The second grade averages 22 pupils for each of the six teachers. Kindergarten, by attending half day
classes, is averaging 18 pupils per teacher, with 145 students and four teachers.
The school estimates nine teachers will be required for the second grade next year, and seven teache handie the
Kidwell's enrollment of 469 is 39 pupils over the 430 reported Nov. 14, 1985.
Other campus enrollments report-
ford, down one from last year; 401 at junior high, no change, and 534 at high school, up eight.
Overall enrollment is 1,808 . In other business, trustees accept-
