Flames Destroy Old KC Supply Store

Ashes and rubble are all that's left of KC Supply, burned in the night by a fire of unknown origin.

Built in 1925 by Ed House, KC was a general store, selling groceries, Good Gulf gasoline and tire service to the traffic on the Estelline-Turkey Highway.

The building was about 30x70 feet, with a two bay driveway for cars, constructed of stucco. A Coca-Cola sign covered most of the East side of the building and was remarkably preserved by its location and the overhang of the roof.

"C". Cushioning distributes and absorbs shocks and vibrations, suitable types include shredded paper, polystyrene, bubble plastic or popcorn.

Purpose: Install approximately 9,500 linear feet of water line and 20 fire hydrants to upgrade the city's water system and fire protection facilities.
