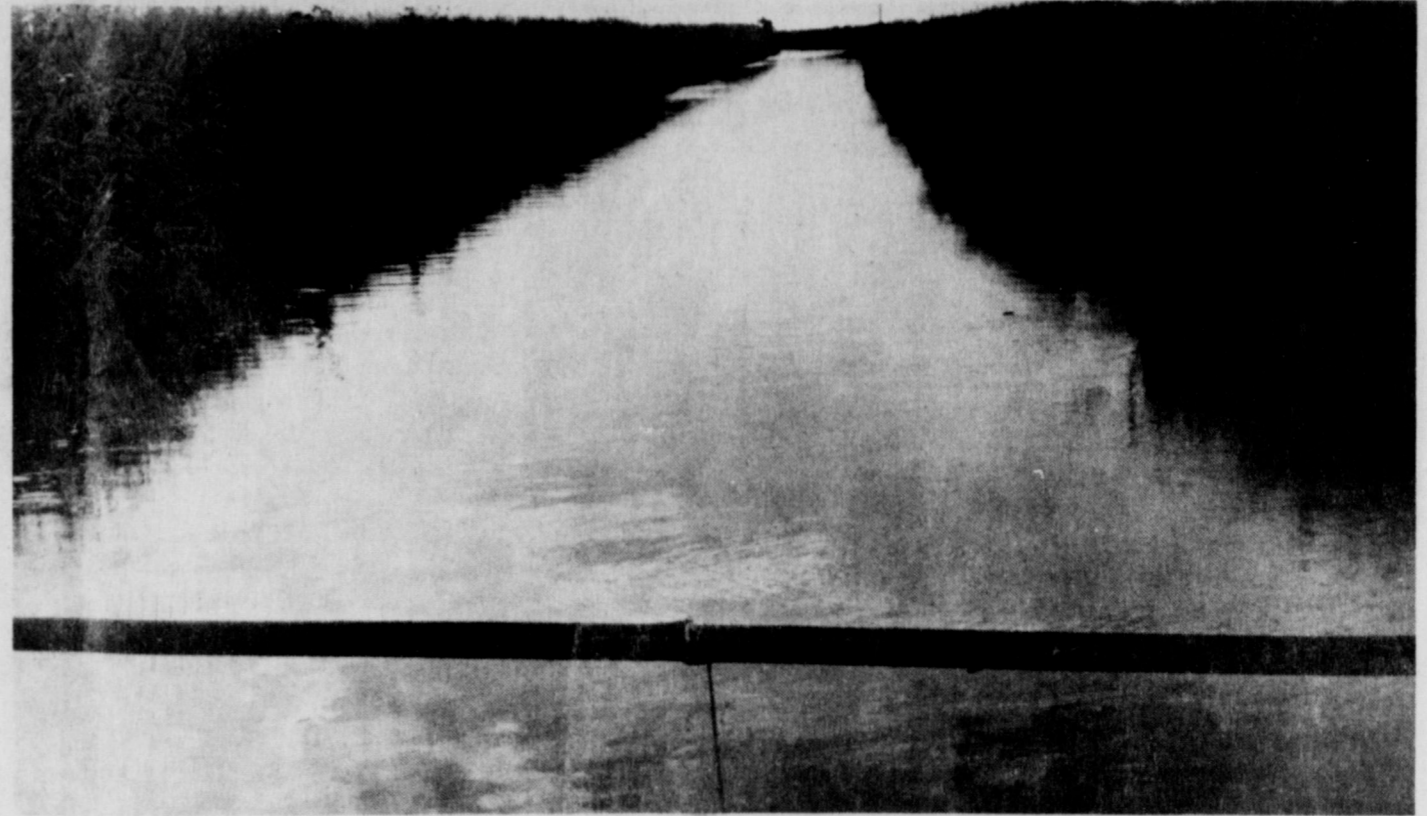
The DPS spokesman said a number of telephone calls were received following the telecast, and one of them "sounded most promising."

Troopers found the car here, had it impounded and studied. They then, with the assistance of Iowa Park officers, arrested May, who was employed by a local drive-in.

