The comprehensive plan of the counseling group will include a three point program which will take the beginning student just out of high school and guide him through Frank Phillips.

The first step in the program is the initial interview between counselor and student. At this meeting the student discusses his future with the counselor. High school records and entrance tests are studied. An effort is made to make decisions regarding the charting of the future for the student.

Many students know what they want to take and the profession they want to follow. Some know they want pre-law, pre-medicine, and others know they want one or two years in business. Others have not made up their minds and need special help in choosing courses which will not be lost later.

**Greetings From Mission In Malawi**

(The Quitaque Baptist WMU ladies received a letter of thanks from the Roy Davidsons in Malawi, Africa, which follows.)

Dear WMU Friends,  
How very grateful we are for your immediate response to our request for used sheets to help out in our Baptist Women's Union of Africa Continental Meeting to be held here in Blantyre in August.

After a decision is made as to which general or special area a student will enter, a degree plan is constructed. This plan takes into consideration which college a student will enter when he leaves Frank Phillips College. It includes all the courses he will need at FPC to complete his program leading either to transfer to senior college or to employment.

A second step is continuing to work with the student as he begins to take his course of study. If a student has problems he can go to the counselor and discuss them. The counselor and student may want to involve a teacher in the discussion. The dean may be called in. This continuous counseling for those who need it is an integral part of the program at Frank Phillips College.

The counselors also constantly check with the teachers to discover students who need more guidance.

The third step is that of "follow up." When a student leaves Frank Phillips, either to a job or to another college, the counselors make a periodic check to find out how he is doing.

The Frank Phillips College counselors are also involved in counseling relations with high schools of the Panhandle. They spend much time with high school counselors making them aware of the services available to them at FPC.

Lucky indeed is the student who steps into the network of professional, interested counselors at Frank Phillips College. Individual counseling for fall enrollment can be had by applying to the Dean of Admissions. Counseling starts August 1 and a definite time is scheduled for students planning to register on August 31 or September 1.

boxes and more are on the way. Over a year ago women in America, England and Scotland began to quilt covers to be sent to Africa to help in mission work. Twelve bales came to the Malawi Mission with over 200 quilts. After the BWUA meeting these will be distributed among the needs in each area.

If God has so generously provided for the physical needs of this meeting, how much more will He give His Spirit if we but seek Him with our whole hearts. Please pray that this time in August will truly be a meeting with God.

These past months I have been so impressed with the truth that God delights in hearing our requests.

You have truly been in partnership with God as you collected sheets and packaged them - even providing the postage. Thank you so very much. We ask that you continue to lift the Continental Conference in prayer. We believe great blessings are in store for us.

We are all well. God has blessed us with good health. We appreciate your letters more than you realize. It means much to us that you are faithful to pray and faithful to write even though our letters are few and far between.
