Barrington tells past, future improvements of Iowa Park

James Barrington, city administrator, presented a slide show with narration for the Evening Lions Club Tuesday. The program showed some of the things that have happened and are happening at the present time to improve and beautify the city. He also discussed some future plans that the city has for projects that will not only benefit the present residents but will also be an incentive for others to move here.

Some of the slides showed the improvements that had been made at Gordon Lake, improvements to be made at Lake Iowa Park and Buffalo Lake, renovation of the city hall and beautifi-

cation of the park behind it. He showed the new Chamber of Commerce building, and trap club house built on city grounds. He said that the city had organized the Sand Volleyball League to provide recreation for adults as he discussed the varied recreational activities for young people. Barrington showed the first phase of the new recreation center under construction and the paving project on Colorado Street.

To enhance interest, he showed pictures of the construction work that is being done at all of the schools, and the current work project of the Texas Highway Department on West Highway.

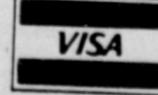

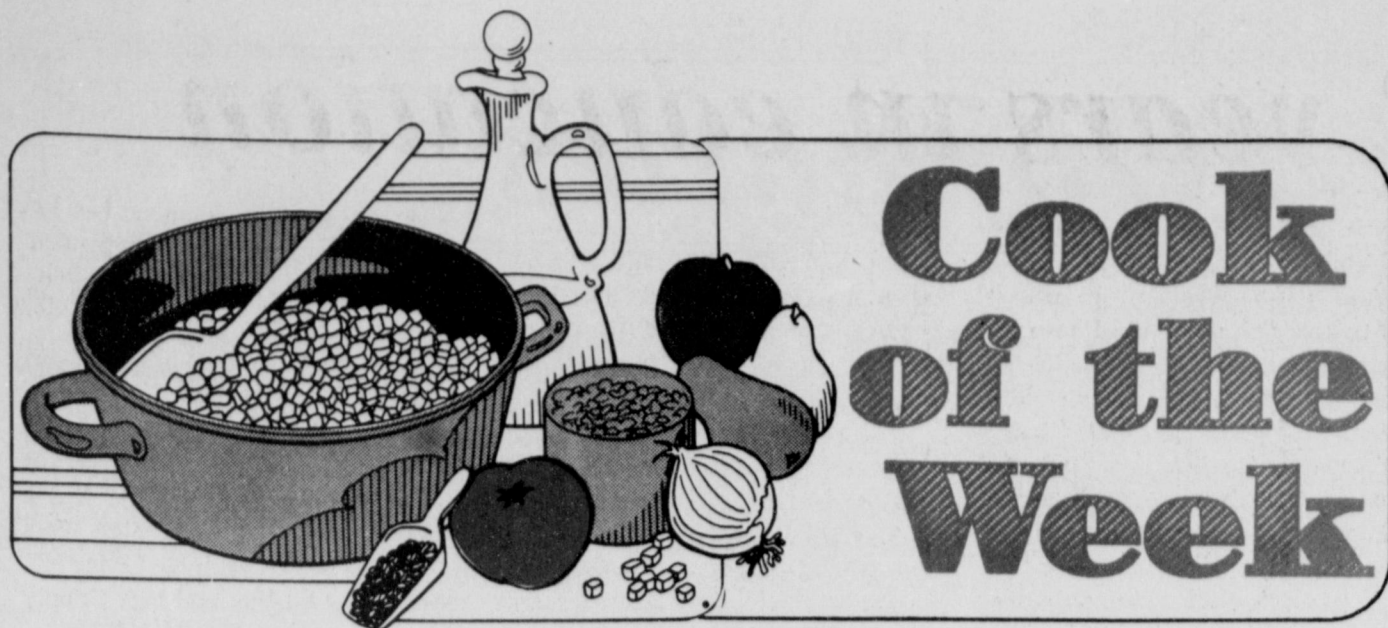

Brian, who is eight years old, will be in the third grade at Bradford Elementary School. He likes to swim, and has been enjoying the family's backyard pool this summer.

