**QUITTAQUE RELATIVES ATTEND RITES FOR CRASH VICTIMS**

Mrs. Doyle Honea of Tulla, injured in a highway accident near Truth or Consequences, N. M., Tuesday morning, Dec. 26, died in St. Anne's Hospital 5:10 o'clock Thursday afternoon, Dec. 28.

Mrs. Honea, 24 years old, was the third fatality as the result of a collision between an automobile and a beer truck on Highway 85 about 2 miles north of Truth or Consequences.

Mrs. Honea's sister, Mrs. Jack Fowler, 28, also of Tulla, died a few minutes after the accident occurred. Mrs. Honea's daughter, Cynthia Ann, 3, died in the hospital at Truth or Consequences, early Thursday morning.

Hospital attendants said Mrs. Honea's husband remained in critical condition. They said three of the Honea children, Henry, Sonia and Juaretta, appear to be making satisfactory recoveries, as are Larry Don Fowler and Jackie Fowler.

All of the dead and injured were en route to Tulla when the Honea car was involved in collision with a truck driven by Eugene Cross of Albuquerque, who was fined \$100 on charges of reckless driving after a hearing Wednesday.

Mrs. Honea and Mrs. Fowler were the daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Doc Reeves of Truth or Consequences. The families were returning from a Christmas visit with Mr. and Mrs. Reeves when the crash came.

Funeral services for Mrs. Fowler, Mrs. Honea and Cynthia Ann were held at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon in the First Presbyterian Church at Tulla. Earl Cantwell, minister of the Church of Christ, officiated. Burial was in the cemetery at Tulla.

**WALTER ROGERS TAKES OATH OF OFFICE**  
Washington—Rep. Walter Rogers of Pampa Wednesday at 1:05 p. m. stood in the House of Representatives and swore to "uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States" as the 82nd Congress went into session.

The new congressman from the 18th District takes over the office he won after four hard-fought election campaigns lasting from April to November, when he defeated Ben Guill, his neighbor in Pampa.

"I am filled with pride and humility at being inducted into the National Congress to represent the fine people of the Panhandle of Texas," Rogers said following the ceremony.

Four little Roger's—John, Walter, Suzan and Tommy—sat on the back seat of the House floor to see "daddy come to Congress."

Members of Congress are permitted to bring their children to the House floor if they are under 14 years of age.

Pages at the House can remember members bringing two, but as far as it is known, this is the first time that a man has brought four children.

Rep. Roger takes great sport in telling his colleagues who drop by to shake hands with the wide-eyed children: "You should see the two I left behind."

Robert, age 5, and Mary Catherine, age 2, are in Pampa until the Rogers solve the Washington housing shortage.

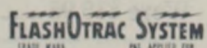
