Hawks seeking revenge

In re-match with Crane Saturday night

In the NCAA Basketball Tournament they call it the Sweet 16.

In High School football, they call it Regionals.

The Iowa Park Hawks reached the Regional Round of the Class 3A State Playoffs with a come from behind win over China Spring last week, and will now turn their attention to the team that ended their season last

year.

The Crane Golden Cranes, 12-0 overall and ranked number four in the final regular season AP Poll, eliminated Iowa Park from the playoffs last year beating the Hawks 16-7.

This year the two teams will meet Saturday night at 7:30 in Sweetwater at the Mustang Bowl to determine who will advance to the Quarterfinals.

Crane defeated Friona 43-16 Saturday to advance to the Regional Championship game.

The Golden Cranes' claim to fame has to be their defense.

Crane has posted six shutouts for the year and has allowed a total of only 50 points in its 12 games so far. That's an average of just over four points per contest. The six teams the Cranes have shut out include district opponents Ft. Stockton, McCamey, Monahans, Alpine, Presidio, and a Bi-District win over Slayton.

Their defense is led by their line consisting of Luis Hernandez, a 170-lb. noseguard, Tyler Nelson, a 210-lb. defensive tackle, along with Cesar Hernandez, a 172-lb. defensive tackle. Clay McGuire and Juan Hernandez play the defensive end positions, with Hernandez weighing in at 170 and McGuire, who also starts at quarterback weighing in at 210. McGuire twisted his ankle in the win over Friona and had to leave the game, but is expected back this week.

Linebackers for the Cranes include Michael Cavazos and Harold Jeffery, with Cavazos weighing 175 and Jeffery 185. The secondary is also not very big, with the four defensive backs weighing an average of 161 pounds, led by strong safety Philip Tarin, a 5-8 130-lb. senior.

"Defensively they're very strong," said head coach Weldon Nelms. "It looks like you've got a big hole to run through where you would normally get eight or nine yards, but against them it's only two or three yards. They close on the ball exceptionally fast. They are very strong

When entering Sweetwater on I-20 from the East (from Abilene), take Exit 247 to East Broadway, and turn north (right) onto Hailey.

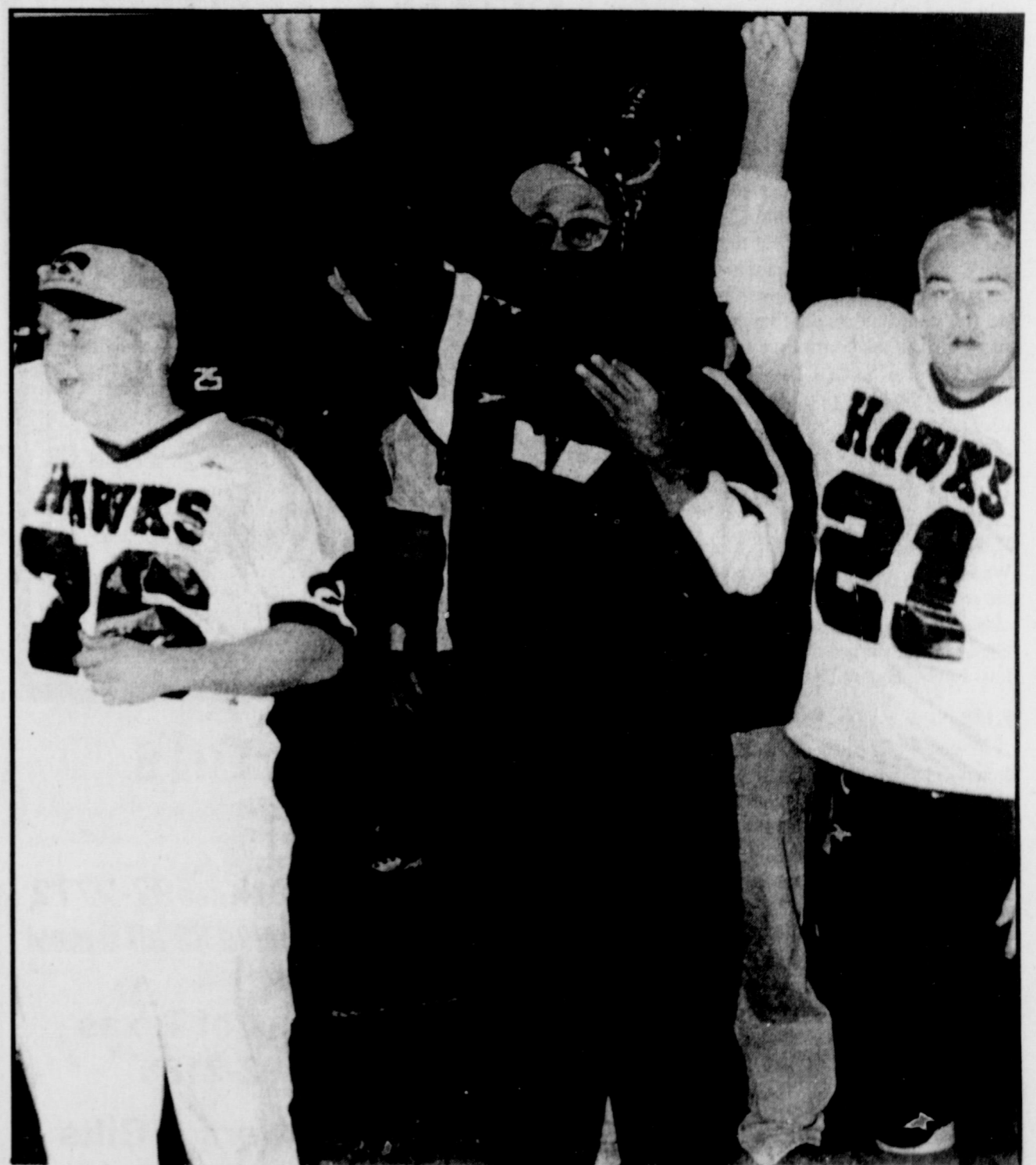
Those entering Sweetwater from the North on Hwy. 70, from Roby, should continue on Hwy. 70 to 12th Street, and turn right.

