City Makes Plans For Lake, Park, City Dump

Jesse Simmons has been employed as Lake Warden and Inspector for Lake Cisco, according to an announcement last week by City Administrator John Bohannon.

Mr. Simmons, who has been Lake Patrolman for several years, will continue to carry out his previous duties in addition to inspecting sewage facilities and other requirements stipulated in lease contracts granted by the city around the lake. All specifications contained in the leases will be enforced, Mr. Bohannon added.

The new position will in no way affect the work of the Lake Park Board, Mr. Bohannon said, but Mr. Simmons will cooperate with it in supervising and maintaining improvements at the lake and park. Mr. Simmons will also help patrol the park area in cooperation with the city police.

MAYOR PROCLAIMS FEBRUARY AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

The Charles Crawford Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, is joining with the National Society in promoting the observance of American History Month during February, according to Mrs. Joe Clements, Regent.

Fifty DAR State organizations, plus the District of Columbia and the Canal Zone, through nearly 3,000 chapters, have arranged for various means of observance of historic events occurring since

the early days of our country, Mrs. Clements announced.

In recognition of the local promotion by the Charles Crawford Chapter, Mayor John Webb has issued the following proclamation:

"WHEREAS, each new problem which confronts our nation brings out the importance of understanding its history and traditions, its institutions and policies, and with that understanding a new appreciation of the important phases of our country's growth; and

"WHEREAS, in these years of constant stress and numerous problems, both domestic and foreign, a study of American history reveals the strength of our people and points to ways of meeting current and future crises; and

"WHEREAS, this fact has been recognized by many Americans, including the Daughters of the American Revolution, which organization undertakes many efforts each year to stimulate interest in our nation's history, and it seems fitting that focus be given those efforts:

"NOW THEREFORE, I, as Mayor of Cisco, do hereby designate the month of February as American History Month in Cisco, and urge all citizens to cooperate in its observance, beginning on the first day of February, which was the occasion of an historic event in 1790 when the Supreme Court of the United States met for the first time with Chief Justice John Jay presiding.

"In official recognition whereof, I hereby affix my signature this 30th day of January, 1965."

Commissioners Okay Renovation Of Appeals Court Up To \$40,000

Commissioners Vote Selves \$75 Expense Account; Ruling Pends

THE LAW SAYS:

Art. 2350c. Allowance for travelling expenses and automobile depreciation.

Section 1. In any county in this State having a population of not more than twenty-one thousand, five hundred (21,500), according to the last preceding or any future Federal Census, the Commissioners Court is hereby authorized to allow each member of such Commissioners Court the sum of not exceeding Seventy-five Dollars (\$75) per month for traveling expenses and depreciation on his automobile while on official business within the county. Each member of such Commissioners Court shall pay all expenses in the operation of such automobile and keep same in repair free of any other charge to the county.

Sec. 2. (Pertains to counties with populations over 21,500).

Sec. 3. (Pertains to counties with populations over 124,000).

Sec. 4. (Pertains to counties with populations over 600,000).

Sec. 5. The term "members of the Commissioners Court" when used herein means the County Commissioners and the County Judge.

Sec. 6. The provisions of this bill shall apply only to those counties not furnishing an automobile, truck, or by other means providing for the traveling expenses of its commissioners, while on official business within the county.

(ED. NOTE: Population of Eastland County was reported to be 19,526 at the 1960 census).

History of Cemeteries Set By County Group

The first meeting of 1965 for the Eastland County Historical Survey Committee under the new chairman, Mike Collins, was held Thursday.

A \$500 fund for the work of the survey committee was appropriated when the county commissioners court adopted the annual budget for 1965. Collins announced his committee members as Berry Greenwood of Carbon, Mrs. Joe White of Rising Star, Joe Dennis of Ranger, Eugene Baker of Gorman and Mrs. Arthur Murrell of Eastland.

Committee members from Cisco, Desdemona and Oiden are yet to be named.

The first project is the making and recording history of the county's cemeteries, some of which are all but lost because of the changes in access roads, overgrowth of land and deterioration of fences.

Unusual incidents in connection with establishment of the cemeteries, donors of the land, and names of longtime Eastland County families, will be included in the historical records, Collins said. These records will be properly bound

and distributed to county libraries.

The marking of Confederate graves will be a coordinated project.

The next meeting will be in Gorman the latter part of February.

