CHICAGO, June 14 .- A declaration by Amos Pinchot, a member of the committee of 48, "that there positively would be a new party presidential candidate in the field" rumors, and that Senator La Pollette would head the ticket, and an announcement that the Harding campaign would be started promptly, are the outstanding developments following the republican national convention here. Pinchot's statement declared:

"The republican party has driven out representation in its counells millions of voters who followed Roosevelt, Johnson and La

Further, Pinchot's statement said that the new party will represent these voters, and it "promises a definite and constructive

The La Follette reports are, in some instances, linked with the committee of 48.

Sixty-Nine Bills of Indictment Made By Eastland Grand Jury

The Eastland county grand jury, which has been in session the past 12 days-June 1 to 12-made its final report to the judge of the district court -88th district-at Eastland last Saturday.

275 Witnesses Examined.

The jury examined 275 witnesses and returned 69 bills of indictment, called attention to the system under which peace officers are working and their method of conducting the affairs of the county, and made numerous recommendations for the improvement of the county's business affairs.

Gambling on Baseball Games.

Baseball games and the supposed gambling on said games re ceived the attention of the jury which, in its report, recommends that "officers see to it that gambling on baseball be stopped."

Sunday Closing Matter.

Taking up the matter of Sunday closing, or the enforcement of the "blue sky" laws of Texas, the jury's report shows almost flagrant disregard in Eastland county of said statutes, and calls the county judge's attention to the matter of lack of enforcement of said laws in a way that this matter bids fair to receive closer application

Picture shows, cold drink stands, gasoline stations, and other places of the kind were recited in the report as being violators of

The recommendations of the jury on the matter requests that the "officers whose duty it is to assess the fines for such violations assess the highest fines against such persons as the law will permit."

Prohibition Law Violation.

Asserting that the sheriff of Eastland county is in possession of large quantities of liquor that has been possessed at different in- full of secret service men. tervals of the county's campaign against violation of the prohibition laws, and stating that such liquor as has been taken into custody is now stored in the confines of the county jail at Eastland, the jury recommends that said liquor be destroyed by the sheriff immediately, and says: "Should it be necessary to accomplish such destruction, that the district judge make an order to this effect, authorizing and instructing every particle of said liquor to be destroyed."

The apparently current practice of peace officers known as "paying off," or "fining parties who are violating our laws and saying to them: 'You can pay off and go on'," was another matter which received consideration of the jury; and in their recommendations in this matter the jury suggests a plan of procedure in handling self-sacrificing devotion to public ends, such cases that should show improvement both in the dispatch of same and the more closely harboring of the county's funds derived from such violators.



PINK BOLL WORM IS HARMLESS

CLAIM DAMAGE NOT EXCEED 10 POUNDS COTTON SINCE 1915: YEAR OF ITS DISCOVERY

AUSTIN, Tex., June 14 .- Farmers of Southwest Texas are still unconvinced that there is such a thing as a "pink boll worm menace," according to a statement they issued which placed their interpretation upon the testimony given R HE by experts in the recent legislative hearings on the subject.

The statement pointed out that the several wild plants, and that if deprived of its favorite food-cotton-it would continue to exist upon wild

The statement also advanced that if there is such a danger from the spread of the moths of the worm, as alleged by expert testimony in the five years ce it has been alleged to have been ntroduced in Southwest Texas, it would have had time to spread oil over the

"Agricultural department experts tessaid the statement, "that the pink boll worm had not damaged more than 10 pounds of cotton in Texas, although it has been here since 1915."