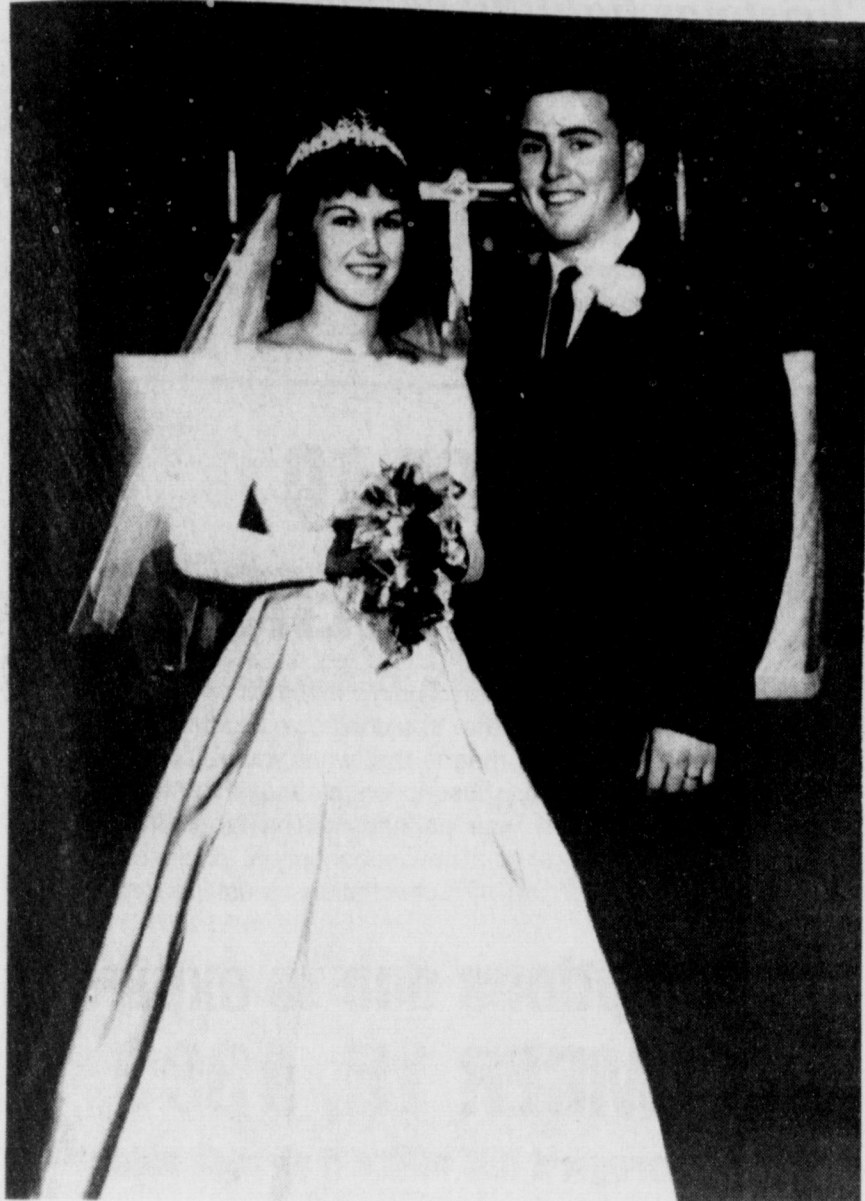

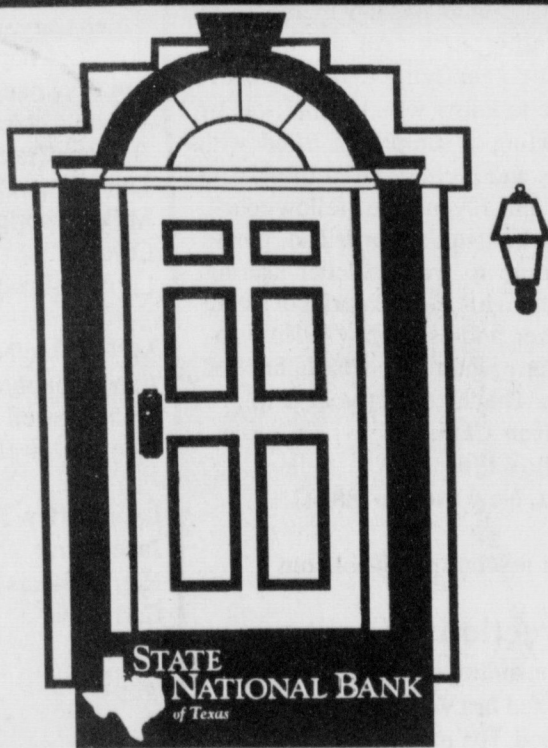

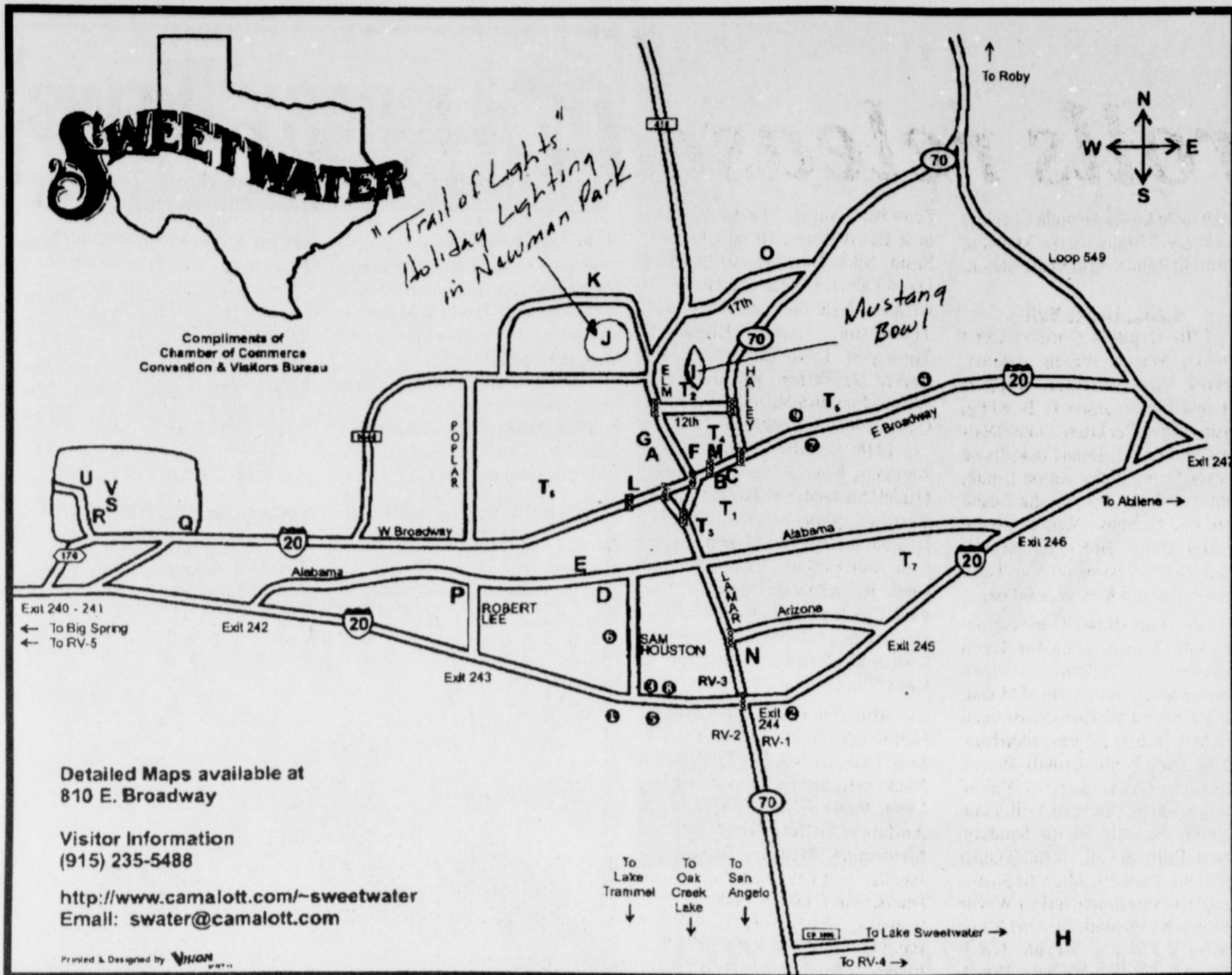

Sen. Gramm will describe an article he is adding to the capsule, and that is to be followed by the actual burial.

A flag also is to be donated to the capsule by State Rep. Rick Hardcastle.

Following brief visitations with the news media and students, the senator is to depart at 3:15 p.m., according to the schedule.

WHAT DOES GOD SAY?

About gambling? (No. 2) The November 4 issue contained the first piece on the subject of gambling, in which it is defined and repudiated. Further study shows that gambling is not in harmony with the Spirit of God, nor the discipline He expects of His followers.

