Registered drug gists are allowed to sell liquor for medicinal, sacramental, or chemi cal purposes, but in case the drug gist violates the provisions of the ordinance, he is liable to a fine of from \$25 to \$300 or a jail sentence of 30 to 90 days. Doctors who il-legally prescribe liquor are liable to a fine of from \$25 to \$100 or 30 to 90 days in jail.