May was jailed under a bond of \$4,500.

He faces a possible two to 10 years imprisonment and/or a \$5,000 fine, if found guilty in court.

Lawson reportedly will have to undergo surgery on his leg.

Odd-even watering plan requested of residents

Iowa Park residents have been asked by city authorities to curtail outside watering use.

Residents are asked to do outside watering on odd or even days, depending on their house numbers being odd or even.

The curtailment is expected to extend another five weeks.

The Wichita Falls water department requested all residents of that city, and all communities and organ-

izations that purchase water from the city, to voluntarily cut back on consumption.

According to Mike Price, Iowa Park public works director, Wichita Falls' Cypress Street water plant does not have the ability to filter the amount of water being demanded from the facility.

Price said a second shift has been added at the Iowa Park treatment plant on weekends, in an effort to produce more water locally.

Until this week, Iowa Parkans have been using about two-million gallons of water daily, Price said.

Outside watering should be on odd-numbered days if a home's address ends on an odd number (today's number is the 24th, an even number, and persons whose address ends in an even number can water today).

This is the same formula that has been used here during curtailment periods in the past.

Council hearing for unexpected funds

Eventhough City Administrator James Barrington doesn't believe the city will receive federal revenue sharing funds during the next fiscal year, he is still scheduling the required public hearings.

The first of two hearings will be held when the city council meets at 7 p.m. Monday, according to the agenda prepared early this week.

Barrington explained, in his note to council members, "I really do not expect any revenue sharing money during FY (fiscal year) 87, but if it

does come, we will have to have the two public hearings on its usage before we will have complied with the requirements to spend it."

Also on the agenda, the council will hear a request by Jerry Nell who wants to lease the land on the northwest corner of Fourth and West Highway.

The city had earlier approved leasing the land to Harold Bartow, but that agreement has been reportedly terminated because terms of time in which construction was to

begin were not met.

The council will be asked to appoint Dan Tompkins to serve temporarily as municipal court judge in the absence of G.A. Benesh.

Other items on the agenda include:

At midnight Friday, a female told police she had been sexually assaulted at 306 S. Yosemite, the same address where Bush had been arrested earlier the same day.

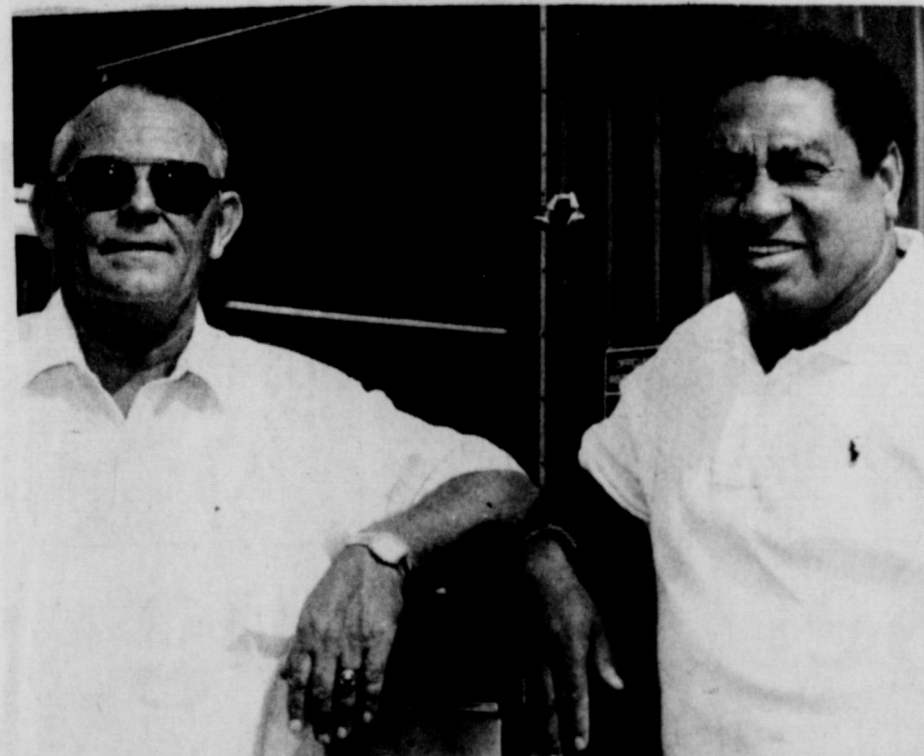
No charges have yet been filed in that case.

