Q. Enclosed is a sample of my Chinaberry tree in Wichita Falls. Can you please identify the problem with this tree?
A. The tree sample you sent in to my office was off a Hackberry tree, not a Chinaberry. The damage on moisture stress. The browning of the edges of the foliage is indicative of moisture stress.
