The Boers were found in great force at all points, although we had seven batteries of artillery their fire failed entirely to crush that of the enemy. The twelve-pounder quick fire guns of the Natal contingent came into action. The enemy had field pieces, machine guns and a 100 pounder.

Anstin, Tex., Oct. 30.—Gov. Sayers to-day issued the following Thanksgiving proclamation.

Proclamation—In recognition of our belief in the existance of an Almighty God and his manifold mercies and kindnesses to us as a people, I, Joseph D. Sayers, govenor of the state of Texas, do hereby designate Thursday, the 30th day of November, A. D. 1899, as a day of Thanksgiving, and do earnestly call upon all the people to then abstain from their vocations and labors and unite in an expression of praise and gratitude to Him for the many blessings that He has vouchsafed them during the preceding year.