Not only does gambling contradict God's system of exchange, but it also violates some specific and fundamental values of life. Gambling is by its very nature covetous. It is based upon the intent of taking from another either by purchased chance or sophistry. "Covetousness" is equated with "idolatry" in Colossians 3:5. "Covetousness" is greedy desire, in this case, for that which belongs to another. God says, "...let it not once be named among you, as becometh saints" (Ephesians 5:3). Gambling is generated by the spirit of covetousness.

Gambling violates the love that is of God. First, it is based on love for the wrong thing. "For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows" (1 Timothy 6:10). "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will God abideth forever" (1 John 2:15-17). Second, gambling violates the nature of love. "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself" (Matthew 22:39). It would be most difficult to follow the "golden rule" while gambling (Matthew 7:12). "Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. Love worketh no ill to his neighbor: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law: (Romans 13:8-10). We are responsible for the harm we bring to others.

God expects us to be good stewards (Luke 16:2). "the earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof; the work, and they that dwell therein" (Psalm 24:1). We must use His blessing wisely, placing spiritual values above physical desires.

Sadly, religious institutions and schools endorse gambling with raffles and lotteries under the guise that it is innocent fun and does no harm. In many cases gambling has taken hold from tables, clothing from families, brought shame, the loss of a sense of self-worth and caused suicide. Yet many say, "There is no harm in it!"

