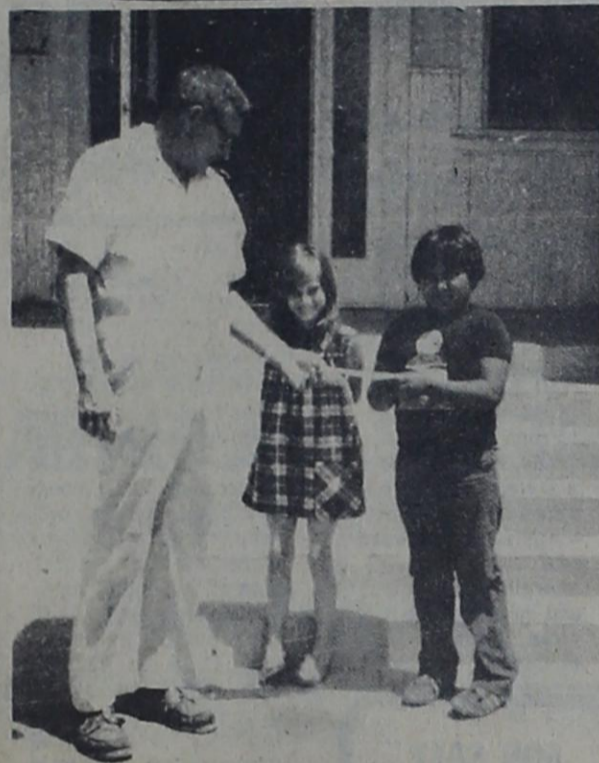

Missionaries To Speak At First Evangelical Methodist Church Wed.

Mr. and Mrs. Ernie Smith, missionaries with World Gospel Mission to Burundi, Africa, will speak at First Evangelical Methodist Church, located across from the hospital, Wednesday, April 23, at 7:00 p.m.

Ernie Smith was born in New Mexico. He was enlisted for eight years in the Air Force, working as a jet mechanic, and traveled throughout much of the world during that time. Upon receiving an honorable discharge from the U.S.A.F., he and his family moved to University Park, Iowa, where Ernie enrolled at Vennard College. He graduated from there with a major in Bible.

Ernie's Christian service activities before going to Burundi included student pastor, sponsor of Ven-

nard's drama team, evangelist for teen camps and retreats, and youth counselor.

Anna, a native of Arizona, also attended Vennard College. Her Christian service experience has involved being a vocal soloist, puppeteer, and editor of Vennard's campus newspaper. She has also had professional experience as a paramedical secretary.

The Smiths went to Burundi as missionaries in 1976. During this first term, they completed language study, learning Kirundi, as well as being involved in evangelism and a church planting ministry. Ernie has found many avenues for using his gifts as preacher and mechanic while serving as head of the mission station at Murehe. He also participated in investigative trips into neighboring Tanzania, where WGM anticipates opening a new field among the Barundi. The Smiths plan to return to Africa after their furlough.

World Gospel Mission is an interdenominational missionary organization with 335 missionaries and homeland staff, working in eighteen areas around the world. International headquarters is in Marion, Indiana.

The Cisco High School gym will be open every Friday evening beginning April 26 from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. to allow couples and singles to play volleyball.

