HOUSE RILL NO 130.

Introduced by Hon. J. W. Mullens, Feb. 25, 1907; read first and second times by title, ordered translated, and printed and referred to Committee on Library.

An Act to repeal Chapter 17 of the 36th Legislative Assembly being "An act to regulate the use or Artesian wells and to prevent the waste of subteranean fl water and for other purposes, approved Feb. 22, 1905," and to provide for inspection, regulation and use of Artesian wells and for other purposes

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of New Mexico:

Mexico:
Sec. 1. That any artesian well which is not tightly and securely cased, capped and furnished with a proper cut off valve as will readily and effectually arrest and present, the day of water from such vent the flow of water from such well, is hereby declared to be a public nusiance. The owner, tenant or occupant of the land upon which such well is situated who shall cause, permit or suffer such public nuisance or suffers or perm ts it to remain or continue

guilty of a misdemeanor.
Sec. 2. Any person owning, possessing or occupying and hav-ing charge of any land on which is situated an artesian well, who causes, suffers or permits the water to unnecessarily flow from such well or to go to waste, or uses or permits the water therefrom to be used for any purpose on any land or place at a greater distance than two miles from the land where said well is tocated. except as provided in section 4 of this act, is guilty of a misdemean-

Ordinance No 73

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Artesia, New Mexico.

Sec. 1 That any person of persons, firm or corporation who shall plant or cause to be planted any trees along or upon any of the streets of the town of Artesia, except such streets as are hereinafter otherwise provided for in this ordinance, shall plant the same ten feet from the from line of the abutting lot or lots.

lot or lots.

Sec. 2 Any person or persons, firm or corporation who shall plant or cause to be planted any trees along or upon West. Thirdstreet or the street commonly known as Rose Lawn Avenue, or whe shall plant or cause to be planted, trees upon or along Third street in said Town, shall plant or cause to be planted, trees upon or along Third street in said Town, shall plant the same eight feet from the front of the abutting lot or lots.

Sec. 3 No Cottonwood trees of any kind or nature shall be set out or planted along or upon any of the streets of the Town of Artesia, except, those commonly known as Mountain Cottonwood.

Sec. 4 Any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance, or any clause thereof, shall be fined not less than five dollars nor mere than ten dollars, in the discretion for the court trying the case, and each day continuance in said violation shall be deemed a separate offence and subject to the same punishment.

Sec. 5 This ordinance shall have full force and effect from and after five days after its publication.

Any person hereafter bering or causing to be bered any artesian well shall case the same with a good quality of metal casing sufficient in all cases to resist the pressure of the water from the entire depth of the water and shall keep a complete and accurate record of the depth and thickness of the different strata penetrated which he shall verify or have verified by some one knowing the facts, under oath when the well is completed, which may be in the judgement, unsuitable casing or other appliances for controlling the water after the same has been condemed, in any depth of the County Surveyor of each county to inspect each artesian well in his county at least once in each six month, and to keep a record of such inspection.