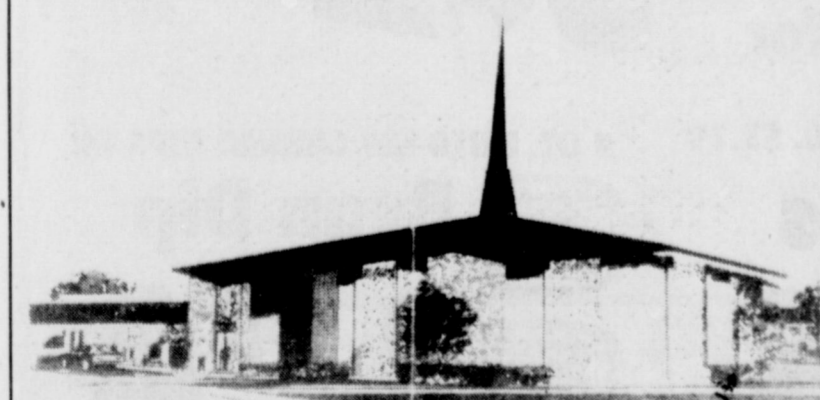

Knowing stroke warning signs can save lives

Knowing the warning signs and signals of a stroke could save a life. Your own or that of a loved one.

The American Heart Association points out that about 600,000 people suffer a new or recurrent stroke each year. About 500,000 of these are first time strokes.

"Those are scary statistics," says Danny Bartel, M.D., P.A., volunteer for the American Heart Association's North Texas Region. "However, an estimated 4.4 million stroke survivors are alive today, some of them because they got help quickly enough to save their lives."

Dr. Bartel warns that stroke affects different people in different ways. "When a stroke occurs, severe injury to mental and bodily functions - even death - can result. Knowing the warning signs of a stroke and seeking immediate medical treatment

are critical," he says.

The AHA says these are the warning signs of a stroke:

- * Sudden weakness or numbness of the face, arm or leg on one side of the body.
- * Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.
- * Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- * Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.
- * Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

Not all of these signs occur in every attack. Sometimes they go away and return. If some occur, get help fast.

"If you notice one or more of these signs in another person, don't wait," Dr. Bartel says. "Call 911 and get the person to a hospital right away."

Hawks rally to edge Cougars, 29-25

In the first round of the State Playoffs against Ballinger, Iowa Park blew away the Bearcats 68-17, scoring 10 touchdowns along the way.

Last week against China Spring, the Hawks had to rally from a 10-point second half deficit before finally winning 29-25 over the Cougars.

But at this point in a season, a win is a win and that's all that matters, because the loser is through for the year.

Iowa Park, now 8-4 overall, will advance to the Regional Round of the playoffs against the team that eliminated the Hawks last year.

Iowa Park advanced to the Regional Round by scoring 14 points in the last 2:38 of the third quarter to erase a 25-15 lead by Ballinger, on a pair of Jimmy Wilson touchdowns.

The Hawks opened the scoring on their first possession of the game. The Cougars took the opening kickoff and were marching toward the Hawk end zone when Jeff Duerson made a diving interception at the 23 to turn the ball over to the Iowa Park offense with 9:01 left in the opening quarter.

Seven plays later, Iowa Park was on the board following Bryan Swenson's 21-yard touchdown run with 5:51 still showing on the first quarter clock. Rick Hartman added the first of his three point-after attempts to give the Hawks a 7-0 lead. Besides Swenson's big 21-yard run, the Iowa Park scoring drive included a big 42-yard run by Chase Wright on the second play, moving the ball to the Cougar 32.

On China Spring's next possession, it was once again Duerson who came up with the big interception to end another Cougar drive. Duerson's pick of a Shawn Bell pass at the Iowa Park 15 gave the ball back to the offense with 3:46 left in the first quarter.

Tyler Pulley picked up 13 yards on the first play of the drive, moving the ball to the 28 only to see the drive stall three plays, later forcing the Hawks to punt the ball away from their own 29 with 1:25 left in the first.

Oscar Guerrero broke through the line and blocked Jereme Wilson's punt, which sailed all the way out of the end zone for a safety, cutting the Iowa Park lead to 7-2.