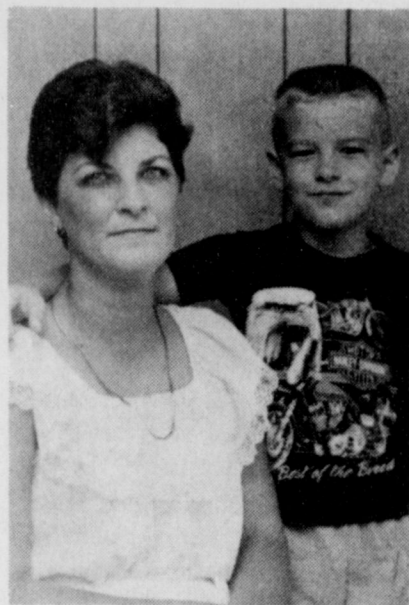
The couple's oldest daughter, Lisa, is married and lives in Temple. She is the mother of their 20-month-old grandson, Christopher.

The recipes she submitted are family favorites, and are sure to become favorites of the *Leader* readers. Mary said that Wayne's favorite is the recipe for "Baked Apples."



Mrs. Wayne Parsons

1 Tbsp. margarine
1 can cream of celery soup
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 baking chicken (cut up)

Bake chicken in 350 degree oven until tender. Heat water until at rolling boil; add margarine and rice; cover rice for 10 minutes (no heat). In sauce pan, mix cream of celery and cream of mushroom soup with 1 can water. When soup is hot, cover bottom of large bowl with rice; lay chicken parts over rice, and cover with soup mixture. Serve with any vegetable you like and a salad.

MEATBALLS IN SWEET AND SOUR SAUCE

1 1/4 lbs. hamburger meat (lean)
1 egg beaten
1/4 cup milk
1 slice bread (broken into small pieces)
1 tsp. garlic salt
Handful of minced onions
1 tsp. chili powder

In medium size bowl, mix beaten egg, milk, bread, garlic salt, onions, chili powder and then add meat and mix together. Form medium size balls with mixture. In large skillet add just enough grease to cover bottom of pan. When grease is hot, add the meatballs and cook until done.

SAUCE

2 Tbsps. flour
1 cup ketchup
1 tsp. vinegar
Worcestershire sauce (few squirts)
1 Tbsps. sugar
4 cups hot water

With remaining grease in skillet, add flour and brown until mixture looks as if it is going to burn. Add water until mixture is of gravy consistency. Add ketchup, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce and sugar. Cook until gravy is as thick

as you like it. (If mixture tastes too vinegary, add more sugar). Remove from heat and place meatballs into gravy mixture.

BANANA PUDDING

2 cups sugar
1 Tbsp. flour (heaping)
2 1/2 cups milk
1 tsp. vanilla extract
2 eggs, beaten
5 bananas, mashed
Vanilla wafers

In medium sauce pan, mix sugar, flour, milk and eggs until smooth. Cook over low heat until mixture thickens like pudding. Remove from heat and add vanilla and bananas. Mix until smooth. In large bowl, place a layer of banana pudding then cover with wafers, continue this method until all pudding is gone. Cover top layer of pudding with wafers. Eat hot or place in ice box and eat cold.

BAKED APPLES

8 Winesap apples
1/2 cup sugar
2 tsp. cinnamon
2 tsp. nutmeg
1/2 cup water
1 med. size bag red hots

Cut apples into halves and core. Place apples (skin side down) into a large skillet. Cover apples with sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg. Cover bottom of skillet with water. Pour red hots over each apple and the remaining red hots into skillet. Cook over low heat about 1

hour. About half way through cooking time, turn apples over and finish cooking. Serve hot with whipped cream.

WHIPPED CREAM

1/2 pint whipping cream
4 Tbsp. sugar
1 tsp. vanilla extract

Pour whipping cream into large bowl and beat on high speed until soft peaks form. Add sugar and vanilla extract and mix with spoon. Spoon over each bowl of apples.