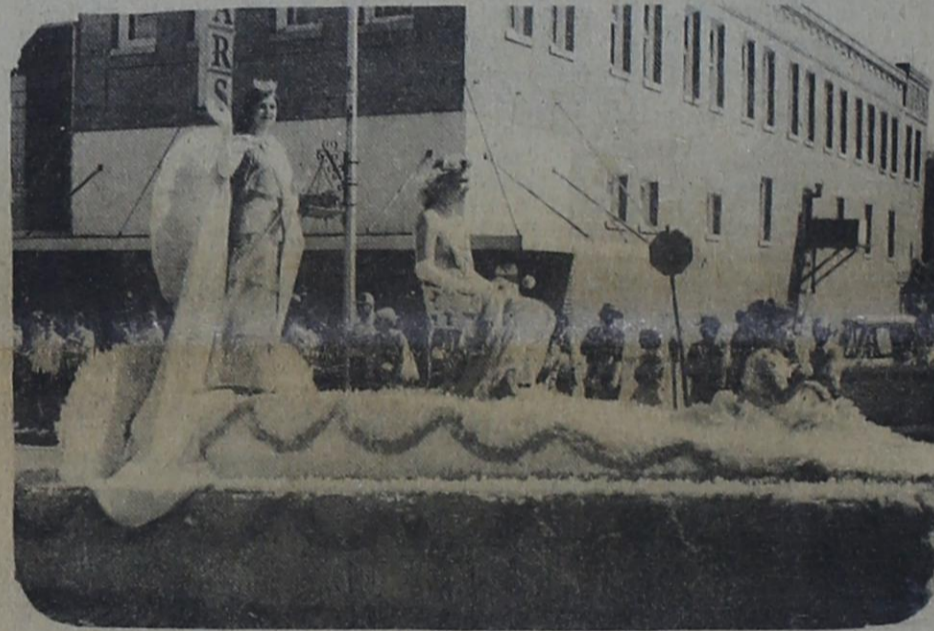
CHS Donkey Basketball Game Set For April 24

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AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION MEDIA DAY

The District 8 (Central Texas) Agricultural Extension Station, located near Stephenville, made an attractive setting for Extension Media Day on April 18th. About fifty agricultural specialists and journalists from an 18 County area met for the program. Those attending from Eastland County were Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent (Home Economics), Maybelle Trout, Eastland Correspondent for the Abilene Reporter-News, and Viola Payne, writer for the Eastland County newspapers. Among the District and State leaders in agricultural research and work present at the meeting were: Wayne Keese, an agricultural engineer working with energy development at Texas A&M University, Mrs. Lynn

White, State Coordinator of County Extension Agents (Home Economics), Dr. Stephen Hammack, Area Beef Cattle Specialist, Mrs. Kathleen Volanty, District Extension Agent, James S. Denton, Jr., Area Economist - Management, and Dr. Bill Jackson, 4-H and Youth Specialist. John Burleson, District Extension Agent, greeted the assembled guests, stating that the Press and Radio were the most important source of information for all people of this area. The program which followed was packed with vital topics and discussions relating to Texas Agriculture and the various ways it interacts with the lives of State residents. The presentation of all material was varied, using film, talks by specialists, and a videotape of a discussion by Dr.

Ernie Davis, Economist-Livestock Marketing Specialist of the State Extension Service. The film disclosed the main theme of the meeting - the launching of an in-depth program geared to the 1980's. Known as "Thrust for the '80's," this Agricultural Extension program encompasses educational activities centering around such concerns as energy, economic conditions, land and water resources, social conditions, marketing and policy, and leadership development. Dr. Daniel C. Pfannstiel, State Extension Director, was instrumental in developing this program. "As a result of rapidly changing national, international, state and local policy and economic conditions, many concerns were being expressed by the citizens of Texas," Dr. Pfannstiel stated. "We felt we wanted to explore all these concerns. So we asked our County Extension Agents to confer with their Program Building Committees at the local level

and explore these 'people concerns'." A special task force was also assigned at the state level to take the concerns expressed by local citizens and identify problems which needed to be solved. A five-year plan was set up from this information - a plan which will seek to solve the different types of problems of the '80's. The main speakers for Media Day concerned themselves with three of the most pressing topics: Wayne Keese discussing Ethanol, an alternate fuel, Mrs. Lynn White on family economic survival during inflationary times, and Dr. Davis with a general view of political realities relating to Agriculture. All speakers stressed that County Extension work is now geared to city as well as county living. Wayne Keese disclosed that Texas A and M University is setting up a plant to manufacture ethanol from fermented agricultural products. He described this product as "a fuel, not a mix". Keese pointed out, however, that both anhydrous and lower proof ethanol can be burned directly in a spark ignition engine without relying on gasoline. Gasohol, a mixture of 10 percent ethanol and 90 percent unleaded gasoline, requires 200 proof anhydrous ethyl alcohol, which is water free. Experimentation until this time - unfortunately - indicates that it costs about \$2.00 per gallon to produce an alternate fuel from any of the products such as corn, sorghum, wheat, sugar cane or beets. But work on this project will continue at full speed. During the noon hour guests at Media Day were treated to an omelet lunch, and the main dish was cooked in front of them while they waited. It was an "assembly line" arrangement, where five Extension Agents-In-Training manned stoves and passed omelets

