Hall County Spelling Bee Set March 24

Spelling Bee Champions from Lakeview, Estelline, Valley and Memphis schools will compete for Hall County Championship at 10:30 a.m. March 24, 1977 in the Memphis Junior High School Auditorium. Winners from each of the above schools will compete in the County Spelling Bee. The Junior Spelling Bee will be held first and the Senior Spelling Bee immediately following. Each school will send two Juniors and two Senior Spelling Bee Contestants to the County Bee.

The Senior Spelling Bee Champion of County and Junior Spelling Bee Champion of County will be awarded a Gold Fountain Pen or Pencil by the Hall County Society of Crippled Children and Adults. This is the annual educational project of the Society. Also all contestants will be awarded a Certificate of Participation by the Amarillo Globe News.

Mrs. Gordon (Marjorie) Bain of Turkey, a former school teacher in the Turkey and Valley schools will be the pronouncer of the words for both the Junior and Senior Spelling Matches. MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION IS UNDERWAY IN TEXAS

Despite the easily handled motor vehicle registration stickers, which were initiated in 1976, and computer-prepared registration applications—which eliminate most of the delay formerly involved in typing registrations — motorists simply aren't remembering last

year's frustrating last minute lines at county tax assessor-collectors' offices.

"Tax collectors are waiting for the 'big crunch,'" said R. W. Townsley, director of the Motor Vehicle Division of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation. "Motorists will have no one but themselves to blame if they wait until the deadline April 1 to get their registrations. Every county in the state is running way behind schedule."

Many motorists could have registered by mail, but mail registrations ended February 28.

Meantime, those motorists who don't want to take time off from work to wait in line had better take a few minutes to register their vehicles today.

It would be rough to be one of some 10 million motorists trying to register their vehicles in the last few days of the month.
