Bowen is being held in Wichita County Jail, charged with two counts of intoxication manslaughter. He is under $\$ 350,000$ bond on each count,

The 1995-96 school year for Grace Baptist Christian School will close tonight with commence exercises held at the church The school, which provides an a capacity for 40 students. This year there were 33 enrolled in K-3 through the 12 th grade.

Grace Baptist Christian School has a self-paced curriculum, through 12 th grade and college courses. Each student is assigned a minimum of three to five pages in each maximum amount the sudents can do, as long as they understand what they are doing," Principal Steve Sharp explains.
The school was founded in Texas seven years ago, and is a part of the ministry of Grace Baptist Church. It was moved to Iowa Park from Wichita Falls in November
1993.

A student must do 12PACEs, or in effect must complete 12 work
books per year in each subject and successfully test in each. Sharp says this is the minimum to achieve academic balance, and if they do this he or she will have taken and passed 66
tests in a school year.
Sharp said "The highest we have seen is 120 tests in a year, which is
almost two full years of work. This almost two full years of work. This
is a student working on the is a student working on the
individual's academic level and above."
The core curriculum is Math, English, Social Studies, Science, Spelling, and Literature. High school electives include Bible courses, computer, health,
speech, art, sign language, French, speech, art, sign language, French,
Spanish, Greek, typing, music, busiSpanish, Greek, typing, music, bus
ness math, and general business.
Extra curricular activities listed by Principal Sharp include high school boys and girls basketball, high school girls volleyball, and golf. Students participate in two track meets a year, a tennis tournament,
Cross Country, "Science Skills and Cross Country, "Science Skills and
Scholasstics.', and a Music Festival Scholastucs". and a Music
for choirs and instrumental.

They compete with other Baptist Christian Schools in the Fort
