



Families who have lost a wartime Veteran in the last 24 months may want to contact the funeral home regarding possible funeral expense reimbursement.



Word was received May 12 from the Texas Veterans Commission in Austin regarding Burial Benefits.


The letter states that ANY Veteran with wartime service prior to January 1, 1958 is eligible for Burial Benefits. Our World War I Veterans have all answered the last call so wartime is December 7, 1941 thru December 31, 1946 (extended to July 26, 1947 for Veterans who were in service on December 31, 1946.) and June 27, 1950 thru January 31, 1955 for Korean War era Veterans.





Tornadoes Sighted Thursday Night

Tornadoes raked across the north side of Callahan Eastland Counties Thursday night, part of a wild thunderstorm moving east out of West Texas.

Violent lightning, hail and brief heavy rain also came along with this storm. The cloud reportedly had speeds from 25 to 40 m.p.h. as it reached Eastland County.

By 8:30 p.m.the National Weather Service had placed tornado warnings across a big chunk of North and West Texas. Some of the first touchdowns in the Big Country were reported near Landfill north of the Abilene.

Then Shackelford Sheriff's Office County

Dispatch reported a tornado in the southwest part of that county. That was a tornado that destroyed a barn and livestock injured near Hamby.

The next reports were of touchdowns seven miles north of Clyde, where the tornado did some minor damage. Next it was sighted about nine miles north of Baird and west of Moran.

The Baird Department blew sirens in the town to warn the public.

The next report was of a large tornadic circulation north of Putnam and about 9 miles west of Moran, moving toward the town.

Just before 9 p.m. everyone in Moran was

advised to seek shelter. People in northern Eastland talked to a boy and his county and Stephens County were also driving down the road when warned of the approaching the tornado hit nearby. They

Cisco Fire and Police Chief Larry Weikel reports that he and other storm spotters headed for the northwest corner of Eastland County. He says that out on Hwy. 6 about 8 miles n.w. of Cisco he saw a tornado on the ground. He was at a high point about 2 miles northwest of it, and the flashes of lightning revealed a faairly alrge funnel.

Ag Talk By Congressman Charles Stenholm

Changes Made to CRP Program

he Paral Service Agency (FSA) published the interim rule for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) to refleet changes made to the CRP as a result of the 2002 Farm Bill.

One of the major changes that will be of interest to producers in the 17th District will be the role of managed haying and grazing on CRP acreage.

This is in addition to the emergency haying and grazing that has been allowed during emergency situations such as the most recent drought.

Another area of interest is the placement of wind turbines for energy generation on CRP acreage.

Before the 2002 Farm Bill, the 1985 Act generally provided that no commercial use could be made of land enrolled in CRP; that law did permit haying or grazing during drought or similar weather-related emergencies.

The 2002 Farm Bill changed that provision by making an exception for managed harvesting and grazing.

This exception includes the managed harvesting of biomass and the installation of wind turbines.

Wind turbines generally have a limited impact on the environment due to their small footprint of approximately one-tenth acre. They are non-polluting sources of energy and generally have a limited impact on wildlife.

Under the new law, wind turbines will be installed according to standards and in such numbers as determined appropriate by FSA.

Based on surveys of CRP participants, the managed having uses could potentially affect about 25 percent of eligible CRP grassland acreage.

Haying and grazing will be limited to no more than once every three years, depending on conservation plan guidelines.

There will be additional restrictions in environmentally sensitive areas or practices.

All haying and grazing activities will be conducted only after a detailed conservation plan has been developed according to the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Field Office Technical Guide (FOTG) for haying and grazing standards.

The conservation plan will ensure the long-term viability of the stand, while protecting and enhancing the soil, water, wildlife and other natural resources of the CRP acreage.

The conservation plan will require the control of noxious weeds and other weeds, insects, and pests.

The year 2003 will be considered "year one" of the management cycle for all CRP contracts in effect. For all new CRP contracts, the disturbance cycle will begin when the cover is established.

For contracts where all eligible acreage is already established, year one of the disturbance cycle will begin during the first managed haying and grazing period after the CRP contract is approved.

Under existing emergency uthority, any eligible CRP he hayed or dinge

Under the new rule, any CRP acreage eligible for emergency having or grazing within the county may be haved or grazed within the emergency authorization regardless of whether it was hayed or grazed in previous years under managed provi-

However, any eligible acreage hayed or grazed under either managed or emergency provisions would not be eligible for managed having or grazing for the next two years.

Senate Not Expecting Changes to COOL

Senate Agriculture Committee Chairman Jim Talent predicted last week that Congress will not repeal countryof-origin labeling (COOL) requirements.

He went on to say that USDA officials should implement the law in a way that is the most informative for consumers and the least costly for producers and agribusiness.

Following a recent field hearing in Montana, Chairman Talent said that he has let USDA officials know that he does not consider it the job of the subcommittee to go over the merits of country-of-origin labeling as an idea.

Senator Talent said he would consider legilsation to postpone deadlines or make some changes in the law, such