Members of the committee attending this meeting were Mrs. White, Mrs. Murrell, Greenwood, Collins, and Judge Scott Bailey.

Contract Let For Marking Confederate Fort In County

The state contract for marking the Confederate Memorial Information Markers for the C. S. A. Fort Blair in Eastland County has been let by the State Building Commission.

This announcement was made by the State Historical Survey Committee and the State Building Commission, which are jointly responsible for their erection.

The marker which will be erected in Desdemona, is made of cast aluminum with Swedish steel effect for durability and appearance. There are four sizes of these markers erected by the State Building Commission with research and inscriptions prepared by the Texas State Historical Survey

Committee. The Official Texas Historical Medallion appears at the top with the inscription below.

Members of the State Building Commission are Governor John Connally; Attorney-General Waggoner Carr; and Charles S. Coates, Chairman of the State Board of Control.

The Confederate Memorial Information Marker for the C.S.A. Fort Blair is 27" x 42" in size and will be erected on Highway 16 at the south city limits of Desdemona, Texas.

The following information appears in the inscription: Fort Blair, the largest far western "family fort" used throughout the Civil War, was begun in 1857 by a settler

Authorization has been given and negotiations have begun for the renovation of the quarters on the fifth floor of the county courthouse.

A motion authorizing and undertaking construction of improvements to the quarters was adopted unanimously this week by the County Commissioners Court.

The motion, made by Commissioner C. B. Dill, "provides that the total of said improvements shall not exceed \$40,000."

Work is expected to include air conditioning and expanded library facilities.

Action followed lengthy discussion and an on-the-spot inspection of the court facilities, by the commissioners Monday.

The court further signed an agreement with C. N. Burt & Co. of Richardson to handle the financial arrangements for a three per cent commission.

In other action, the court: Approved the bond for Justice of the Peace B. A. Butler of Rising Star.

Appointed Dr. R. C. Ferguson of Eastland as County Health officer, with his term to commence Jan. 1, 1965, and end Dec. 31, 1966.

Authorized the court to advertise for bids for a new sheriff's car, providing that the 1962 Ford now used by the sheriff's department is traded.

Appointed veteran service officers whose terms shall be for two years ("providing the same compensation as is presently paid" — as follows: County Veterans Service Officer, James Wright of Eastland; Assistants A. H. Powell of Ranger; Les Wallace of Gorman; John Nunnally of Rising Star; and O. A. Nance of Cisco; and

Fixed salaries and allowances for the calendar year of 1965 providing further that members of Eastland County Commissioners Court shall receive such expense salaries as is provided for in Article 2350 of the Vernon's Civil Statutes.

Text of the agreement entered into with the Burt Co. is as follows:

"Honorable County Judge and Commissioners' Court of Eastland County, Texas

"Gentlemen:

"It is our understanding that you are considering the issuance of \$40,000 more or less, of Permanent Improvement Warrants payable from your county's 80 cents Constitutional Tax for the constructing improvements to your Courthouse, and in connection therewith, we wish to submit for your consideration the following proposal:

"We will study carefully with you the present financial condition of all of your county funds and the probable future income to these funds. After these matters have been studied, we will make recommendations with reference to the maturities of the proposed Warrants and later the proposed Refunding Bonds.

"We agree to assume all charges made by recognized commercial Bond Attorneys, agreeable to you, to prepare and furnish all the necessary legal proceedings to authorize and issue the proposed Warrants. The Warrants are to be dated on or about the date they are authorized and are to bear interest at a rate of 4 per cent and mature serially over a period not to exceed 10 years.

"Simultaneously with the authorization of the Warrants, we will provide funds at the American National Bank, Austin, Texas, or your local banks, to pay for the contract or contracts entered into for the construction of said permanent improvements. The payments of the contracts are

