Both of the squads look promising for the upcoming season with the girls having an edge because of the fact that they have more starting players returning.

The boys lost four of last year's starters, only Ron Eudy returning for another year of action. Two or three more of the Patriots saw limited action on last year's team that pushed the season into a play-off with Quail to settle the championship. Kenny Chandler and Jesse Ferguson are the only other lettermen returning. The Patriots will have good size.

The Valley girls return one season-long starter at forward and one who was starting at the end of the season and several guards who started at times during the season.

Sherice Price was a starter at forward all season and Joanie Turner took over a starting spot when her sister Janna was injured in the latter part of the season and was lost for the season. Jena Mullin, senior forward, has seen considerable playing time and Debra Parsley plays both forward and guard. On the guard end Martha Reed, Debra Parsley, Marlene Cawley, Jill Eudy and Dorcas Gaddis are all experienced players.

So the Valley girls are more experienced than the boys but they also have the tougher race for a district title this year with the new district alignment in basketball this year which puts Valley in the same district with Nazareth, who are defending Regional champs and lost only to the state winner at the finals. However Nazareth lost Elaine Schulte via graduation and that will sort of even things, although the Swiftettes do return some very fine players. The Valley girls have won the district title every year it has been a consolidated school and they are proud of that distinction and will be out to continue that tradition.

When the Varsity Patriots played Motley earlier in the season one of the Matadors intercepted a pass in the end zone and ran it all the way for a Motley TD, a run of some 102 yards. This just might have stung the pride of the junior edition of the Patriots, for on the opening kickoff of Thursday's game James McNary took the kickoff about a yard deep in the end zone and set sail for paydirt some 101 yards away and he did not stop until he hit the promised land. And he scored twice more before the game ended and Michael Dowd scored twice.

The Junior High's first game of the season was against Spur, and Valley won that one 28-8; Silverton was next and Valley won that one 36-0; Lubbock Christian Junior High was next and Valley won 42-0; Valley defeated Happy 42-22; Valley won over Motley in their first meeting 24-0 and the season was concluded last week with the second win over Motley, 30-0. The Valley Patriots drove to Lazbuddie and wound up the season with a 22-0 win over the Lazbuddie Longhorns. The win gave the Patriots sole possession of third place in both season and district standings. The Patriots enjoyed a winning season for the third straight year, winning six and losing four. Valley lost two non-district and two district games.

Barry Wheeler, one of the five seniors on this year's squad and one of the team's co-captains, sparked the win Friday night scoring two touchdowns and catching a one point-after-touchdown pass for a 14 point total. Kirk Proctor caught a pass for the other TD and senior co-captain Ron Eudy passed for one TD and kicked two extra points.

Coach Rick Dill, first-year head man at Valley, and his assistants have done a good job with the Patriots this year. The two losses in District play were to teams rated in the top ten in the state.

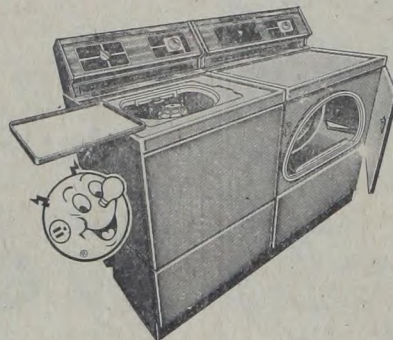