COOKED CABBAGE

1 head cabbage
1/2 pint whipping cream
2 Tbsps. margarine

Cut cabbage into 4 quarters and cover, in large pan, with water. Cook cabbage until tender. Drain water and slice cabbage into small pieces. Add whipping cream and margarine and heat over low heat until hot. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

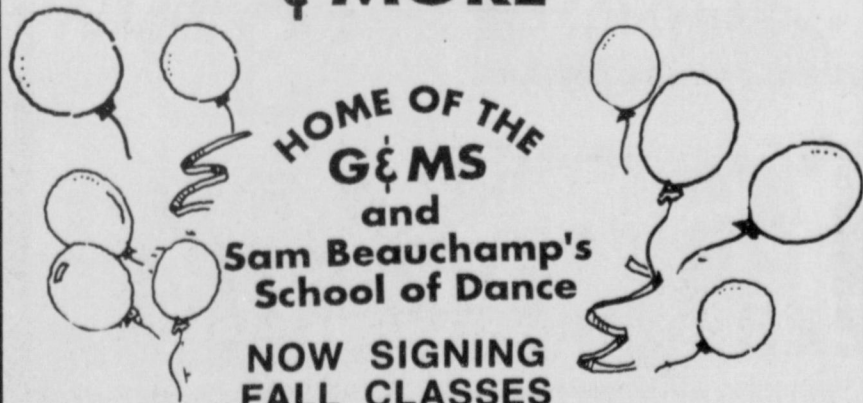

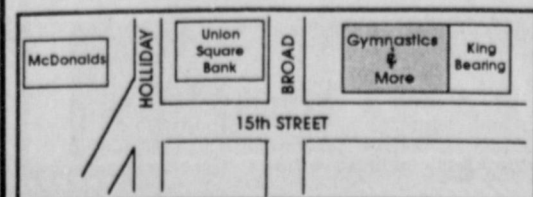

AREA OIL & GAS NEWS

Operating out of Midland, Atapco Inc., has driven stake for the No. 114 Reilly in the Wichita Regular Field, four miles west of Burkburnett. It will be a 1,750-ft. test with drill site in the Robert S. Killough Survey A-714.

Terco Energy of Abilene has filed for permit to drill the No. 2 King-Shallow "T" in the Wichita Regular Field. The lease is about two miles northwest of Valley View in the Moses Roberts Survey A-246. Total depth is projected to 500 feet.

A 2,000-ft. developmental well is planned in the Wichita Regular Field by Tom Swanson, independent operator from Electra. It will be known as the No. 67 Burnett "C." Location is in the T&NORR Survey A-316.

A depleted oiler has been plugged and abandoned in the K-M-A Field, Wichita County, by Marshall Energy Inc. of Dallas. Designated as the No. 34 Moncrief-Munger Unit, it was in a lease in block 30 of the KWVFL Subdivision, about one mile north of Kamay. Total depth was 3,863 feet.

Landrum West Inc. of Burkburnett has staked drillsite for a 1,999-ft. developmental venture in the Wilbarger Field, 10 miles south of Vernon. Designated as the No. 4 Andrews "L" it is in the H&TCRR Survey A-904. Location is 150 feet from the east line and 1,617 feet from the south line of the survey.

The No. 5 Mulloy, a shallow developmental bid, is scheduled for spudding in the Wilbarger Field, about three miles northwest of Electra. Carrying permit for 700 feet of hole making, the well is in the M.M. McLaren Survey A-624. Prince Brothers Drilling of Electra will be the operator. Location is 700 feet from the west line and 500 feet from the south line of the survey.

Two Foard County wildcats are planned by Gunn Oil Co. of Wichita Falls. Both located about 2.5 miles northeast of Thalia, the wells are designated as the No. 1 J.W. Coufal "A" and No. 1 John Matus Jr. They are located in the H&TCRR survey A-979 and A-

306, respectively. Total drilling depths are projected to 4,900 and 4,500 feet, respectively.

The same operator is planning a 4,000-ft. developmental well in the Foard County Regular Field. It will be known as the No. 1 John Matus Estate and is located 2.5 miles northeast of Thalia in the H&TCRR Survey A-306.

Prince Brothers Drilling of Electra has staked location for the No. 5 Mulloy, a developmental bid in the Wilbarger Regular Field, three miles northwest of Electra. It will carry authority for

700 feet of hole, with drillsite in the M. M. McLaren Survey A-624. It is 700 feet from the west line and 500 feet from the south line of the survey.