Shaw sells dealership

Shaw Motor Co. became Park Ford, effective Tuesday.

When Luther Shaw locked his office doors at 6 p.m. Monday, he ended a career of selling automobiles that was begun in 1937.

Shaw had operated his business here 31 years, longer than any other retail store under the same ownership.

New owners are Leon Stevenson, who becomes the first black man in the history of Iowa Park to own a business here, and Bill Wilson, who has been sales manager at the dealership the past seven years.

There will be no changes in

personnel at the agency. Other than extending sales hours three hours on Saturdays, until 5 p.m., all other policies will also remain the same, Wilson said.

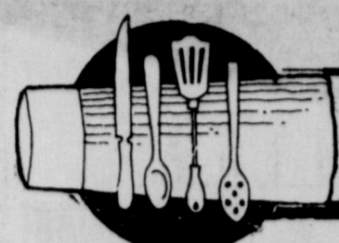
For Stevenson, 39, this will be his first dealership. He said he had owned several small businesses before, but for the past two years, he has been in a General Motors Corp. dealership training program at Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Originally from DeQuincy, La., which is about 17 miles from Texas, Stevenson was asked thoughts about being Iowa Park's first black

Cook of the Week

Someone has said "A full cooky jar makes a home homey." Adults cherish fond memories of the cooky jars in mother's and grandmothers' homes and know what it means to their own children to have a full cooky jar.

There are so many different kinds of recipes for cookies today, and one of the favorite seems to be the oatmeal cookie or one that calls for the use of oatmeal. Karen (Mrs. Jerry) Spruiell shares her Cow Chip Cookies recipe with us today that calls for two cups of oatmeal.

The American Heritage Dictionary defines oatmeal as meal made from oats, ground oats or a porridge made from rolled or ground oats.

The oat is a cereal grass widely cultivated for its edible seeds. It is described in Foods by Waverly Root as the "Horatio Alger hero of cereals."

There is some question as to where it originated from, but oats have played an important role in human nutrition as far back as history can reach. It seems that they were being grown in Germany, Denmark and Switzerland in 1000 B.C. The ancient Romans disdained them, but the Greeks had a dessert called plakous, a cake of oat, flour, cheese and honey.

In many parts of the world, the oats have played an important role in human diet, particularly in poor countries and in times of dearth. An interesting use for oatmeal in medieval times was that of absorbing salt from heavily salted foods by hanging a muslin bag of it in the kettle where the food was being boiled. When the bag was removed, a great deal of salt was with it.

In the United States, oatmeal has increased in consumption since early in the century. It is an important breakfast food and one of the main ingredients in cookies.

Mrs. Spruiell, the former Karen Owens, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gene Owens, was graduated from Iowa Park High School and from Wharton Junior College with a degree in dental hygiene. She is currently working part-time for Dr. Richard Carver.

She and her husband, Jerry, who

is assistant manager for Thompson Tool Co. are members of the First United Methodist Church where they are directors of the junior high MYF. They are also members of the Iowa Park High School Alumni Athletic Association. They have two sons, Mitchell, five years old and Trenton, 18 months old. Karen enjoys swimming and water skiing.

COW CHIP COOKIES

1 cup oleo
1 cup shortening (melted)
2 cups brown sugar
2 cups white sugar
4 eggs
2 tsp. vanilla
4 cups flour
2 tsp. soda
1 cup nuts
2 tsp. baking powder
2 cups oatmeal
2 cups Post Toasties
1-16 oz. pkg. chocolate chips
Cream oleo, shortening, brown sugar and white sugar. Add eggs and vanilla, then add flour, baking powder and soda. Stir in oatmeal, Post Toasties, chocolate chips and nuts.

