



A Surveyor's Certificate must be presented to the City Clerk upon an application for a building permit; and anyone starting a structure upon any lot within the City limits of Iowa Park, Texas, with out first presenting a surveyor's certificate and having a permit signed by the City Secretary shall be subject to fine.

Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon convic tion shall be fined in any sum no exceed \$100.00.