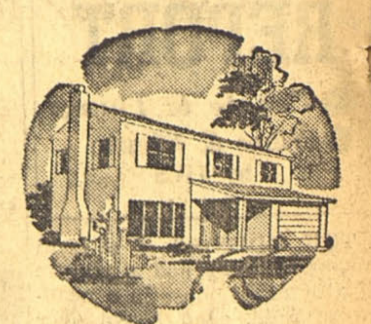

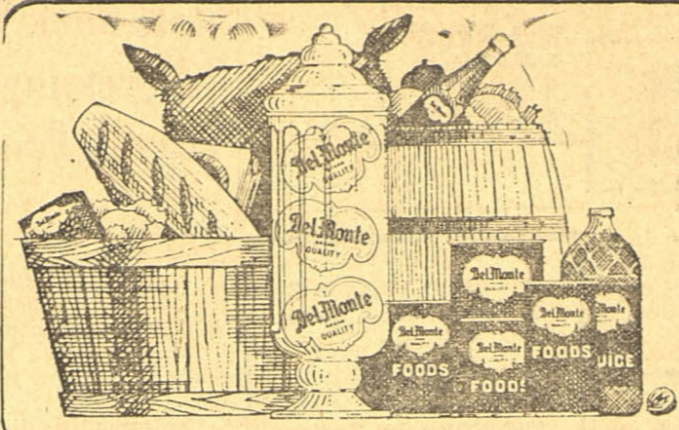

Data Available On GI Insurance

DALLAS — All veterans of World War II and the Korean Conflict who believe they are eligible to purchase the new GI insurance beginning May 1, 1965, can get full information at Veterans Administration regional offices throughout the country.

VA has urged those who can to visit or telephone the regional office nearest their home while those who live at too great a distance may write for a printed information sheet, outlining the provisions of the new law. In the Southwestern area, letters may be addressed to VA regional Office at Waco, Houston, Lubbock and San Antonio, Texas; Shreveport and New Orleans, Louisiana; and Jackson, Mississippi.

All eligible veterans will have ample time to acquaint themselves with the choices of insurance available since applications for the new insurance cannot be accepted before May 1, 1965. Veterans will then have until midnight, May 2, 1966, to purchase the insurance.

State Park Work Progressing; Big Year In Prospect

AUSTIN — Authorized state park improvements are well ahead of schedule, according to J. Weldon Watson, executive director of the Parks and Wildlife Department. He said indications point to 1965 as the greatest park year in history.

The executive director said during the year substantial new facilities were completed at Bastrop State Park, Goose Island State Park, Tyler State Park, Buesher State Park and Port Lavaca Causeway State Park.

But the major emphasis, said Watson, was in creating a new park at Dam "B" near Woodville, and the development marked creation of a "The LBJ State Park" near Johnson City, in honor of Texas' own, President Lyndon B. Johnson.

In addition, said Watson, the park field staff was busy serving an increase of more than a half million guests during the year. The 1964 attendance was 7,900,000, compared with 7,200,000 in 1963.

"We consider the attendance noteworthy," said Watson, "because the near record heat of the early summer curtailed visitations. Then there were prolonged drought spells in some areas that definitely curbed patronage."

Watson said the 1.2 million dollar development program has advanced so well that it is anticipated every contract will be numbered, as of December 29. The last deal was for a new concession building at Falcon State Park.

Falcon State Park has been open for partial use with screened shelters, a large boat ramp and the airplane landing strip completed since early fall.

Subject to weather conditions and other undetermined phases, Watson said the other two parks, also on large reservoirs already noted for their fishing, will be ready for the summer season.

to be made at their face value and upon approved estimates of your architect. It is agreed that you will request the contractor or contractors to deliver the said Warrants to us and execute receipts of payments, as furnished by the Bond Attorneys, for said Warrants.

"For the foregoing services and expenses in connection with the issuance of the Warrants we are to be paid a fee of 3 per cent of the Warrants actually issued, which fee is to be due and payable simultaneously and pro-rata as the Warrants are delivered to us by the contractors, unless otherwise negotiated.