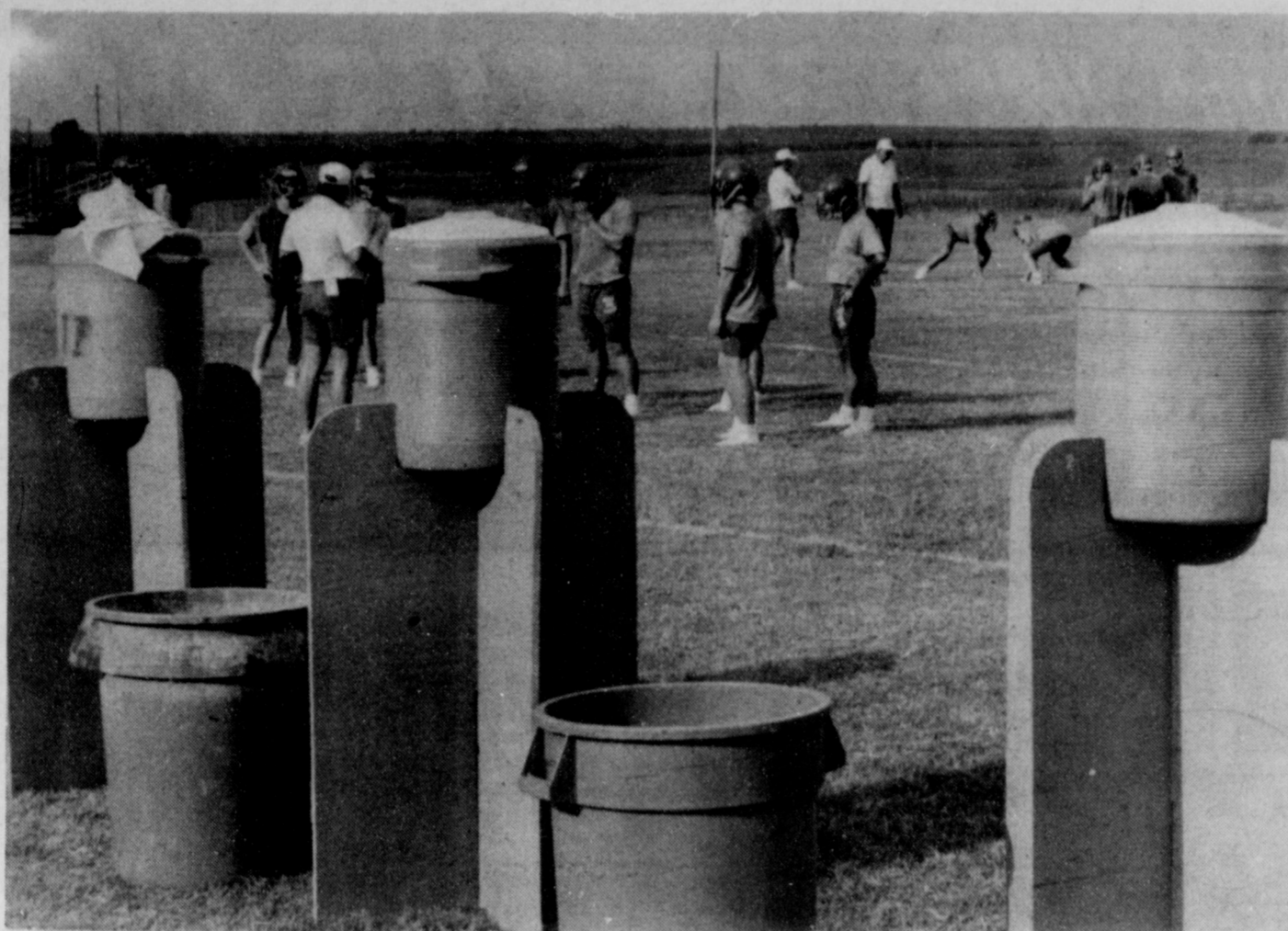
