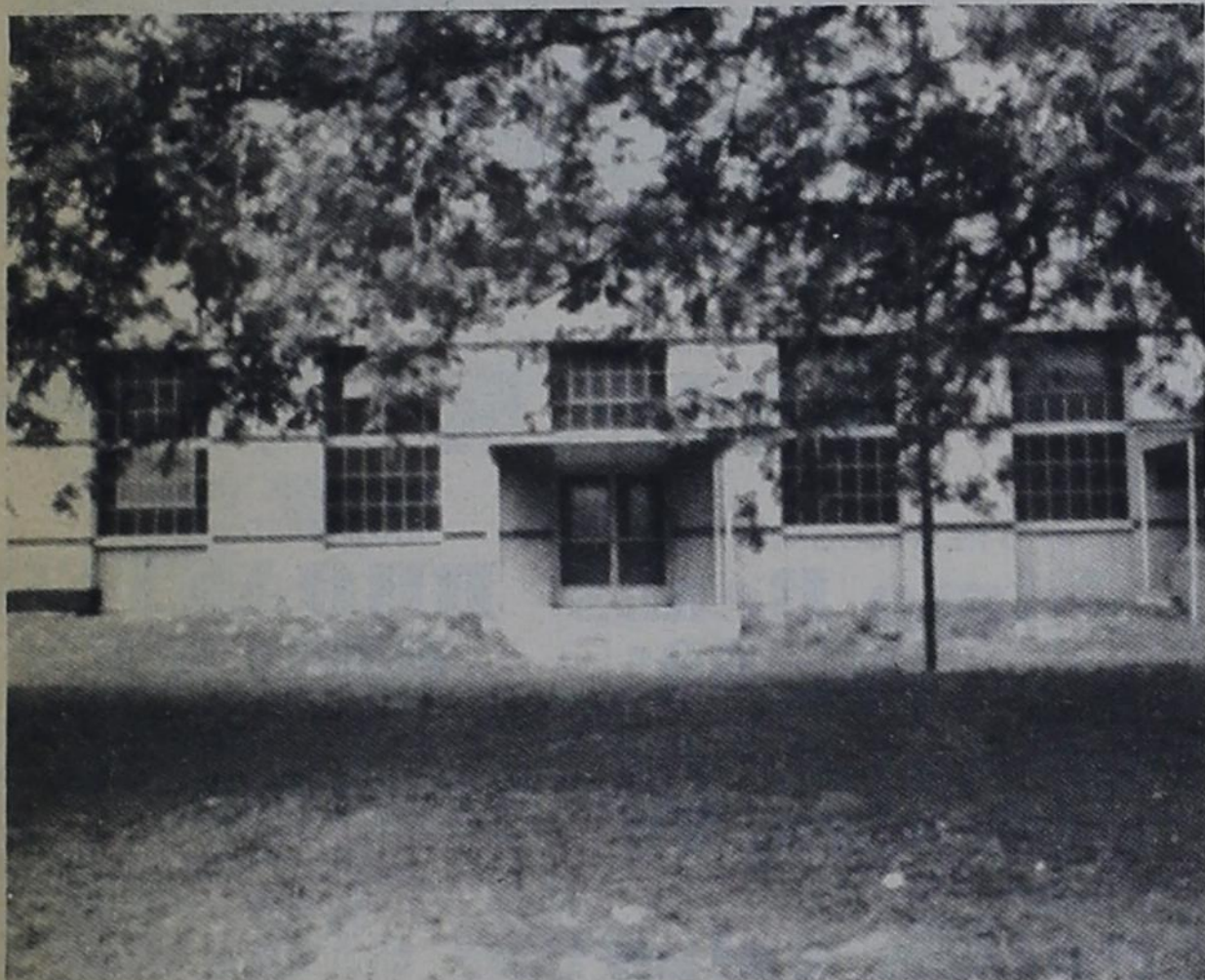

**MUNICIPAL LIGHT PLANT CLOSED**— Friday, May 2, 1980 at 5:30 p.m. the Municipal Light Plant was shut down. All operation ceased.

The plant will not be used for emergencies. It is being advertised for sale at this time.

Construction was started on the plant in 1939 and operation began in September of 1940.

The plant would have been in operation for 40 years in September of 1980.

## Installation Begins on New Phone Switching Center Here

Replacement of Continental Telephone's switching center at Baird has been approved by company officials. A computerized switching system scheduled for installation last year had been cancelled by the company pending resolution of differences with the city owned power utility over jointly used poles.

