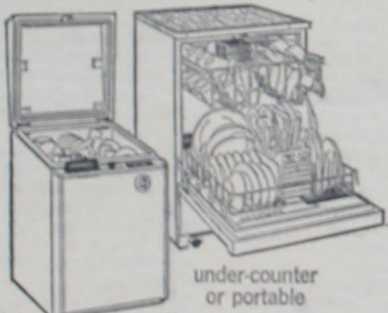

TEMPERATURE IMPORTANT IN MESQUITE CONTROL

Some of the latest research findings in connection with the control of mesquite with herbicides has shown that soil temperature at a 12" depth at the time of application is extremely important if root

kill is desired.

Mesquite root kill on the test areas never exceeded 12% where the soil temperature was 74° F. or below. When the temperatures exceeded 75° F. the root kills ranged from 38-68%. According to Henry D. Gregory of the Memphis Soil Conservation Service office, soil temperatures at 12" depth in the central part of Hall County were 70° F. on April 26. This was before the last cool weather and means that it will likely be at least mid-May before the desired soil temperatures are reached.
