

### GROWN RAPIDLY IN FIELDS

Greenbugs have grown rapidly over many fields in Briscoe Coun

Greenougs have grown raphdy over many fields in Briscoe County during the last several days. Counts up to 5,000 greenbugs per foot of row have been seen in a few scattered spots, according to County Agent Ken Cook.

Some fields are almost clean and have few greenbugs while others are quite heavily infested. Some spraying has been going on during the last two weeks and populations have been cut down as a result of the spraying. The need for chemical application is dependent on the number of greenbugs, your plant size, stage of growth, and moisture conditions. These factors should determine the feasibility of spraying.