Fertilizer On Coastal Bermuda Grass

When should fertilizer be applied to coastal bermudagrass? This is a question Eastland County producers are asking, according to County Extension Agent, DeMarquis Gordon. Coastal bermudagrass is the most important perennial forage crop in Eastland County. This grass requires high rates of fertilizer to produce high yields of quality forage. In a demonstration conducted by R.D. Hart in Eastland County in 1979, the best results were obtained where all the nitrogen was applied in the spring. This method is contrary to the soil test recommendations, which suggests that the nitrogen be applied in split applications, after each grazing or cutting of hay. The demonstration indicated that the one application of nitrogen returned \$51 more per acre than the same amount applied in three split applications, according to Gordon. Dr. George Alston, Extension Area Agronomist, says similar results have been obtained in other demonstrations in the West Cross Timbers. He explains a reason for these results. When all the nitrogen is applied in the spring the rains dissolve the nitrogen and carry it to the root zone, reasons Alston. Nitrogen applied in the late spring and summer remain on the dry surface and is not carried to the root zone. There may be enough moisture in the root zone for good grass growth,

but nitrogen on the surface is of little value to the grass. Hart divided the demonstration into one acre plots. In one plot he applied 300 pounds of nitrogen (900 pounds of 33-0-0) on April 20. On another plot he applied 100 pounds of nitrogen in three applications - April 20, May 20 and June 27. A third plot received only 60 pounds of nitrogen in one application and another plot had no fertilizer applied during the year. The plot where 300 pounds of nitrogen was applied in one application produced 8116 pounds of hay, that averaged 14.3 percent crude protein compared to 7480 pounds of hay averaging 12.7 percent crude protein where the same amount of nitrogen was applied in three split applications. The plot that received no fertilizer produced only 3150 pounds of forage and contained only 7.1 percent protein. The plot that was fertilized with 60 pounds of nitrogen produced 5394 pounds of 11.2 percent protein hay. The return from the acre plot receiving 300 pounds of nitrogen in one application was \$130.68 above returns from the no-fertilizer acre. Returns from the acre receiving the same amount of nitrogen in split applications was \$78.96 above the no-fertilizer acre. The acre fertilized with 60 pounds of nitrogen in one application returned \$61.60 more than the no-fertilizer acre. These values are based on the hay being worth 26 cents per pound of protein. Gordon says these results are from one year when it rained in the spring, but the summer was very dry. Similar results may not be obtained in a year when sufficient rain falls in the summer. However, he says the dry summer months are more normal for this part of Texas.

I am a cosponsor of H.R. 6725, the Animal Damage Control Act, which would make that intent on the part of Congress unquestionable.

Hearings on the bill, held April 16 in Washington, drew a wide range of testimony from producer groups and from what one of my colleagues called "the marshalled generals" of the regulator agencies involved: The U.S. Department of Agriculture, Department of Interior and its Fish and Wildlife Division, and the Environmental Protection Agency.

It was interesting to note that support for continued research into chemical controls, most notably Compound 1080 for coyote control, was expressed by all of the agency representatives — except the Department of Interior. Even the head of the Fish and Wildlife Division of Interior has recommended continuing research, only to be overruled by Secretary Cecil Andrus. Andrus' decision can only be described as a triumph of "politics" over scientific data, since the reasons he has given for halting 1080 research relate primarily to its unpopularity among environmentalists.

In my testimony before that hearing, I pointed out that one of the biggest losses to our state is an economic loss that can never be accurately

calculated: The loss of a potential fiber industry to other areas not currently involved in sheep and goat production because of high predator populations.

I VOTED AGAINST

passage of the Central Idaho Wilderness Act April 16, feeling that a state that is made up of 64 percent Federally-controlled land doesn't need the additional burden of 2.2 million acres of that land put into heavily-restricted Wilderness Designation.

Classifying an area as a wilderness area makes that land virtually inaccessible to the majority of citizens. I had supported an unsuccessful amendment which would have cut the wilderness acreage from 2.2 million to 1.4 million acres and would allow multiple use management, such as road-building, timber and mining activities on some of the land.

