## ATVs can be dangerous

All-terrain vehicles, better known to thair users as ATVs, are among the hottest-selling, summer recreational items among people
who can afford the investment. The 3-wheeled motorcycles can scoot over sand dunes, marshes, pastur es and other areas inacoessible to autos.
But problems mar the vehicles'
reputation. Sinoe they have been reputation. Since they have been
available, thousends of injuries and some deaths, mostly of children, have been attributed to their use. The injury rate to users of ATVs is double that of 2 -wheel vehicles. injuries are suffered by riders under age 16 , and 24 percoent ocur to kids under 12 .
The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission reports that in
1982 when ATV 1982 when ATVs were new, 8,585
injuries were reported. That total has jumped dramatically every year since, as popularity and numbers of
ATVs have spread.
From Jan. 1 to April 30 this year, From an. 1 to April 30 this year,
some 28,000 injuries were attributed to ATV use. At least 161 deaths, 11 of which were in Texas and 40 of which were in surrounding states, have resulted from-
aocidents with ATVs since governaccidents with ATV8 since govern--
ment agencies began studying the machines' safety.
Den Sowards, of the Texas
Department of Helath Hazardous Department of Helath Hazardous Products Branch said that studies
are under way to determine if user are under way to determine if user
ignorance or negligence, or engineering defects are linked to the majority of injuries and deaths. He econtly testified for the Consumer
a a hearing in Dallas.
"CPSC only now is able to get
in-depth information from in-depth information from consum-
er groups, ATV manufater er groups, ATV manufacturess and
distributors, and independent fety experts about the reported problems associated with ATV,
Sowards Sowards said. "Only now atven some" of the posible problems with ATV
be idensified by studying the be identified by studying the
variety of injuries attributed to variety of injuries attributed to
them. Most injuries result from the rider. Most injuries result from the of control. The ma
chines cos of chines can overturn or roll over in some circumstances. Sometime
riders have been riders have been thrown off.
"At the recent hearing in Dallas, parents of small children and
physidians from surrounding sta tos, representing surrounding sta sta have been disabled or killed, called
for stiffer regulation of ATVs. They for stiffer regulation of ATVs. They
wanted clearer warnings of the potential hazard, warnings of the thining and ed-
ucation required for uoation required for anyone using an ATV, an age and protective
dothing requirements for ATV lothing requirements for ATV
users. Some advocated a ban on the machines in the United States.
"CPSC will "CPSC will United two more hearings before malding any con-
dusions about ATVs clusions about ATVs' safety, but it is clear the public wants guidance
in how to avoid some of the tragedies already experienoed. I would expect that by this time next yeer CPSC will have moved on the
evidence it is evidence it is collecting now," Sowards said.

manuards added that the ATV Janulacturers, mostly besed in
Japan, have reported beaklogs of
orders for their orddrs for their new 4 wheeled
ATVs, which are believed to be ATV8, which are believed to be
more stable.

## Gruver man pilots rescue helicopter



Charlie Johnson pilloted this Two Evergen Hellor Alaska pilots and a mechanic responded to a distress call May 7 when a single-engine aircraft with Cook Inlet, near Anchorage, Ala. Charlie J Johnson, Brad Warren and A.j. "Bert" Fowler responded Troopers about 8:30 p.m. after the small plane had crashed landed in the inlet. Persons on shore said the plane, A Cessna 180, set down as
smoothly as it could, but then the nose went into the choppy water. While people on shore scurried to assist the victims, the Evergreen employees readied their rescue ropes and took off in a Hughes
500 D helicopter. According to Fowler, the crew was airborne within minutes of recoiving the call. Troopers had called the Coast Guard and all the other helicopter
companies, but they didn't have companies, but they didn't have could scramble quick enough to get to the people bobbing in the 30 -degree water. Fowler seid "I didn't know where we were going, the way there. I spent the time the way there. I spent the time
tying ropes into loops for the
 Fowler said that they spotted the
people in the water floating about people in the water floating about
one-half mile off shore. The heli-opo-half wase off shore. The heil-
grabbed his arms and clamped
them around the skid, and I trabeed around the skid, and I tied a
tope around him, tying him to the
res.
The team then headed for shore with the man who was losing consciousness.
"His eyes bes "His eyes began to roll up in his
head and then close and his grip head and then cose, and mis gin loosened. yeill od wanging on to his shirt collar and he opened his eyes again. I jus kept yelling and telling him he was
going to make it," Fowier said. going to make it," Fowler said.
Once on shore, fire and rescu crews grabbed the man. But Fowler could not let go. His hand had frozen while holding the man, end
the firemen had to the firemen had to open his fingers
to get the man to the stretcher. to get the man to the stretcher.
Fowier threw the dog out as th Fowler threw the dog out as they
started to take off again for the started to take off again for the
aocident site. A fireman reached for the animal and told the men that there were children in the sinking plane.
While taking While taking the man in, they passed two men who had pushed
off shore in a life raft to aid in the rescue. By the time the helicopter came back, the men had the woman pulled aboard. The aircraft hovered
over them and tried unsuccossfully three times to pull her into the helicopter. According to Fowler, she was limp and kept slipping through the noose. Then a motorized
raft arrived at the soene and rushed raft arrived at the scene and rushed
her back to shore.
The crew then tried to get to the sinking aircraft, but ran out of time, so, they decided to go beck and get a diver to retrieve the
children. When they came back, all children. When they came back, all
that was left of the plane was an oil that w
slick.
"Visibility in the water was limited to two feet because of the merky tide coming in so fast, and the diver couldn't find anything.
The crew on the other raft had lost contact with the plane because of having to paddle hard to fight the tide, and by the time we were back on the third trip the wind was
blowing 10 to 20 knots and visibility was about 400 yards in heavy snow," Fowler said.
"We almost couldn't see the shoreline of huge mountains, and
we had to fly back to Merrill Field we had to fly back to Merrill Field
100 feet over the highway in

blinding snow.

Nutritional program for horses
A horse's soundness is directly
linked to its nutitional program, says Kenneth Slough of Double ' D ' Fertilizer a Feed in Gruver. "'To stay in good, sound physical condition, a horse must receive a nutritionally well-belanoed diet in-
duding the right amounts of impor tent minerels, particularly calcium. and phosphorus. And these minerals must be in the right proportion, too," Slough seys.
quate amounts of calciumede phopephorus or an improper cal cum-phosphorus ratio are candidates for abnormal bone develop. "If thers problems, Slough added improper ratio of calcium and phosphorus, there is reduced bone mineralization. The less dense bone is suscoptible to damage. Inflamation, tenderness and poss age can result."
Horses fed raw grains, which are essentially devoid of calcium, are especially suscoptible. Grain mixes with minerels added can also caus phosphorus ratio is inappropriate to the horse's stage of growth. The generally accopted minimum calcium-phosphorus ratio is 1:1. A feed with a $1: 1$ ratio, such as
Purina's Omolane $\$ 300$ for example, is an excoellent choiog for youns stock. However, if a horse owner cuts that with raw grain, which contains phosphorus but very little calcium, the ratio will drop beiow 1:1, he said.
