litical achievements and through his own efforts Cox has amassed a forthe Democratic party in Ohio in 1912 or. As one who had brought radica changes in the State Constitution, h took the field in its behalf. His first term as Governor was devoted chief y to forwarding the enactment of laws to put the new State Constitu tion into effect.

But Ohio evidently was not prepar ed to assimilate all the new laws, for Cox was defeated for re-election. But party renominated him in 1916 and he was re-elected for a third term n 1918, being the only Democrat to win in Ohio. Mr. Cox's majority was over 105,000 votes