Following the Iowa Park free kick, China Spring took over at midfield and took only two plays to find the endzone. Fullback Brock Shows ran for 14 yards on the first play, then Bell did the rest, covering the final 36 yards after a nice ball fake to put the Cougars on top for the first time in the game. Leading 8-7, the Cougars' try for the two-point conversion failed, giving China Spring the slim first-quarter lead. Iowa Park took the ensuing kickoff and

marched all the way to the Cougar 16 on its next drive before faltering on a fourth-and-two play.

After turning the ball over on downs, the Cougars drove 78 yards in seven plays to score their second touchdown of the night, on a one-yard run by Shows. The fullback accounted for 54 yards on the drive and finished the night with 171 yards rushing on 23 carries. Cody Garcia's point-after gave China Spring a 15-7 lead with 4:53 left in the half.

The Hawks took the kickoff and quickly answered the Cougar touchdown with one of their own, marching 72 yards in 11 plays, capped by Pulley's touchdown pass to Wright on a big fourth-and-five play from the 17 with 49 seconds left in the half. Pulley found Wright all alone in the endzone for the score that pulled the Hawks to within two, at 15-13. Wilson then tied the game at 15-15 after he scored the two-point conversion behind a pair of nice blocks by James Williams and Kyle Young.

The second half started with the Hawks unable to move the ball and after three plays, Iowa Park was forced to punt.

China Spring took over at the 38 and moved the ball to the Iowa Park four 13 plays later, but the Iowa Park defense stiffened, forcing the Cougars to settle for a 30-yard field goal by Garcia, which gave the Cougars an 18-15 lead with 4:07.

The Iowa Park offense again struggled and was unable to move the ball. On second and 15 from the 35, Wilson fumbled the ball, which was recovered by Brandon Garrett for the Cougars at the Iowa Park 22 with 3:03 left in the third quarter.

The Cougars went to their bag of tricks and pulled out a play that still has the Hawk

fans wondering how they scored.

On the first play from scrimmage, Bell somehow handed the ball off to Shows who ran to his left untouched for the 22-yard touchdown giving China Spring a 25-15 lead with 2:55 left in the third quarter. Everyone on the field thought the ball was going to the right where all the players were bunched up, only to see Shows running free around his left end.

Just when it looked like the momentum had shifted to the Cougar side of the field, Wilson scored the first of his two touchdowns in a span of less than 2:30.

Wilson's first score came on the ensuing kickoff, when he broke free and was gone for a 96-yard touchdown to pull the Hawks to within three at 25-22 with 2:30 left in the third quarter.

Iowa Park kicked off to the Cougars, who took over at their own 28. That's when the Hawk defense made the first of its three big plays of the second half.

The Iowa Park defense stuffed the Cougars on three straight plays, forcing a China Spring punt.

Iowa Park then took over at the Cougar 42 with 1:28 to play in the third. Five plays later the Hawks were in the endzone, after Wilson's 10-yard touchdown on the final play of the quarter. Big plays in the drive included a 13-yard run by Wright, a 14-yard run by Wilson, and a 22-yarder by Ryan Huff. Wilson's touchdown gave Iowa Park a 29-25 lead on the final play of the third quarter.

The Iowa Park defense then took over, stopping the Cougars on two fourth-and-short tries in the fourth quarter to preserve the win. Iowa Park drove to the China Spring one with 3:18 left to play and was looking to ice the win with a touchdown. But fumbled on a second-and-goal, play giving China Spring one more shot.

The Hawk defense would have one last say in the matter, stuffing the Cougars on a fourth-and-two from the nine, to end the game.