The bill, as passed, will hurt the economy of the entire nation by limiting domestic supplies of timber, minerals and oil, adding to the inflation rate.

While I concur with the principal idea of leaving areas of our country in their wild and natural state for the enjoyment of future generations, some common sense has to be used in making these designations. Multiple use management does not mean the indiscriminate destruction of the land that many would have us to believe. I would point out, in both of these issues, most landowners and landusers were the very first "environmentalists," a fact that is often forgotten by today's young liberals.

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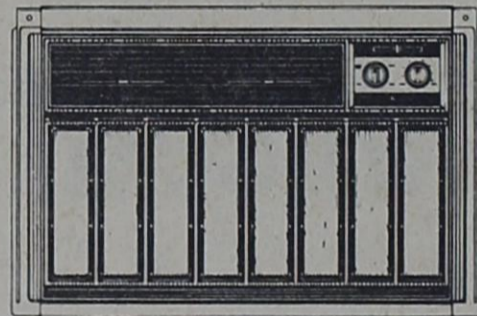
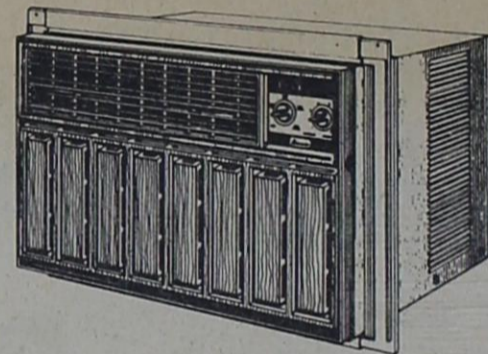
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People Things

WHO IS Jackie Bibby? Several folks who read and appreciate his articles under the heading of "Behind the Walls" in this newspaper from time to time have wondered and asked. And we asked District Attorney Emory Walton.

Jackie is a native of Rising Star. Five years or so ago he was arrested and convicted on a marijuana possession charge. The court gave him a probated sentence. He lived up to every letter of the law during the time of the sentence and was given a clean bill. Soon thereafter he was arrested on a similar charge in Brown County and sentenced to serve eight years.

Mr. Walton reports that Jackie is a model prisoner at Huntsville and he tells folks that he plans to work among young people to help discourage drug usage when he gets out of prison. His articles in the newspapers indicate that he is working in that direction already.

MR. EDWARD Wende who sells you stamps and handles your letters and packages at the U.S. Post Office wonders if it wouldn't be a good idea for Cisco to make capital out of the three miles or more of the old Bank-head Highway that winds through our town.

From the east, the brick pavement (Bankhead Highway) leaves U.S. Highway 80 route near the clay products plant at the southeast corner of our township. And it wanders down Avenue A to East 14th Street and on to Avenue D (Conrad Hilton Avenue) to 3rd Street and west on 3rd to Avenue L north past the cemetery and then west out of town.

Who's Who in America has this to say about the Bankhead Highway:

"1920-21 the Bankhead Highway, which was to run from Washington, D.C., to Los Angeles, Calif., was named for John Hollis Bankhead of Jasper, Ala. Bankhead served in the U.S. Senate from 1907-25. He was conspicuous as a leader in the work of the commission of public buildings and on rivers and harbors. He was a member of the inland waterways commission and author of the law for federal aid to post roads. He was, incidentally, the grandfather of Actress Tallulah Bankhead.

The Bankhead Highway was built in the 1920s and

superseded in the late 1920s or very early 1930s by Highway 80. There was a planning meeting for civic leaders along the route in Memphis, Tenn.

Eastland County was among the first in Texas to get its brick pavement, and there was some scandal in Austin in the Jim Ferguson days about the cost of this county's part of the road. Highway 80 through the county covers a good portion of the brick road. Some brick areas were cleaned off when the highway was rerouted.

Mr. Wende has a good thought and we feel that the new historical body that is working under the supervision of Dr. Rinaldo Petrini will see that the Cisco portion of the old highway is properly marked. Dr. Petrini has said a number of times that "Cisco should never allow even one of the bricks to be removed from its streets."