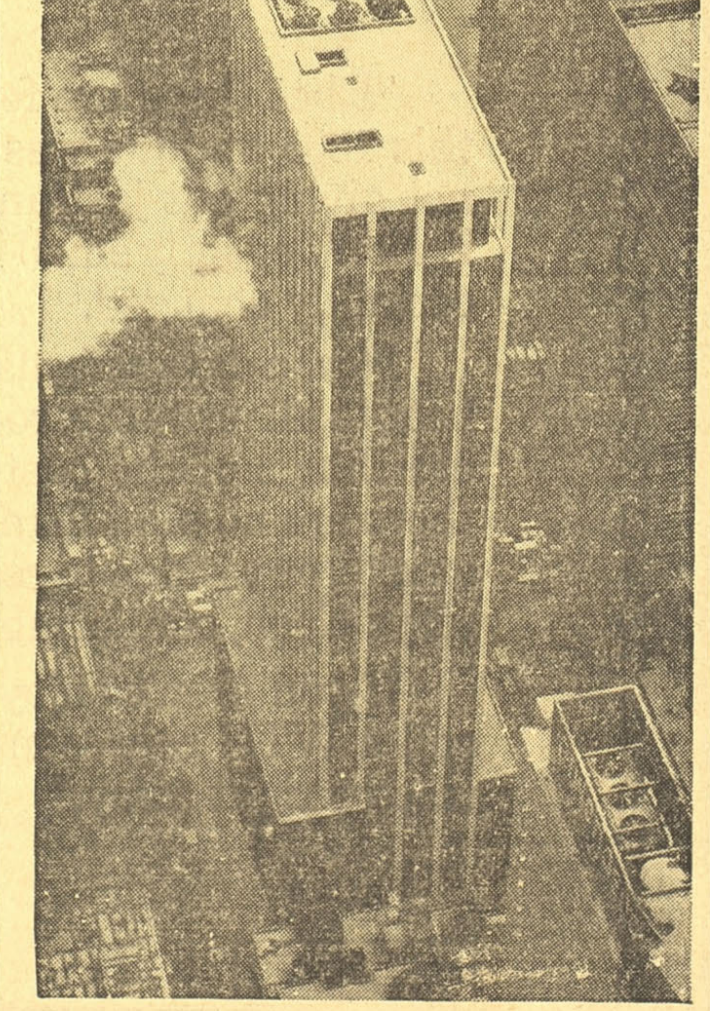

Candies, soap, soaps, food, and clothing were made in the fort by use of fat renderings, beeswax, wood ashes, wild herbs, bark, roots, berries, and animal skins. Families had to provide their children's education.

Other area forts included Allen's Ranch, also in Eastland County; Lynch and Green Ranches, Shackelford County; Buffalo Springs, Clay County; Bragg's and Murray's Forts, Young County; Picketville, Fort Davis, Owls Head and Mugginsville, Stephens County.

After the war, Desdemona was established as a stop on the Old Waco-Fort Griffin Road. It boomed to fame when oil was discovered in 1918. Its call for help to end lawlessness added new glory to the Texas Rangers.

The erection of Confederate Memorial Information Markers is part of the Civil War Centennial Commemoration in Texas. The markers are designed to interpret and commemorate the role of prominent Texas Confederates, battles, frontier outposts, coastal fortifications, manufacturing plants, and military supply centers.

This marking program is part of a comprehensive five-year plan of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee to record, appreciate, mark, preserve, and survey Texas history. "RAMPS," as the plan is called, seeks to place 5,000 historical markers over the state in this five-year period. These markers are to be sponsored through joint efforts of the state, counties, cities, civic groups, and individuals.

The Civil War in Texas is a part of the vast program to mark historical sites in Texas from archaeological finds to modern industries and statesmen. Since the beginning of the Centennial marking program, 500 Texas Confederate Memorial Information Markers have been submitted for erection.

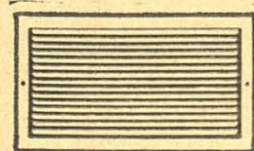

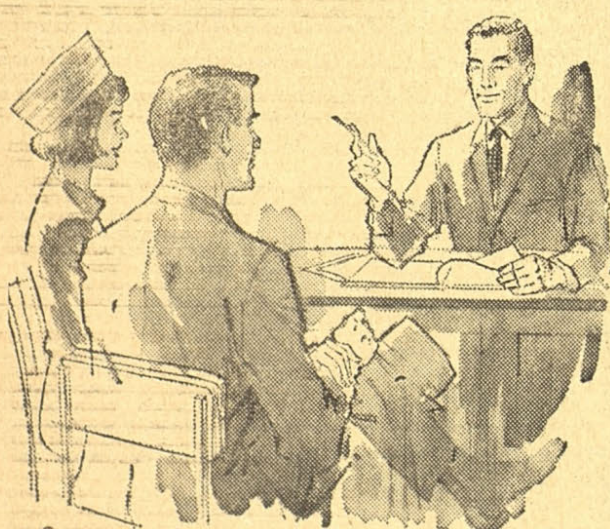