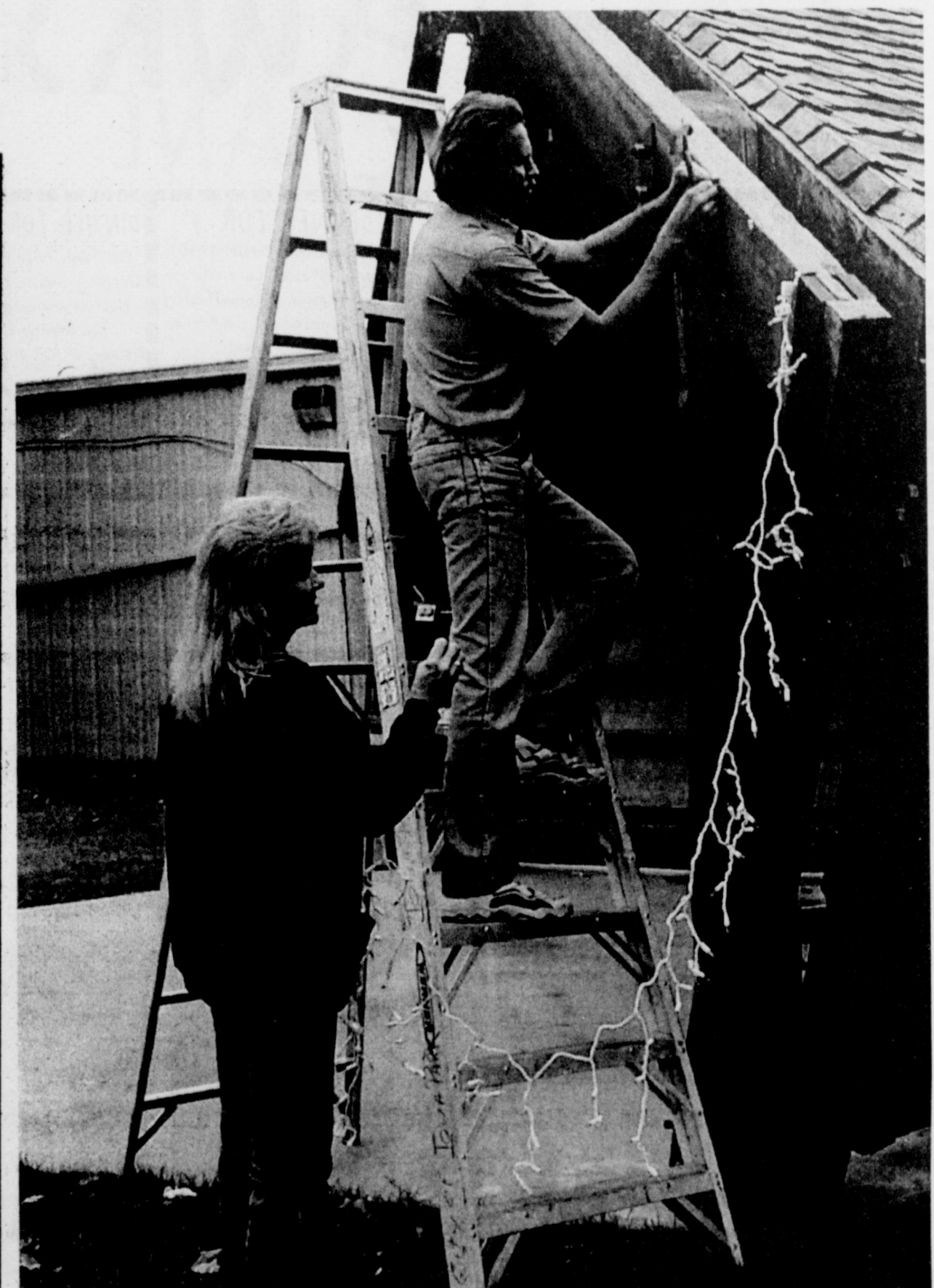

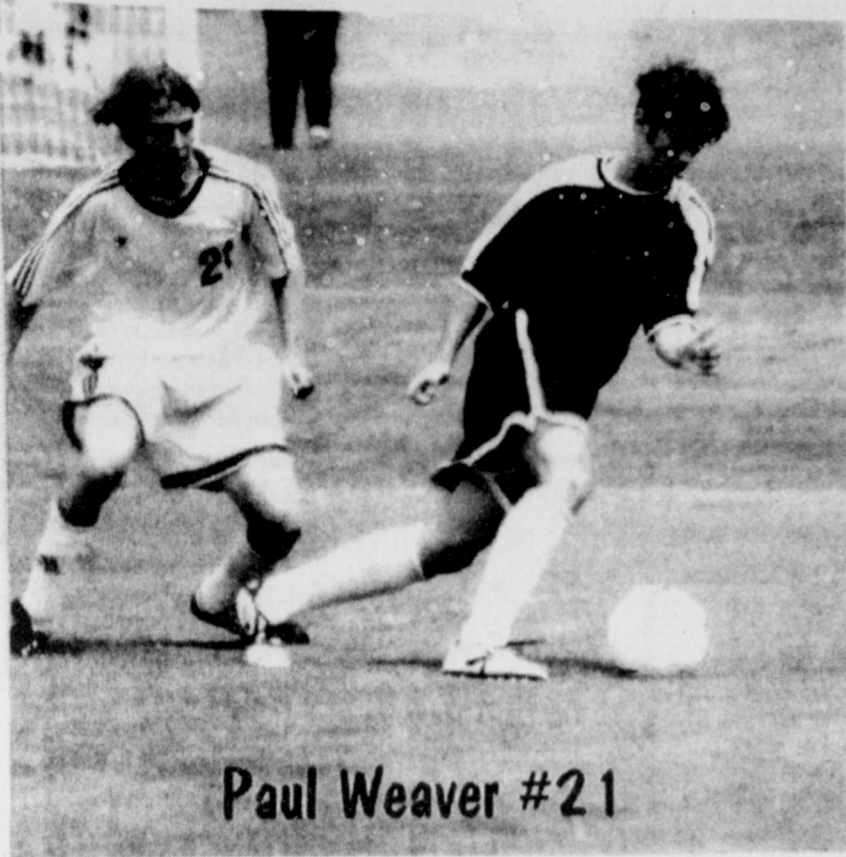

and play low to the ground because of their lack of size. In the secondary they mix it up and play a lot of man and zone coverages. I think the opportunity is there to make some big plays in our passing game.

"The key for our offense is first down I think," Nelms said. "If we can be successful on first down and stay out of second and third and long we'll be okay. If we don't it goes in their favor. We have to be able to move the ball through the air. We can't go in there and expect to just run the ball."

The Crane offense isn't doing too shabby either, averaging 39.6 points per contest.

The Golden Cranes are led offensively by McGuire, a 210-lb. senior quarterback. McGuire has carried the ball 121 times for 715 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Joining McGuire in the backfield are fullback Lino Garcia and tailback Harold Jeffery. Garcia has accounted for 227 yards rushing and three touchdowns, while Jeffery is the team's leading rusher with 887 yards on 126 carries and has scored 14 times.

The offensive line averages 205 pounds per man and is led by Tyler

Nelson and Dustin Johns. When the Cranes go to the air, look for Joe Henderson and Philip Tarin to be on the receiving end.

The Golden Cranes are averaging 379 total yards per game, with 256 coming on the ground and 123 through the air. Crane is averaging 13.6 first downs per game as well.

McGuire has completed 69 of his 130 attempts for a 53% completion ratio and has thrown for a total of 1,312 yards and 13 touchdowns for an average of 19 yards per completion.