Components of the modern switching center have already arrived at Baird and technicians are now connecting the electronic circuits, according to Alan Armstrong, customer services manager for the phone company. The announcement came after representatives of both utilities reached agreement on the pole issue. Work crews have been replacing facilities which had caused differences of opinion regarding safety requirements.

If installation proceeds according to the company's new schedule, Baird telephones will be connected to the new system in late summer. An exact date for the change has not been set.

The new switching machine makes use of the latest digital electronic technology. The digital switch is like a computer. It has stored program control and no moving parts. As a result, the company expects greater reliability and less maintenance with the new equipment.

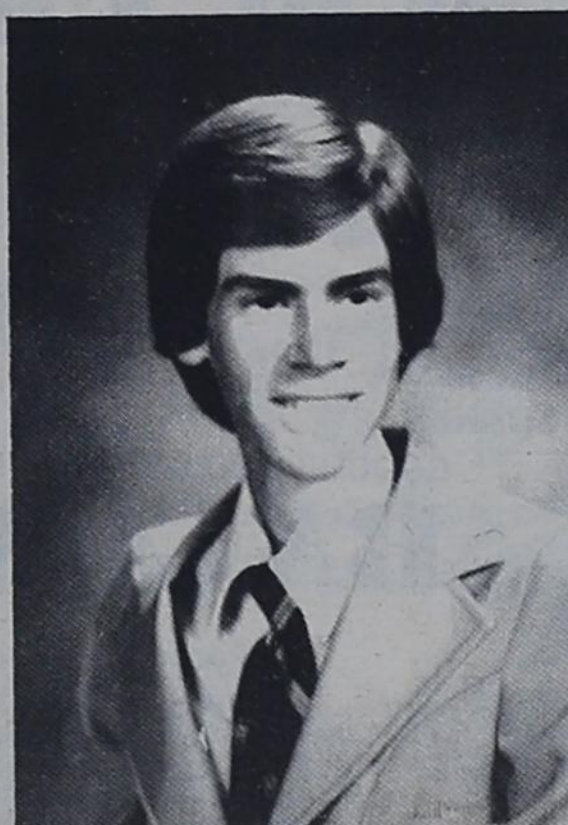
Continental Telephone was the first in the nation to introduce digital switching when it placed its Ridgecrest, California digital long distance switch into service in 1976. Since then, Continental has been a leader in the telephone industry through its rapid conversion of older electro-mechanical switches to the electronic digital versions.

Armstrong explained that economic factors have in the past prevented small telephone exchanges from keeping pace with changes and improvements made in large, urban switching centers. This disparity is now being eliminated through use of latest generation of switching technology.

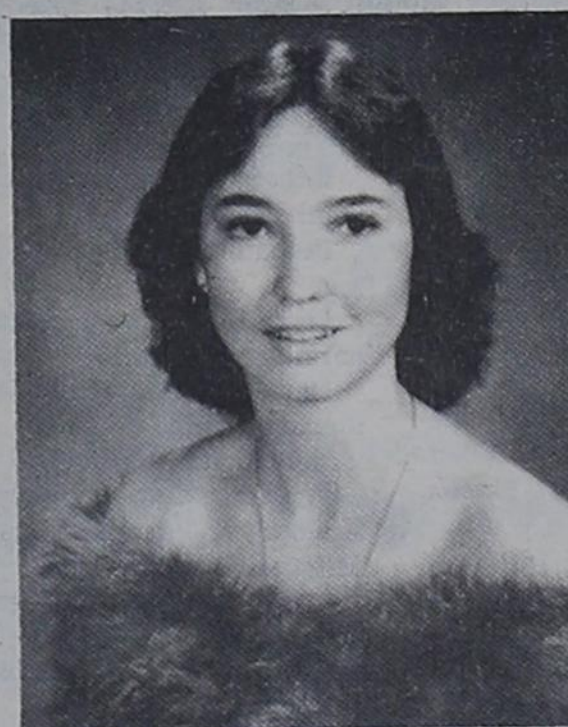
"By the year 2000," said Armstrong, "the entire telecommunications network will be largely digital in both switching and transmission. Baird telephone customers will be enjoying the advantages of that new technology in a matter of weeks."

The Baird installation will serve as control center for remote switching centers which will provide the identical type of service for telephone users in Putnam and Moran later in the year. Similar units were placed into service last year in Andrews, Rising Star and Pecos.

Dr. Thomas K. Kim, president of McMurry College, will be the graduation speaker.

