Horace Newton Hicks, of San Antonio died April 15 in a hospital. Mr. Hicks, age 80, had been a resident of San Antonio for 30 years.

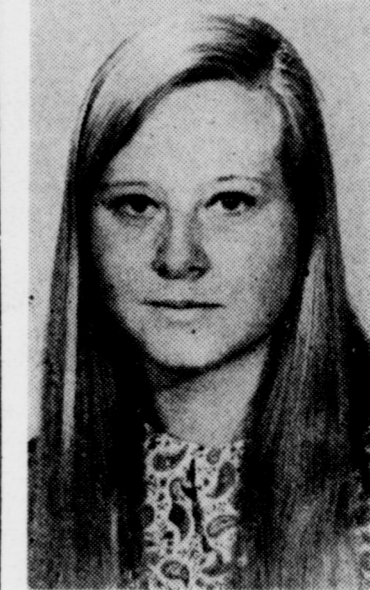



Horticulture exhibits will be specimens of tall bearded irises and many will be the irises that have won the coveted Dykes Medal award. There will also be collections of five varieties, and some members will exhibit seedlings they have hybridized.

Specimens of Dutch, Louisiana and Spuria Irises will be exhibited. Each specimen will be labeled as to type and variety.



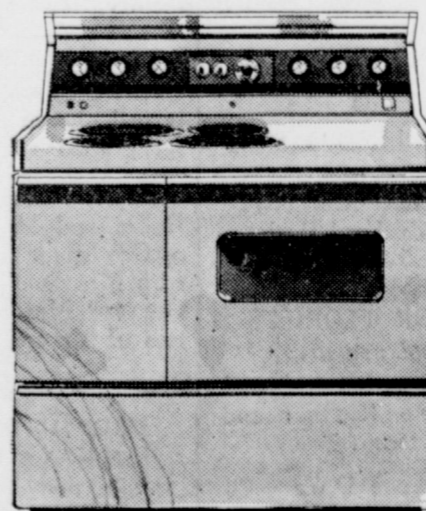