Makes about 18 dozen "normal" size cookies or you can make them cow chip size and make less (14 doz. with Tbsp). Bake 10-12 minutes at 350 degrees.

BAKER'S HELPER

1 cup cooking oil
1 cup flour
1 cup Crisco shortening
Put into small mixing bowl and mix until smooth. Store in any covered bowl in refrigerator. Use anywhere you need a greased or greased and floured surface.

FROZEN FRUIT SALAD

2 cups Cool Whip
1/2 pint sour cream
2 Tbsp. lemon juice
3/4 cup sugar
1 large can crushed pineapple, drained
3-4 large bananas, mashed
1/4 cup chopped maraschino cherries
1 cup pecans
Mix all together and freeze 24 hours.

1 lb. ground beef
1/4 cup chopped onion
1-1 5/8 oz. envelope spaghetti mix

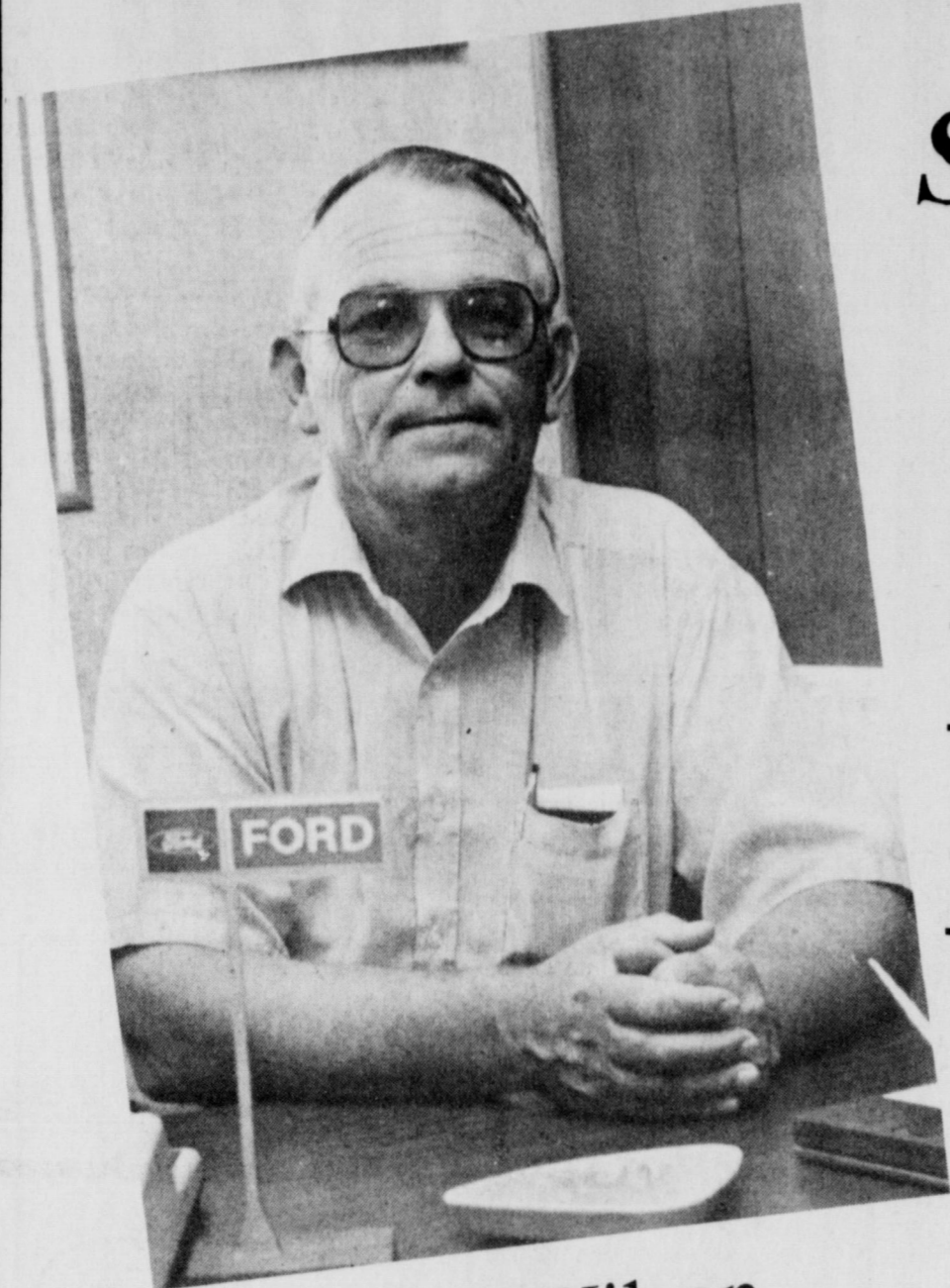

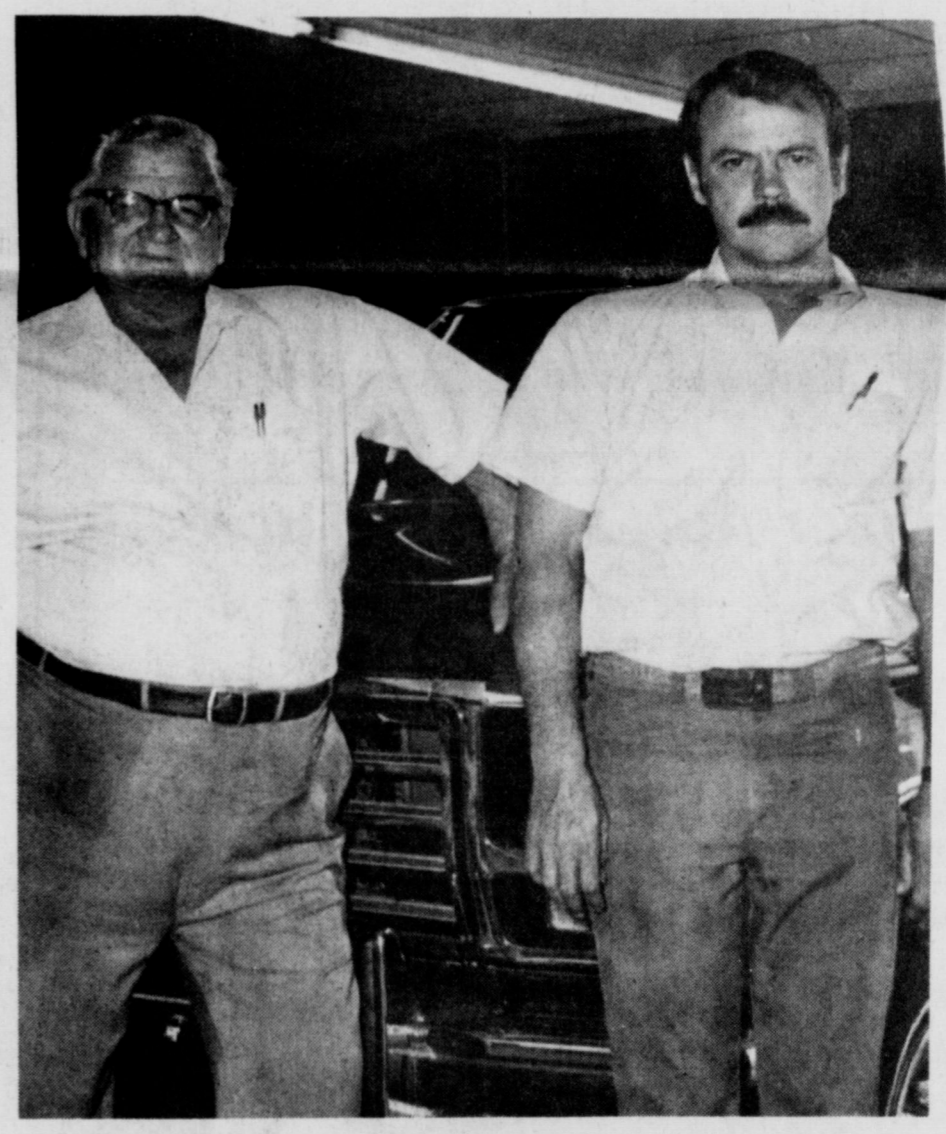

businessman.