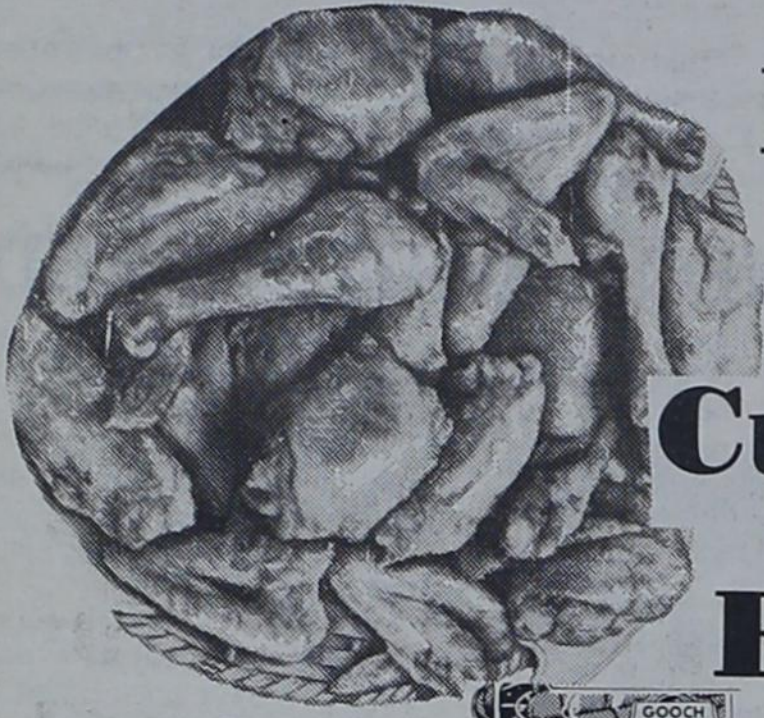

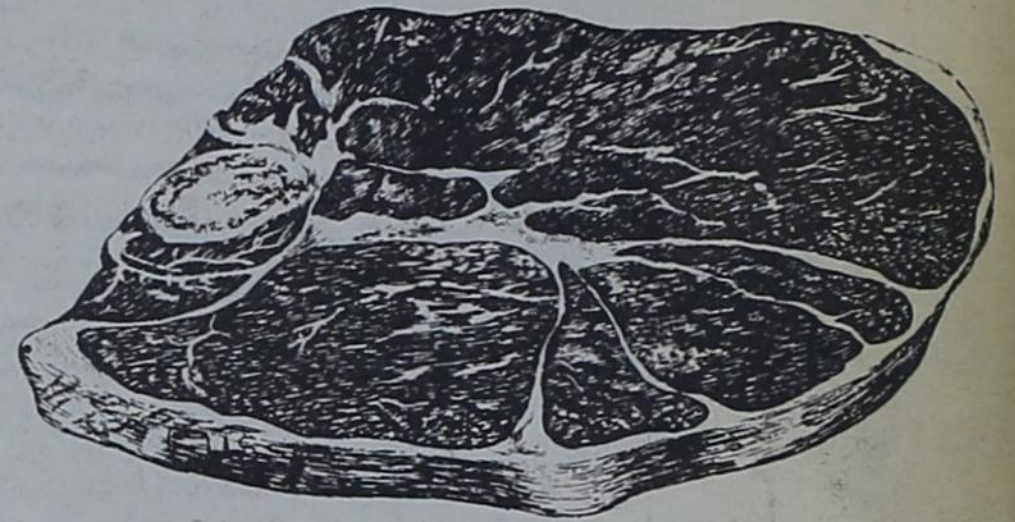
Dr. Kim is married to the former Martha Alice Zoellers and they have a son, Lawrence Thomas, and a daughter, Catherine Ann.

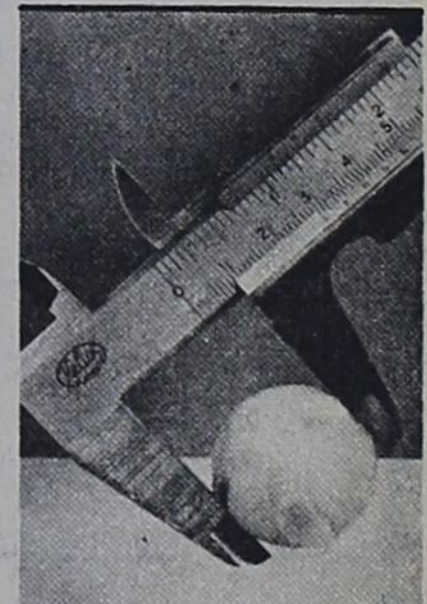
**FHA to Become Advocacy Group**

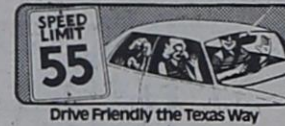
