The Elections.

The great fight is over, and it must be conceded that the Republicans have secured the largest slice of the pie. From those returns at hand, we can summarize the results as follows:

The Republicans in Ohio, have elected Judge Nash, their nominee for governor, over McLean (Dem.), and Jones (Ind). The entire state ticket has gone the same way.

In Kentucky, the result is still uncertain. Both the Taylor and Goebel factions claim to have safe pluralities for their respective candidates, but as Taylor [Rep.] is now in the lead, somewhat, with the mountain countries to hear from, the result will probably be a republican victory.

Bryan takes the palm in Nebraska, as the state has given the Fusionists a plurality of 25,000.

In Iowa, the republicans scored a victory. Maryland went Democratic.

The Republicans in Massachusetts elected the entire state ticket, although Boston was carried by the Democrats in the city election. Tammany elected the New York county ticket by a majority of 50,000, though the State Assembly will have the same Republican majority in 1800, as before.

New Jersey, the home of the greatest trusts was of course, carried by the Republicans.

San Francisco, Cal. Nov. 7.—Republican city committee, concedes the election of J. B. Phelan, [Dem.] for mayor by 5000.

Providence, R. I., Nov. 7.—Mayor Baker, [Dem.] was elected for the third successive time, by a plurality of about 21,000. All but one of the Democratic candidates on the general ticket were elected.

The true religious philosophy of an imperfect being, is not a system or creed but as Socrates taught, "an infinite search or approximation." Religion is the recognition of the power to which man is subject and upon which he is dependent with corresponding emotions. Religion is an expression of man's relation to the Ultimate Being, whether shown in fetishism, heriotheism, polytheism, monotheism, or agriosticism.