He said, "It's a unique opportunity. When I started looking at the community, I quickly became aware there were no black businessmen. But I feel if I present myself as a good businessman, it shouldn't make any difference.

"I had at least 15 other places where I could have gone into business, but this agency is a good facility, has a good history and good profit. It's one in which I can come in and grow with it.

"Also I met Bill (Wilson), and felt I could gain a lot by associating with him," he said.

Stephenson and his wife, Teddie, have a daughter, Leondria, who was graduated in May from high school and will enroll in Spelman College at Atlanta, Ga. this fall.

The couple has temporarily rented an apartment in Wichita Falls.

Wilson, 54, has been in the automobile business 17 years, 10 of those in Iowa Park. He has worked seven years for Shaw Motor Co.

He said his home in Wichita Falls is listed for sale, and he plans to move here with his wife, Iris, as soon as it is sold. They lived here from 1969 through 1971.

A native of Belton, Wilson was graduated from Salado High School. The Wilsons have three grown children.

Shaw began selling Fords in Lawton, Okla. in 1937. He had the Nash and Packard dealership seven and a half years in Wichita Falls, and had been in business here 31 years.

He remodeled the old ice house, at the corner of Yosemite and West Highway, and occupied it until he built the present building in 1972.

He recalled when he got the dealership here, there were 21 other applicants seeking the Iowa Park location. "But I got it, and Iowa Park has been good to us," he said.

Shaw will continue to be active in Wichita Leasing, as he has been since 1957.

He said he and his wife, Bobbie, plan to continue living in Iowa Park. Other than his work with his leasing firm and some traveling, he said he has no other plans for the future.

Recalling how he got involved in the car-selling business, Shaw said he had a job on the newspaper at Lawton. The Ford dealer there asked him if he wanted to sell cars part-time and on commission.

As I See It....

Why do you think the governor called for the special legislative session to begin Aug. 6, and not sooner?

I think I can tell you. That's as early as the workers can complete the laying of new carpet in the House side. Any sooner and the representatives would have to meet in a theater somewhere else in Austin.

Seems odd, doesn't it. That when the state is in such a financial hole that a special session has to be held, we still have enough money to put down new carpet in the capital.

A question I expect to ask some member of the legislature is: What has increased state expenses so much since the mid 1970s, when the price

of crude oil was about \$3?

School districts in areas where oil has been a significant tax base may well be in trouble this year, if they don't pad their budgets.

I think there's going to be a big shortfall in collections.

The problem? Oil was valued at \$22 to \$23 per barrel January 1. That is the value that goes on the district's tax rolls.

But oil for the last several months since January has been selling from \$11 to \$13, and producers obviously are not making the money they were in January.

Having seen what's been happening in the business since January, with producers either shutting down their wells or laying off help, or some even going out of business themselves, I don't see any way the tax collectors of school districts are

going to come close to their normal collection percentages.

And since budgets are projections of expenditures, based on anticipated revenues, oil producing school districts are going to come up short in funds for the 1986-87 year.

As I've pointed out in the past when I'm on this subject, I'm not trying to preach gloom and doom. I'm just telling it as I see it.

The meeting Monday evening was held at the church and hosted by Mrs. McKinnon and Mrs. Blalock. Sixteen members were present.

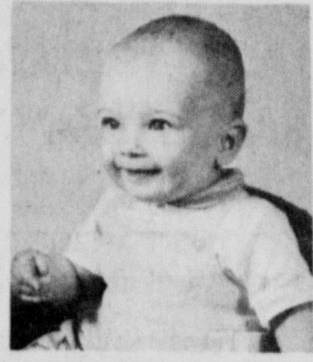


