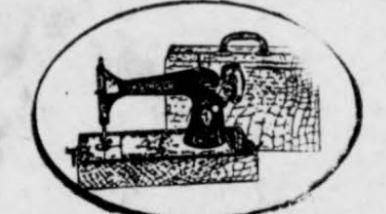

Soil Conservation

Seeding of native grasses has been started by district cooperators. H. E. Donohoe of Wichita Falls has seeded a mixture of buffalograss, sideoats and blue grama on tight dryland.

Ray Hirsch whose farm is located east of Puntkin Center has seeded a seed plot of Indiangrass. The grass was seeded with a district owned drill and was seeded in 30 inch rows on sandy loam soil.

The district supervisors have grass drills available through their custodians at Iowa Park and Electra. Farmers needing a grass drill should see Wade Bailey of Electra and Percy Phillips of Iowa Park. Bailey and Phillips can be located at Electra and Iowa Park High School respectively.

Shem F. Cunningham, district cooperator from Wichita Falls, has begun leveling of 20 acres of irrigated land. Cunningham soddled 60 acres to coastal bermudagrass during 1953 that did very good. From this experience, he expects to increase his acreage.

Mike, Lewis, and James Harmangruber are making plans to sod 27 acres of Coastal bermudagrass. They are checking on possibilities of using a mechanical sprigger.

Seeding of Madrid Clover is close at hand. In order to know more of fertilizers technicians for the dist. suggest that soil analysis be made. Dr. Carl Gray has been employed by Water Improvement Districts 1 and 2 to operate their soils laboratory located at Midwestern University and farmers needing soil analysis are advised to carry samples to the laboratory.

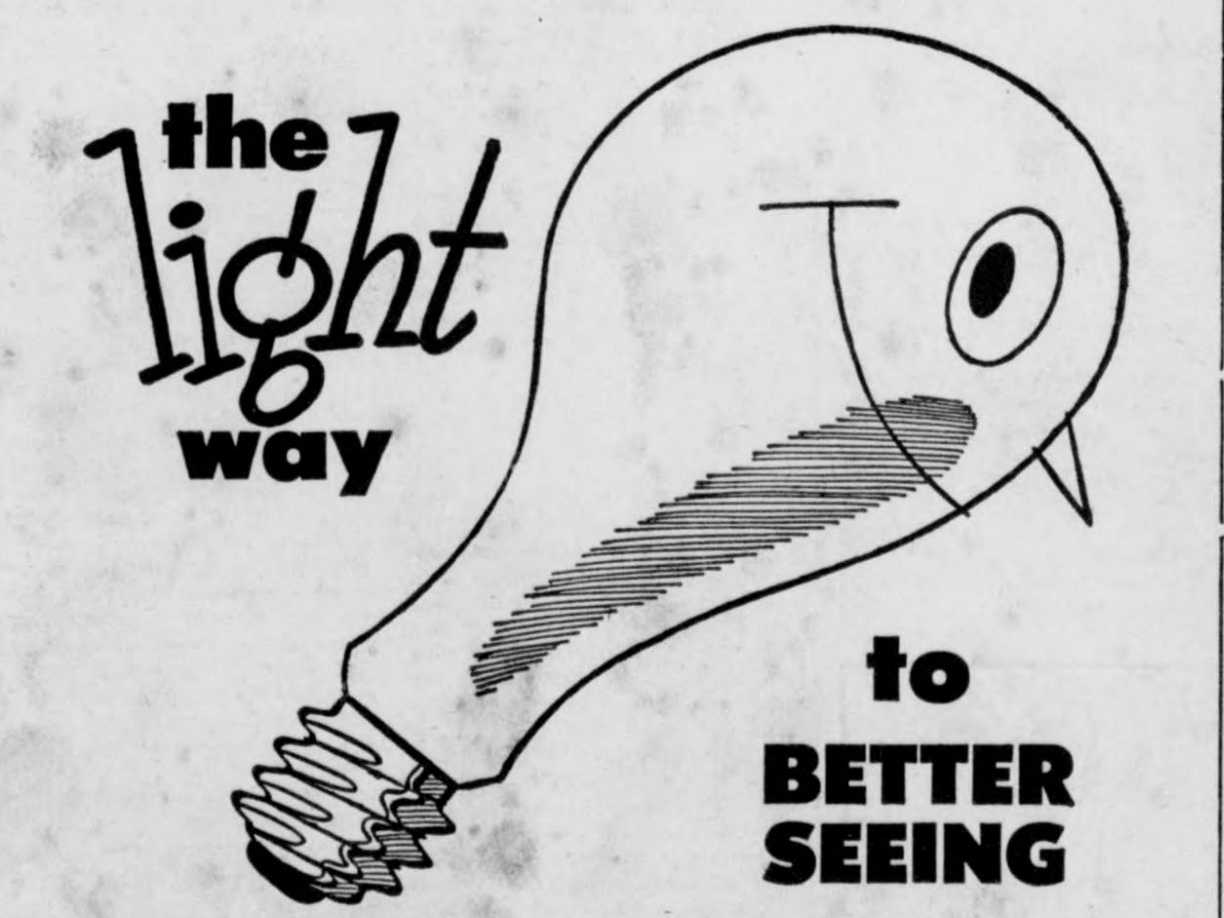

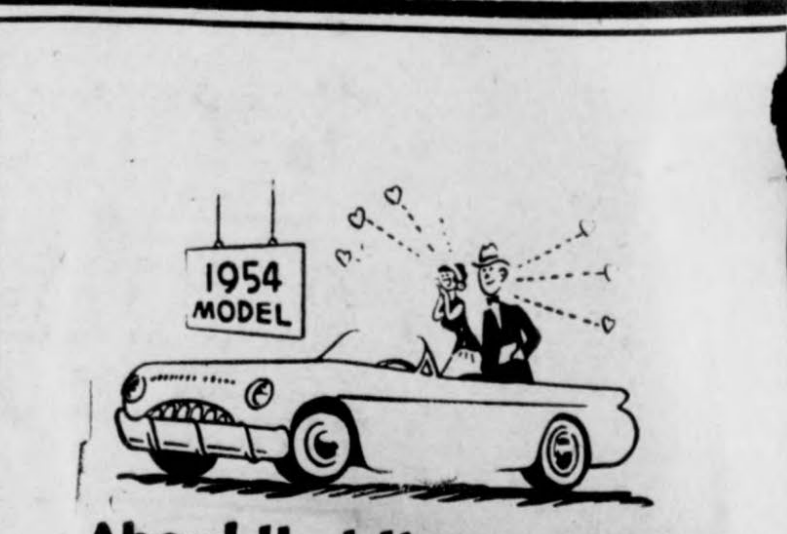