"Offensively they will give you a lot of different looks," Nelms stated. "Their quarterback is the key to their offense. As he goes so goes his team. He's a big strong kid that is a true competitor. He's one of those guys that if you need four yards he gets five. If you need 15 he gets 16. They run a lot of sweeps, counters and will run the fullback up the middle and try to hit a crease. They throw the ball well and have a very good play action pass that really can hurt you. That was a big play for them last year against us. Their quarterback was hurt in their last game, but we expect him to be back this week. He was really hobbling following the game. Maybe it will slow him down a step or two,

especially on his cuts.

"We need to have a solid kicking game as well," Nelms added. "Last week we had a big play from our kickoff return team and that really shifted the momentum of the game. We have to play solid and not have any breakdowns. Games like this are usually won by the team that makes the fewest mistakes."

Iowa Park comes into the game averaging 43.3 points per game and 421.3 yards per game. So it comes down to a good offense against a

good defense.

The Hawks got back at China Spring for the loss the Cougars handed the Hawks in the 1998 baseball playoffs. Now Iowa Park will have the opportunity to settle the score with the Cranes.

And should the Hawks defeat Crane and Childress beat Midland, Iowa Park would get another shot at the Bobcats, the team that prevented the Hawks from winning the District Championship.

Like their motto has been all year long, "Unfinished Business", the Hawks will get a chance to finish what they started last year, Saturday night in Sweetwater.




